The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

His will, on file at Trenton (NJ1967B, 38:190, Bergen County) was filed in 1799. He owned property in Franklin Township, prob. in the vicinity of Allendale/Waldwick/Wyckoff. Elizabeth inherited a good portion of her father's estate, as also did her children.

On 9 Aug 1794 (Recorded 28 April 1804, Bergen Co. S:110) James S. Bogert and Winchey, his wife, of Youpough, conveyed to Martin Van Houten of same place, yeoman, for £112, 27 acres more or less at Youpough, beginning at Main Road leading from Youpough to Pompton in line of said Martin Van Houten on W side of said Road. Signed by James S. Bogert, Winchey Bogert (her mark). Witnessed by Corynes Van Houten, Thomas Hamman.¹

Corines Van Houten also owned a small grist mill within a mile of the Oakland station on the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad.

Gerrebrandt Van Houten was elected Ensign of a militia company in 1793. Subsequently, owing probably to an accident, one of his hands was crippled, and he was excused in 1808, on that account, from military service. It was doubtless due to the same disability that his handwriting was exceedingly crabbed.¹

He lived in a large stone house later known as Nos. 117 and 119 Water Street, Paterson, NJ. For about ten or fifteen years before 1818 he ran a general country store. He was appointed a Justice of the Peace of Bergen Co. in 1803 and continued in that office until his death. He was a Judge of the Bergen County Court of Common Pleas for many years. He was one of the earliest promoters of the Paterson and Hamburg turnpike. He gave the site for the Second Reformed Church of Paterson, on the northwest corner of Water and Temple streets.¹

He kept a barrel full of documents, stored in the attic of his home at 117-119 Water Street, Paterson, Passaic Co., NJ. William Nelson, selected, transcribed and edited these documents and they were printed in 1894 as The Van Houten Manuscripts.

He joined the Second Ref Ch of Paterson as an original member, in 1827. He was an Elder in 1827.¹

The Martha Ann Zabriskie Memorandum Book entry for his death he was "from Manchester."

The Paterson Intelligencer of 16 March 1831 announced his death: "At his residence in Paterson, on the 11th inst., Garrabrant Van Houten, Esq., age 60 years, 4 months and 9 days. He had been considerably indisposed through the winter, and most of the time confined to the house, but for some days previous to his decease seemed rather convalescent, inso much that during the afternoon of the day, in the evening of which he died, he walked a short distance from home, and attended as usual to the transaction of his official business. On his return he partook of supper with the family, and retired to bed apparently as well as he had been for some time; but about 9 o'clock he was found to be indisposed and speechless and in a few moments expired. ..."

On 4 November 1805 (recorded 26 April 1806, Bergen Co. X:354) David Benson of Paterson, Essex County, and Daniel Benson of Totowa in the County of Bergen, conveyed to Garrabrant Van Houten, Esquire, of Saddle River Township, for \$1, 90 acres English measure, in the Township of Saddle River, beginning at road that leads from the Town of Paterson to Bloomsburg, opposite ford at Edo Marseluses' W edge of Passaic River. Signed David Benson, Daniel Benson. Witnessed by John R. Berdan, Abrm. Willis.³

On 4 November 1805 (recorded 26 April 1806, Bergen Co. X:357) Garrebrant Van Houten, Esquire, and Jane, his wife of Saddle River Township, conveyed to Daniel Bensen of the State of New Jersey, for \$1, 90 acres English measure in the Township of Saddle River, and estate rights, etc. (see property description in Deed recorded above X:354). Signed by Garrabrant Van Houten, Jane Van Houten. Witnessed by John R. Berdan, Abm. Willis.³

Isaac was living on Totowa Ave. in 1797 (sic) and died before May 7, 1801, when his widow Mary of Wantage, Sussex Co. sold two lots of Gerrit's homestead farm (citing Bergen Co. Transcribed Deeds, book O, p. 205).¹

On Nov. 28, 1795, a letter of administration (Liber B, page 100 Orange Co.) named Mary Van Houten, widow, Garret Van Houten, son, and Jacobus Post, Junr, friend, as administrators for the estate of Isaac Van Houten, late of the Town of Warwick.

His widow, Mary, appears to have been enumerated in Warwick, Orange Co., NY in the 1800 census.

Mary Van Houten of Wantage bought land in Wantage, Sussex Co., NJ on May 8, 1801 (Sussex Co. Deeds, book F, p. 217), and sold land in Wantage on May 25, 1808 (Sussex Co. Deeds, book S, p. 190). Mary Van Houten, widow of Isaac Van Houten, had her estate inventoried in Sussex County by John Van Houten (Sussex Co. Inventories, book C, p. 41). Included in the estate were notes against Garret Van Houten, James Van Houten, Isaac Van Houten, Peter P. Van Houten and John Van Houten.²
