The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Abraham Van Amburgh lived in Dutchess and Westchester Counties in New York. The family was living at Fishkill and on the Manor of Cortland in the first half of the 18th century. Abraham was a Loyalist who settled at Saint John, New Brunswick, Canada.

The Society of the Descendants of Johannes de la Montagne believe that this family is a separate one from the Van Emburgh family, and that their surname might have been derived from "Van Hamburg."

Andrew Van Emburgh was a Civil War veteran.

Benjamin Z. Van Emburgh formed, with his brother-in-law, Isaac D. Bogert, the firm of Van Emburgh & Bogert, dealing in groceries, dry goods, lumber and coal in a building erected at the southeast corner of present-day Broadway and Westwood Avenue in Westwood, the first store in town.

In the (1) Hackensack Ref Ch of their marriage, they were: Gysbert Van Inbergh, y.m., b. Ackinsack and Maritie Helhaecke, y.d., b. New York, both living here.

Gysbert Johannes Van Emburgh was a mariner, evidently sailing local traffic on the Hackensack and Passaic Rivers in northern New Jersey, possibly on the Raritan River in central New Jersey, and on the Hudson River and the Staten Island Sound in New York State.

His will was dated 3 May 1760, probatedn 26 July 1762. In it, Guisbert Van Emburgh, of New Barbadoes, Bergen County mentioned wife Ann (lived New Barbadoes Neck), sons Abraham, Guisbert, Simeon, Jacob(us)/James. Children in codicil: Elizabeth, John, Adoniah, all land in Hackensack sold and monies for 3 children.²

On 26 September 1786 (recorded 8 October 1805, Bergen Co. V:419) Abraham Kingsland of New Barbadoes Neck, conveyed to Nephew Gilbert Van Emburgh of Bergen County, Black smith, for love, good will, and affection, all my Real Estate and personal estate on New Barbadoes Neck, beginning at the River by the land of John Outwater, being half the land formerly belonging to my father, Isaac Kingsland, deceased, who by his Last Will and Testament bequeathed to me. Signed by Abraham Kingsland (his mark). Witnessed by William Dow, John Dow, Junior.²

On 15 February 1790 (recorded 8 October 1805, Bergen Co. V:413) Abraham Kingsland of New Barbadoes Neck, yeoman, conveyed to Gilbert Van Emburgh, Black smith, of same place, for £5, 8-41/100 acres meadow at New Barbadoes Neck, beginning at corner Thomas J. Van Riper's meadow; mentioned Buck's Creek; corner of Henry Outwater's meadows; Hackensack River. Bounded S by meadows of said Thomas Van Riper; W by Bucks Creek; N by said Henry Outwater's meadow; E by said Hackensack River. Signed by Abraham Kingsland (his mark). Witnessed by Abraham Speer, Abraham Van Emburgh.²

On 31 March 1791 (recorded 8 October 1805, Bergen Co. V:417) Abraham Kingsland, Executor of the Estate of Isaac Kingsland Junior, deceased, of New Barbadoes Neck, conveyed to Gilbert Van Emburgh of the same place, for £8, 2 acres meadowland in New Barbadoes Neck, beginning SE corner Halmegh Sipp's meadow. Signed by Abraham Kingsland. Witnessed by Wm. McLom?, Abraham Van Emburgh.²

In the Kingston marriage record, they were: Hendrick Arentsen, j.m. of Almelo, in Overijssel, and Aeltje Claes, of [New] Amsterdam, in Nieuwederlant, widow of Macciell Ferre, both resid. here (in Wiltwyck, now Kingston).

Hendrick Arentsen, of Alemelo, Province of Overijssel, Holland, came to America 24 March 1662 in the ship "De Trouw" (The Faith), commanded by Capt. Jan Jansz Bestevaer. The ships record states that he was a "Field-laborer," from Tielderweert, (country around Tiel) in Gelderland.¹

Aeltie Claes was married to Macriell Ferre, (Michael Verie) Apr. 17, 1660, being recorded in the NYC Ref Ch, and was undoubtedly the daughter of Claes Gerbrant-1, and a twin sister of Clara, bp. NYC Ref Ch, Jan. 1, 1642. Aeltie had a son Peter,

bp. Nov. 20, 1661, at New York, by her first husband.¹

Almelo, is a Province of Overijssel, Holland, and is 25 miles east by southeast of Zwolle, the capital of Overijssel.¹

This family later took the name Van Amburg, and removed to Fishkill and Tarrytown, N. Y.¹

On 8 December 1775, William Van Emburgh, yeoman, of Hackensack, conveyed to his two brothers, Simon Van Emburgh and James Van Emburgh, both of New Barbadoes Neck, land willed by his father Gilbert Van Emburgh. Signed by William Van Emburgh. Witnessed by William Dow and Aury King.¹

Simeon Van Emburgh was a weaver by profession and had Loyalist sympathies (he was indicted in June 1780 for supply-

ing flour and butter to British troops on Staten Island), although he did not move away from the area after the Revolution.

On 8 December 1775, William Van Emburgh, yeoman, of Hackensack, conveyed to his two brothers, Simon Van Emburgh and James Van Emburgh, both of New Barbadoes Neck, land willed by his father Gilbert Van Emburgh. Signed by William Van Emburgh. Witnessed by William Dow and Aury King.¹

On 6 November 1804 (recorded 8 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:358) Mary Van Emburgh [poss. Mary, nee Kerck, wife of Gilbert, below?] of the Township of New Barbadoes, conveyed to Hessel Juriaense of the Township of New Barbadoes, two tracts in the Township of New Barbadoes in Patten of Munache: (1) 4-62/100 acres, beginning S corner of Nicausie Terhune in the wolf swamp on the line of Larence Ackerman, deceased, bounded S and W by John Terhune; S and E by Lawrence Ackerman, deceased; NW by Lucas Van Voorhase, deceased; NE by Nicausie Terhune.
