The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Elizabeth, wife of Baltus Van Kleeck, was mentioned in the will dated 14 Nov 1733 of her father, Jan De Graeff of "Pogh-keepsinck." He also named son-in-law Baltus Van Kleeck one of his executors.

In her will, she wrote: I, Elizabeth Van Kleeck, of Rumbout Precinct, in Duches County, widow, being somewhat indisposed in body. All debts to be paid in some convenient time. I leave all my estate, real and personal, to my six children, Barent, Baltus, Maria, wife of John Freer, Neelyte, wife of Peter Fieler, Elizabeth, wife of John Laroy, and Antonetta, wife of Jacob Becker. I make my son-in-law, John Freer, executor." Dated October 8, 1772. Witnesses, John Robinson, Jacobes Frear, of Poughkeepsie. Proved, May 17, 1782.

He lived in New York City, but in the latter part of his life moved to Flushing, NY.

In his will, he wrote: I, Baltus Van Kleeck, of Flushing, Nassau Island, N. Y., yeoman, March 18, 1783. I leave to my well beloved wife Ann £50 for her immediate use, all my feather beds, "all my linnen which I have with me or in whose possession soever it may be," my silver spoons, silver sugar cup, silver tea tongs, all my china and glass, negro woman Nell, riding chair, swine and poultry, and all furniture except that given to son Baltus, 50 bushels of wheat, 100 bushels of shelled Indian Corn, and all provisions she judge sufficient for her family use for the first year, also £450 to be paid her when son Baltus comes of age unconditionally whether wife marries again or not. Also wife to have use of my house, barn and out houses, farm and salt meadow in Flushing, negro man Joe, my two best horses and six cows, till Baltus comes of age provided she support him till of age and give him as much schooling as she conveniently can, but if she remarry "then she my said wife shall quit." To son Baltus my silver tankard, best desk, plain framed looking glass, clock, second best andirons, gold stock buckle and sleeve buttons, silver watch, best gun, best bay horse, etc., all real estate in Flushing except wife shall have choice of best room "and have a priviledge in the kitchen and the use of the fire in the said kitchen, and have her choice of one part of the cellar," son Baltus to keep a "good chair horse" for my wife and "fire wood ready cut by the door." Executors to sell real estate in New York and elsewhere not disposed of above and give proceeds as follows: To my grandson, James Van Kleeck, £20 and the "reversion" after debts are paid one fourth to son Baltus, one fourth to my daughter, Jacoba Carman, one fourth to my granddaughter, Elizabeth Wiltse's daughter, one fourth to my deceased son, Lawrence Van Kleeck's two youngest children, Sarah and Baltus. If son Baltus die under age and without children, his share of estate to be sold and divided, one fourth to my wife, one fourth to daughter, Jacoba Carman, one fourth to deceased son Lawrence's three children, viz.: James, Sarah and Baltus, one fourth to granddaughter Wiltse. Executors, wife, friends John P. Van Kleeck, of Poughkipsey, Dutchess County, and John Allen, of Great Neck, Queens County, husband to Philip Pells daughter (not named). Witnesses, Peter De Lancey, Martia Rodman, of Flushing, spinster; Frederic Jahn. Proved, Queens County, March 7, 1785. Confirmed, New York, July 27, 1785.

I appoint Jonathan Drake sole executor, and empower him to sell, buy, improve, and manage the first-mentioned legacy in any way that he may judge best for the interest of the legatees until they shall be entitled to receive the same; my executor to pay to my sister, Mary Martin, such sums as he may think proper from time to time. Dated September 4, 1794. Witnesses, Abraham Leggett, Charles Collins, writing clerk; George Ferris. Proved, December 20, 1794.

Barent Baltus came from Lippe, a region of Germany surrounding Lipstadt. Some of the daughters used Van Haarlem, as they were born in Haarlem, Holland.

Barent Baltus was married three times according to Prentiss Glazier (whose history of the Van Kleeck Family of Dutchess County New York is available on microfilm) and came to Flatbush NY 1647-1654. He died there before 19 Nov. 1659.
