The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

**Van Horn**

Spelling variants include Van Hooren, Van Hoorn, Van Horn.

According to Winfield, the name is derived from the city of Hoorn (in the Province of North Holland), a port city on the Zuyder Zee, about 20 miles north of Amsterdam.

Two early emigrants were Jan Cornelissen [van Hoorn], who was in New Amsterdam as early as June 1645, and Christiaan Barentsen van Hoorn.

Later research showed that Matthys Cornelissen [Van Horn] was from Denmark. In the 1692 record of his marriage banns, he was -- Betrothed 20 February (1692) Matys Cornelisen van Jutlandt, young man, with Fytie Adam Brouwer, widow of Evert Hendricks, both residing at Brooklyn. VAN HORN - In North Holland the once famous city of Hoorn is situated on the Zuyder Zee, about twenty miles north of

Amsterdam. From this place came Jan Cornelissen to New Amsterdam about 1645. He settled in Hackensack and here raised a family, some of his descendants continuing in the Hackensack section, and others going to Communipaw, where land is still owned by members of the family. Cornelissen's son Joris (George) married Maria Rutgers, and in his turn his oldest son married a granddaughter of Michael Jansen Vreeland.

The Van Hornes (Van Horns, as now generally spelled) of New Jersey and elsewhere in this country descend from three different Van Hoorns, all of whom came from Holland, but without their relationship to each other, if any, being known. They were not brothers. One was Christian Barentsen, who arrived before 1653, and resided in New Amsterdam, but d. in 1658 at Wilmington, Del. One was Joris Jansen, who arrived in 1658. He was a builder and architect in New York City. In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: Abraham Van Horen, j.m. Van N. Yorck, en Maria Provoost, j.d. als boven, beyde woonende alhier.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Abraham Van Horne, of New York, Esq. I leave to my wife Mary, the use of all my real and personal estate during her widowhood. After her decease I leave to my daughters Margaret and Anne Van Horne, £500. I leave to my son David the dwelling house and ground where I now live, also my store house and ground adjoining, both situate on the south side of Wall street, and he is to pay to my executors £500. I leave to my son Samuel my dwelling house and ground, now in tenure of Abraham Lynsen, also my bolting and baking house and ground, both situate on the north side of Wall street, and he is to pay to my executors £400. My executors are to sell the rest of my estate to the best advantage. I leave to my sons David and Samuel all implements belonging to the bolting trade. All the rest of my estate is left to my sons and my daughter Catharine, wife of Peter Cock, merchant, of Philadelphia, Margaret and Anne. "All my negro slaves are to be sold to the highest bidder among my children, to prevent their falling into the hand of strangers." Whereas my late daughter Mary, late wife of Governor William Burnet, received from me a very considerable sum of money and other things, Nevertheless, if my wife shall think it convenient and necessary to give to my two grand children, the children of my said daughter, any money or other things, she is empowered to do so; and after her death my executors have the same power. I make my wife and children executors. Dated December 27, 1740. Witnesses, Jacob Abramse, John Myer, Simon Johnson. Proved, January 28, 1741/2. [NOTE.--The lot and house left to David Van Horne is now the east part of the Custom House, and includes Hanover street south of Wall street. The lots on the north side of Wall street is No. 56 and also No. 68. Governor William Burnet had three children by his second marriage, but one of them seems to have died before the above will was made.--W. S. P.]

I manumit or make free my

three negro slaves, Hester and her daughter also named Hester, and Chance, and security be given them, and to each £25 yearly during their lives. To Henry Myer, son of my friend, John R. Myer, £400 in three months after my death, if so much can be then spared by the said Catherine Van Wyck, otherwise to be paid him after the death or remarriage of ye said Catherine. To my nephew, Gerard Beekman, son of my late sister Ann, £1000, paid as the above legacy, and if there should not be enough to pay both each must abate in proportion. All the rest of my estate to Peter Winthrop, son of ye late Capn Balzr Winthrop, and his heirs forever. But if ye said residue amount to £4000 or upward then I give out of ye same to Henry, Mary, Ann and Margaret Vanderspiegel, children of my sister Margaret Vanderspiegel, deceased, or to such of them as living at the death or marriage of ye said Catherine Van Wyck, £300 each. And if Peter Winthrop die before ye devise to him takes effect then I give his part to my Executors to be sold and applied for ye use of ye Charity School in this City and such poor orphans and distressed widow as may need it. And Catherine Van Wyck while single as aforesaid shall have power to sell any part of my real estate for her support in case of need. I make the said Catherine Van Wyck, said John R. Myer, said Gerard Beekman and ye said Peter Winthrop, Executors. Dated October 16, 1771. Witnesses, Chrisr Bancker, Edward Goold (of New York City, Merchant), Tho. Budd. Proved, March 18, 1786. Administration granted to Gerard Beekman the same date.

In 1722 Abraham sold his half of the property at Middletown Township, Monmouth Co., NJ (deeded to him by his father), and purchased 490 acres of land in Readington Township, Hunterdon Co., New Jersey through which ran Rockaway Creek. This land was in 490 acres of "L" shape. Here he developed a grist mill and saw mill on the banks of the creek. About 1750 Abraham Van Horne built the first tavern in the area. It was on the road from Clinton to Somerville where it crossed Rockaway Creek (now route 22). Because the building had white plastered walls it became known as the "White House". The name also was given to the village which sprang up around the tavern. Its location on this early trail immediately led to its being a favorite stopping place for travelers and later for stage coaches of the Easton-New Brunswick Turnpike. By the time of the Revolution its popularity had been well established. The homestead built about 1757 by Abraham Van Horne is about one hundred yards farther down Rockaway Creek from the site of the tavern and is still occupied (March 1976).

In his will, dated 29 Dec 1758 Hunterdon Co., NJ, Abraham Van Horn mentioned Wife, Antia. Children--Abraham (youngest son and under age), Margaret, wife of Herman Rulefson, Phicha, Antia, Neeltie, Matthew (oldest son, married), Cornelius. Children of son Matthew, viz., Abraham, William, Matthew and Cornelius. Homefarm of 250 acres with a grist-mill; another farm of 200 ac.; other real estate and personal property, incl. 7 negro slaves. Executors--sons Cornelius and Abraham, with son-in-law Tobias ten Eyck. Witnesses--Cornelius van der Bilt, Edward Wilmot, David Cock. Proved Dec. 5, 1759. Lib. 10, p. 73. 1760, Feb. 9. Inventory, £576.11.6, incl. bonds and book debts, £201.9.5; books, £2.14; 5 looking glasses, £4; 200 bush. of wheat, a skreen and a skoop, £64; made by Michal Demott and Edward Wilmot.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Abraham Van Horne, of New York, merchant, "being in good state of health, as I have been for some time past." I leave to my wife Catharine the use of all household goods, plate, and furniture, and my negro man and women slaves, during her life. Also all the rents and profits of those two lots of ground and buildings, that is to say, No. 5, which I purchased from John Provoost and Eve his wife, and the Lot No. 4, which I purchased from James Cebra, both lots

being in the Out ward of New York, during her life. I leave to my son James 5 shillings in full bar as heir at law, Also £500 when he is 21, and he is to pay to my wife the interest on œ200 during her life, if she requires the same. I leave to my 4 daughters, Catharine, Margaret, Elizabeth, and Eve, £500 each when 21, and they are to pay to my wife the interest on £200. My executors are to sell all real estate, and the interest to be paid to my wife to maintain my children. After the death of my wife, all my estate is to be sold and divided among my children. And whereas by the will of my father, John Van Horne, my son James is entitled to 1/5 of his estate, now therefore, the share I have given to my son James is on condition that he takes no advantage of his father's will, but will allow his sisters an equal share with himself. I make my wife, and my brother, James Van Horne, and James Cebra, executors. Dated March 11, 1756. Witnesses, Jeremiah Bawdouin, stay maker, John Byvanck, Simon Johnson. Proved, October 26, 1756. [NOTE.--The Lots 4 and 5 mentioned above are a part of the lands of Harmanus Rutgers, and are now Nos. 144-158 (inclusive) Cherry street, New York.-- W. S. P.]

In the m. record they are both of Ramapo. They lived in Mahwah, Bergen Co., NJ. in the Hopper-Van Horn House (built by Jacobus Laroe about 1750) on Ramapo Valley Road, north of Darlington Ave.

Abraham was born in the Ramapo valley, went to New York City, and returned to Mahwah by 1832. He acquired much land, invested in the Franklin Turnpike, bought mountain property, and did lumbering. He was elected freeholder for 1850-1851 and was a member of the state assembly in 1852-1853. He called his farm "Halifax Farm."

They were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, New Jersey, Bergen Co., Hohokus Township, p. 41, enumerated 26 July 1860, Dwelling 708, Family 779 (all b. NJ except as noted) -- Abm Van Horn, 65, Farmer, value real estate \$25,000, value personal estate \$2000; Margt [Van Horn], 60, Wife; Wm [Van Horn], 29, Farmer; Barney [Van Horn], 24, Farmer; Anne [Van Horn], 21, Wife; John [Van Horn], 3; Elizabeth [Van Horn], 2; John Snyder, 39, Laborer, b. Germany; Abm Daidyris?, 19, La-

borer; Maria Snyder, 28, Servant. Listed just after them was the family headed by Garret (33) & Mary E. (29) Van Horn.

Margaret Van Horn, 71, was living with her son William's family at the time of the 1870 census.

At the time of their marriage, they were both of Acquackanonk. Barent Van Horn lived first at Wezel, later Wyckoff, Bergen Co., NJ, where he was probably the builder of the Van Horn House on Wyckoff Avenue in Wyckoff.

Barent Van Horne was mentioned in a Bergen County Road Return dated 23 Sep 1743, which was recorded at the request of Isaac Boogaert. Landmarks mentioned in the Return were the mill of Roelof Van Houten, land of Coenraad Stor, land of Johannes Pillesfelt, land of Barent Van Horne, land of Abraham Volck, meeting with Ramapogh Road.<sup>1</sup>

On 10 November 1788 (recorded 12 December 1805, Bergen Co. W:292) Whereas Dirk Barentse Van Horn in his lifetime was appossessed of land at or near Waggerew and by his last will and testament dated 26 May 1733 devised said land to all his children to be equally divided among them (equal sixth parts), now we, John B. Van Horn, John Van Imburgh, John Van Horn, son of Testator, John C. Westervelt, and Cornelius Post, all heirs of the Legatee, have made equal division of said tract of land into six lots, conveyed to Jacob Ackerman of Waggerew, for 6 shillings, Lot No. 5. Signed by John Van Horn (his mark), John Vanemburgh, John Van B Horn [sic], John Westervelt, Cnelis Post. Witnessed by Cornelius Westervelt, David Marines.<sup>2</sup>

Christian Barents Van Horn, a carpenter, was, on 5 Sep 1655, one of the artisans who sailed from New Amsterdam with Director-General Petrus Stuyvesant on the expedition to conquer the Swedish settlements and forts on the Delaware. He must have returned very soon, as he was appointed fire warden of New Amsterdam on 18 Jan 1656

Christian Barentsen Van Horn had come before 1653 to New Amsterdam from Holland, with his wife, Jannetje Jans, and one young son. He soon after migrated to the South River colony near Wilmington, Delaware. He was engaged in building a mill in the Colony of Nieuw Amstel when he died of the plague on 26 July 1658

In the record of their marriage intentions, they were: Cornelius Janszen Van Hoorn, en Anne Marie Janszen, Van Tamerica.

On 15 Sep 1659 Cornelius Jansen Van Hoorn bought from his father Jan Cornelissen Van Hoorn, a lot north of the wall, bounded west by house and lot of Adolf Pietersen; north by house and lot of the grantor; east by the house and lot of Sybrant Jansen; south by the wall aforesaid. Broad on the wall of south side 25 running feet; long; on the west side 48 feet; on the north, 22-1/2 feet; on the east, 46 feet.<sup>1</sup>

They lived on “The Waal” in New Amsterdam (NYC) and on 19 April 1665, when a general levy was made on all Burghers and other inhabitants of New Amsterdam to pay the expenses of 100 soldiers quartered in the town, his assessment was 1 fl. per week for six weeks.<sup>1</sup>

They afterwards lived on the northerly side of Pearl Street between Old Slip and Broad St., then a part of the street called “Waterside” in 1674, and he was estimated at that time to be worth \$5000. and was taxed on a valuation of 500 florins.<sup>1</sup>

He was a furrier and hat dealer. His wife, Anna Maria Jans, was a member of the Old Dutch Church in New York City in 1686.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: 11th day of October, 1689, I, Cornelius Jansen Van Hoorn, inhabitant in this city of New York, have of my free will made this my last will and testament, without any persuasion of others. I leave to my eldest son John, 50 shillings, made in consideration of the Prerogatives of the first born. I leave to my wife Anna Maria Van Hoorn, all my estate during her life, she remaining unmarried, to bring up and maintain the under aged children, and after her decease, to be di-

vided among my children, and they are to be instructed in an art or trade by which they may live." Makes his wife executor. Witnesses, Thomas Burroughs, Albert Bosch.<sup>2</sup>

Cornelis acquired land in the old Hackensack Township, Bergen County, in the Bogota-Teaneck area, along with his step-father, brothers and half-brothers, and also land in the Closter area. The first patents of the Teaneck area were mainly confirmatory. The first one to Cornelis was dated in 1685 and covered 183 acres between the Hackensack River and the West Branch of Overpeck Creek. This land was in or near the area of Teaneck, just north of State Highway 4. Lutheran church services were often held in the home of Cornelis in Teaneck, a region where most of the other Lutheran families lived.

His Closter lands were on both sides of the Schraalenburgh Road, immediately south of the present Harrington Park (1967) between the Hackensack River and the Tenakill, with the northern line likely the Dwarskill. In 1686 Cornelis, his brother Hans [Johannes], two half-brother Van Buskirks, three Bantas, and one Vanderlinde, all of Hackensack, and the elder Van Buskirk of Bergen, were charged with "a Riote by them Comitted in the sd County (Bergen) and for refusing to obey the King's Authority there." The records on the subject of the riot, the participants, and the end results, are scanty. It is likely that the dispute with the East Jersey Governor and council was concerned with title to the Hackensack lands.

His will was dated 22 March 1726/7 probated 24 March 1728/9, Hackensack, Bergen County, NJ. In it, Cornelus van Horen, yeoman; will of. Wife Maragrietta. Sons--Luickes, Cristeyaen, Cornelus, Johanes, Derik; daughters--Jannetie's (children), Anatie, wife of Samuel Desmorest, Else, wife of John van Boskerck. Real and personal estate. No executor named. He lived first in NYC; where he was Mayor. He moved to NJ and settled, probably in 1724, in Middlebrook, in what is now Bridgewater Township, Somerset County, NJ. He was a member of the Council of New Jersey.

His will was dated 1768 and was probated in 1770 (Trenton Wills, Book K, p. 381). In it he states that he was of Somerset County, Eastern District, and names his wife, Elizabeth, and sons, Philip and John, and also their children. To Philip he devises the one-half of the plantation on which Cornelius lived (551 acres of land out of 1102 acres); also a grist mill; also one-half of the residue of his estate after the death of his (the testator's) wife. To John he gives the other one-half of the plantation, naming it as the "Western side" and also one-half of the residue after the death of his (the testator's) wife. A portion of this land, said to be "about 1,000 acres," and "laid out into four lots of 250 acres each," was advertised for sale in 1774. ("N. J. Archives," Vol. XXIV, p. 332). The testator names the children of Philip as Cornelius, William, Philip, Mary, Elizabeth, Cornelis and "Violetta," which serves perfectly to identify this Philip. He names the children of John as Hannah, Elizabeth and Catherine. The land above devised appears to have been the same purchased by him Aug. 28, 1724, from John Chambers, of New York City (Trenton Deeds, Book 33, p. --).

A John Van Horne was a Justice of the Peace of Somerset, 1767 and 1768.

In his will, he wrote: I, Cornelius Van Horne, of New York, merchant, being at this present in good health. I leave to my wife Judith the use and occupation of any of my houses that she shall make choice of, so long as she remains my widow; and my executors are to keep it in good repair. My executors are to make an inventory of all my estate, and shall set apart so much as shall be sufficient for the maintainance and education of my four sons, Geritt, Augustus, Cornelius, and David, and such children as I may hereafter have, until they are of age or marry. I leave to my wife 1/3 of the rents of all my real estate. And whereas I am now seized as Tenant by the courtesey, as tenant of a house and lot in New York, where Doctor Fisher now lives, and also another house fronting the Dock, which I built upon a lot in the rear of said lot, in which Peter Pennant the hatter now lives; and also in a share of lands at Sarrightoge [Saratoga?], in the County of Albany; All of which came to me by my wife Joanna, deceased; and my said wife not having made any alienation, it descends to my eldest son Geritt as heir at law. This and the choice of my guns, sword, or pair of pistols, shall be to him as heir at law and eldest son. I leave to my sons, Augustus, Cornelius, and David, all my lands in New York, with the buildings, which I bought of Joseph Latham, "Lying near the Creupel Bosch, and known as my Corde yard," and where Captain Davis lately lived, as by deeds may appear. All the rest of my estate I leave to my said sons, Geritt, Augustus, Cornelius, and David, and my executors have power to sell at discretion. I make my wife Judith, my son Geritt, and my brother in law, Simon Johnson, and my brother in law, Peter Jay, executors. Witnesses, Francis Johnson, William Hyer, Augustus Volette. Proved, June 11, 1752.

He lived first (about 1718) in Monmouth Co., then moved (about 1723) to Hunterdon Co., NJ. He is believed to have been the Capt. Cornelius Van Hoorne who led troops against Canada in 1737.

Captain Cornelius left a Will dated December 24, 1743, with a Codicil added on February 3, 1744. These were admitted to probate on March 16, 1744 and are recorded in the Book of Wills, No. V, page 17, in the office of the Secretary of State at Trenton, N. J. This will is dated at Reading Town, County of Hunterdon, in the western division of New Jersey and makes the following bequests:-- "To my beloved wife Hannah, fifty ponds [pounds] in lieu of her dowry, and provision for her support so long as she shall live and remain a widow. To my eldest son Thomas, all that tract of land whereon I now dwell, situate in the County of Hunterdon, and purchased of John Budd. To my son Mathias, all that tract of land situate in Upper Freehold adjoining Thomas Lenard, Abiah Cooke, Thomas Eversham and Joseph Williams in the County of Monmouth; and that said Mathias shall pay two hundred pounds proclamation money, in manner and form following, that is to say:--whatsoever said Mathias has over and above his equal dividend of my whole estate, that he shall pay the one-half of that to my eldest daugh-

ter, Catharine when she arrives at the age of twenty-seven years, and the other half to my daughter Elizabeth when she arrives at the age of twenty-four. To my son Cornelius, a certain small tract of land situate upon Crossrock Creek, in the County of Burlington, purchased of Matthew Watson; that the said Cornelius shall pay the sum of five shillings proclamation money to his younger brother Daniel at the age of twenty-one years. After all my just debts have been paid, my seven sons and three daughters are to have an equal division of my whole estate. I hereby nominate my son Thomas Van Horne, my brother Abraham Van Horne and my friend Nickolaes Wyckoff, to be my executors of this, my last will and testament. CODICIL, I leave my loving wife one of the side-saddles; and my son Thomas his choice of all my horsekind, except the black horse branded J. R. and my saddle; and to my son Mathias my horse branded J. R. and my saddle; to my daughter Catharine, three pounds, ten shilling proclamation money; and I leave to my daughter Elizabeth, that side saddle which was her mother's and I leave to my son Thomas, that saddle which he usually rides upon." I leave to my son David, and my daughters, Ann, Susanah, Catharine, Cornelia, and Elizabeth, £1,000, each, when of full age. I leave to such of my daughters as shall be unmarried at the time of my decease £100 "for wedding clothes," my daughter Mary, wife of Levinus Clarkson, having had so much at her marriage. I leave to each of my executors except my wife and daughter Ann, £50 each. I also leave them £50, "to be by them applied towards the relief of the Poor in New York, as they shall think proper." I leave to my wife £100 for such charitable purposes as she shall think proper. I leave to my wife the use of all estate during widowhood. If she marries she is to have £2,000. "If my wife shall think proper, and the behavior of my son David shall be agreeable to her, she may convey my house and storehouse adjoining the same, situate on the south side of Wall street, to the use of my son David." All the rest of my estate I leave to my son David, and my daughters, Mary, Ann, Susanah, Catharine, Cornelia, and Elizabeth. And in case my wife does not convey my house and lot and storehouse, it is to be considered part of my estate. My executors may sell property if it is for the benefit of my family. I make my wife and my daughter Ann, and David Clarkson, merchant, and John Jay, attorney at Law, executors. Dated June 27, 1774. Witnesses, Peter Keteltas, Cornelius P. Low, William Denning. Proved, January 24, 1776. [NOTE.--The "house, store house and lot" of David Van Horne is now the east part of the Custom House on Wall street, and also includes the present Hanover street. David Van Horne, the son, sold the west part to Thomas Buchanan, May 5, 1791. His heirs sold to Merchants' Exchange, 1824. The east lot was sold by David Van Horne to Edward Lyde, and he sold to Marine Insurance Company, May 1, 1804. They sold to Ocean Insurance Company, 1813. When Hanover street was opened in 1829, this lot was taken. It was then No. 45 Wall street. The numbers have since been changed.--W. S. P.]

I appoint my son Cornelius and my daughters executors. December 28, 1730. Witnesses, Joseph Murray, Garrett Wender, Benjamin Blagge. Proved, February 1, 1737.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Garret Van Horne, of New York, merchant, being in good health, this 8th of December, 1761. I leave to my wife Anne all that certain messuage or tenement, with the lot and appurtenances, lying in the Dock Ward, in New York, where I now live, "during the term of her natural life, and no longer." Also the use of all household stuff and furniture for life, and then to my loving children, "except the Family Pictures," "and also except my pistols, my wearing apparell, and the choice of my muskets or Fuzees," which I particularly give to my son Cornelius on account of his birthright. I also give to my wife my silver watch and my wearing apparell, also the use of my negro slaves, and also one-third of the income of my estate. The other 2/3 to my children, Cornelius, Joseph Reade, Johana, Anne, Geritt, Alida, and Mary, when they are of age, and after the death of my wife, all the rest of estate, real and personal, "except family Pictures, pistols, and my wearing sword." My executors, with consent of my wife, may sell all real estate and the house and lot, if for the best interest of the family. I make my wife and brothers-in-law, Lawrence Reade, James De Peyster, and Joseph Reade, Jr., executors, and my sons, Cornelius, Joseph Reade, and Geritt, when they are of age. Witnesses, Andrew McMyer, Thomas Bartow, Jr., Jacob De Witt. Proved, June 7, 1765. [NOTE.--The house and lot of Geritt Van Horne is now No. 92 Pearl street. It descended to him from his mother, who was a daughter of Robert Livingston, who obtained this and the lot No. 90 from Captain William Kidd and his wife.--W. S. P.]

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Anne Van Horne, of New York, widow. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my four daughters œ200 equally, when of age, "and all my wearing apparell, gold watch, gold snuff box, gold chain, and gold bodkin." All the rest of my estate I leave to all my children. "And as I am not well satisfied with the conduct of some of my sons, and would not choose to have any part of my estate spent in dissipation and extravagance, my executors are to pay them their share if they behave well, and they shall forfeit their share for misconduct. And I make my executors absolute Judges." I make Dr. John Charlton, Augustus Van Horne, and my brother, John Reade, executors. Dated April 16, 1772. Witnesses, Richard Fletcher, Richard Bayley, John Jay. Proved, April 17, 1773.

Johannes Cornelissen Van Hoorn, in his will, dated 23 June 1733, devises to his sons James (Jacobus) and Abraham the Rocky Hill tracts [ in NJ]. James repeatedly offered his place at Rocky Hill for sale; in 1755 he was living on a 1,668-acre farm at Dover, near Cheesequakes creeek, Middlesex county, and advertised that for sale also.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, James Van Horne, of Middlesex County, New Jersey, Gent., being in perfect health. I leave to my eldest son, John Van Horne, 1/2 of all my estate, real and personal, and 11 negroes (named), one of them bought of Benjamin Morell. I also leave him his mother's gold watch and chain, and diamond ring, and 1/2 of his mother's wearing apparell, furniture, plate, and linnen when he is 21. If he dies, then to my son James. I leave to my youngest son, James Van Horne, the other 1/2 of my estate, and 11 negroes (named), and the handsome diamond ring that I have, And his mother's pearl necklace, and 1/2 of her wearing apparell, and mine, and 1/2 of the household furniture. The money arising from the sale of estate to be used for the educating and bringing up of my two sons. "The best education to be given to my son James that the Province of Pennsylvania affords, either at the Academy or Mr. Dove's English School, and there to remain till he is 16 or 17, and then put either to the study of Physick or the Law, which shall best suit his Capacity or Inclination, and there to remain 4 or 5 years, either with the most eminent Physician or Lawyer. If his inclination should lead him to Physick, and he is desirous of going to one of the Colleges in Scotland to complete his studies, It is left to the discretion of executors." If both my sons die, then I leave my estate to my grandsons and granddaughters then living. "I leave to my executors a suit of mourning and to each of my sons a mourning ring, to be made in England, to the value of 10 guineas each and set with Jewells." It is my will and Pleasure, that no Pompous funeral be made after my decease, and that none be invited thereto but my near relations and my particular acquaintances, at the discretion of my executors, and that my body be interred in the vault on Smith's Hill, near my wife Margaret, deceased. I make my nephews, James McEvers, and William Cockroft, of New York, merchants, and my friend, John Berrian, of Rocky Hill, East New Jersey, merchant, executors. And they may sell my real estate, reserving 1/2 of all mines, mineralls, Coal pits, etc. Dated October 29, 1760. Witnesses, Catharine Van Horne, Catharine Cebra, James Cebra. Proved in New York, December 7, 1761.

In the record of their marriage, they were: Johannes Van Hoorn, j.m. Van N. Yorck, en Catharina Meyer, j.d. also boven, beyde wonende alhier.

Johannes Cornelissen Van Hoorn was a New York merchant (and probably the wealthiest of the early Van Horns), who began buying land in New Jersey in 1706, adding steadily to his purchases during the next 16 years, acquiring extensive tracts in Somerset and Middlesex counties, as well as in Monmouth county.

In the census taken in 1703, Jan's family is given as one male, one female, three children, three negroes, three negresses. He served for several terms as a member of the New York General Assembly. On 1 June 1725 he was part owner of the ship "Hopewell" with Barent Rynders. He was an Alderman of the East Ward of New York City in 1703-6, and a member of the 12th Colonial Assembly from New York City from April 6, 1709-Nov. 12, 1709.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, dated 23 June 1733 City of New York, John Van Horne, merchant, appointed as Executors--all my children, Cornelius, Andrew, Abraham, James, and Catharine. Land bought of Samuel Royce, John Burrows, Dockwra, Sonmans, and John Outman; lands joyning "brother" Abraham Garrett, and Henry Neald, where Edward Phillips lives, on Millston River, joyning land of Francis Elrington; land where Robert Letice Hooper lives, joyning lands of James and Thomas Leonard and Edward Phelps. Witnesses--Joh. VanSolingen, Jere. Tothill, P's Rynders. Proved Nov. 22, 1735.

He devises to his sons James (Jacobus) and Abraham the Rocky Hill tracts. In his will, he wrote: I, John Van Horne, of New York, merchant, being in perfect health. I leave to my son, Cornelius Van Horne, £600, and the following lands in New Jersey. The tract of land I bought of Samuel Royce, called Roycefield, 3/4 of which belongs to me, And 3 small pieces of land I bought of him, in all 1,600 acres. I leave to my son Andrew all my lands in Piscataqua, bought of Samuel Royce and John Burroughs. I leave to my son Abraham, a part of a tract of land called Rocky Hill, as divided between me and my brothers, bounded east and south by Bedian's brook. I leave to my son James, all the rest of that tract, from the east line of lot No. 1, to Millstone river; bounded north by Francis Ebington's land, where Robert Letice Hooper now lives, east by Millstone river, south by James Leonard, and west by Lot No. 1, where Edward Phillips lives, being 1,300 acres. If they build a mill on Bedian's brook each of my sons Abraham and James is to have 1/2. I leave to my sons Andrew and James, each £1000. I leave to my son James the house I now live in, with my store house fronting the Dock, and he is to pay to Cornelius £200. I have given him a deed for the said house and lot. He is also to pay to each of his brothers ≈i200, and to his sister Catharine, £200. I have given to my daughter Catharine her portion, and the house I bought of John Outman. I make my sons, and my daughter Catharine, executors. Witnesses, John Van Schruyer, Jeremiah Tothill, Barent Rynder. "This will was Proved in the Jerseys,

therefore not probated here." (Probate: New Jersey Wills 2:500: John's will was dated 23 Jun 1733, proved 22 Nov 1735, Middlesex Co.)

1735, Nov. 9. Bond of Andrew Vanhorne, brother of John Vanhorne, Jun'r, as administrator on estate left unadministered by his father, John VanHorne. Patrick McEvers, fellow bondsman. Witness--James Hooper.

Marvin calls Catharina Meyers the stepdaughter of Andries Jansen, and writes of her: Catherine Meyer, wife of Johannes Van Horne was baptized Sept. 8, 1672. She was the daughter of Jan Dircksen Meyer and his wife Tryntje Andriess Grevenraet, who lived in New Amsterdam prior to 1652. They are in list as early members of Dutch Church, many of whom settled here prior to 1649. He was a painter and was admitted as a small burgher April 14, 1657. His wealth in 1674 was estimated at £2,000. He then lived on Bridge Street, New Amsterdam and in 1686 on Stone St. between Whitehall and Broad Streets.<sup>1</sup>

To the eldest daughter of my brother-in-law, John and Mary Van Wagenin, whose name is Margaret, £25, to the second oldest daughter of the aforesaid, whose name is Ann, all the remaining part of my estate. If she should die without issue, then that part of my estate shall be divided equally among the surviving children of my aforesaid brother-in-law and Mary his wife. I make my loving brother-in-law, John Van Wagenin, and Mary his wife, together with my trusty friend, Jacob Freeland, executors. Witnesses, John Jacks, Anthony Fountain, yeoman, Vincent Fountain. Proved, February 21, 1782.

They lived on Franklin Tpk. in Allendale, Bergen Co., NJ, (probably in the house at 707 Franklin Turnpike). His nickname, "Griddlegreaser," seems to have been an "opposite name" given him because he was over 6 feet tall and exceedingly thin.

He was a blacksmith and also ran a cider mill. He was known as an inventive genius, and was known for devising mechanical gadgets, including a shotgun owned by one local resident who claimed it was better than any ever turned out by an arms factory. In 1859 he gave a series of lectures at the schoolhouse on the subject of the *Paterson Guardian* and its black reporter (Alfred P. Smith, who later published his own periodical, *The Landscape*, from his home in Saddle River).

They are listed in the 1860 Federal Census, he as a laborer. In the 1870 Federal Census, he is listed as a carpenter. In the 1880 Federal Census, he is listed as a machinist.

John J. Van Horn and wife, Maria Quackenbush, were members of the Wyckoff Ref Ch. A note in the Wyckoff Ref Ch membership records says "Joined the Methodists").

John J. Van Horn was received into the Ramapo [Iron Works] Presbyterian Church by confession in 1896. His wife, Carrie F., was received by confession in 1886.

In June 1905 and January 1920 they were living on West Crescent Avenue, Allendale, Bergen Co., NJ, in a house they owned.

Belcher, who then gave orders that he proceed with forty men to Sussex county, "to be employed in the immediate defense of the frontiers of the Province in the counties of Morris and Sussex" against the reported approach of the French and Indian army. ("N. J. Archives," Vol. VIII, First Series, Second Part, p. 182).

On May 12, 1759, he was appointed Judge of the Somerset County Courts, a position he probably held until the Revolution, as he was certainly acting as Judge in 1773 ("N. J. Archives," Vol. XXIX, p. 65), and it is also certain he was in Somerset after the War, and possibly as late as 1782.
