The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Colve, and took the oath of allegiance in 1687. He was in New Utrecht in 1675, where his name appears on the assessment roll of that year. On Oct. 15, 1681, he bought of Bartel Claesen his house and farm in Flatlands of 19 morgens; also Claesen's share of the land lying at the Paerde Gat, patented by Gov. Andros Mar. 17, 1677, to said Claesen and Louis Janse; also 10 morgens on the plains of "Amersfoort," which Claesen bought of Samuel Spicer; and also 2 morgens on the "Midwoutse" plains known as No. 10, with all salt-meadows, as per p. 142 of Lib. AA of Flatbush records.

On 16 Dec 1666, Leysebet Jans, widow of Jan Claesen, deceased, and at present married to Auke Jans. The said Lysbet Jans has children which she bore to Jan Claessen, deceased, excepting a son named Johannes Christoffels, whom she bore to Christoffels Schaets [Schaers?]. The children of Jan Claessen are Leysbet Jans, Claes Jansen, and Christoffel Jans. The said Lysebet Jans is married to Willem Jansen Borkeloo. [Signed] Aucke Jans Van Nuys. Claes Jansen and Stoffel Jansen regarding their mother's estate, that the same shall have the sum of one thousand and fifty glds. for the two, viz when they shall have come to their majority or to their wedding day, in sewan or grain at sewan price. To this the part appearing pledges his person and property, and for a special mortgage his bowery situate in this Town and at present occupied by Jochem Wouters, on the west side of the road, on the north side of the cross road and on the south side of Bartel Claessen, in order that by failure of payment the aforesaid sum may be raised upon the same without cost or loss. In testimony of the truth this is subscribed by the overseers with the parties on date Oct 10, 1672.

Aucke Jansen. Jan Sueberingh. Symen Hanssen. Willem Geliams, Overseer. This is the mark of Jan Aertson Vanderbilt, Overseer, placed by himself Known to me, Jacob Joosten, Secretary"²

On this day, 7th February, in the year sixteen hundred and seventy-eight and nine, Aucke Jansen, resident in Midwout, and Johanes Christoffel, resident at Gawoanes, in presence of the undersigned witnesses, acknowledged, just as they acknowledge by these presents, to have settled all accounts which they have had with each other from the beginning of the world to this present day, and are in everything even, without one having any claim upon the other. In witness of the truth this signed by both parties, in Midewould, day and date as above. (No signatures actually given.)

Anke Jans Van Huys, in his will, wrote: In the name of our Lord, Amen. Whereas I, Ankie Janse Van Huys, of the Town of Flatbush, in Kings County, considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the hour, And not willing to depart out of this world before he should have disposed of his worldly estate." Leaves "to his eldest son, John Anke, procured by his lawful wife Magdalena Anke," £1, 4s. in money. Leaves to "all his children, procured by his first wife, Magdalena Anke, deceased, and to the children of his present wife, Geetie Ankes, procured by her first husband, John Jacobse [(this phrase probably omitted from the will); and to my grandchildren] that are named and baptized Anke," each 6 shillings. Leaves all estate, houses and lands, to his wife Geetie for life, and then to his children by his first wife Magdalena, viz., Anatie, wife of Dirck Janse Waertman, and the two children of Geetie Anke deceased, procured by Joost Fransen, viz., Sara Joosten, and Magdalena Joosten for one share. And Janettie Anke, wife of Ryne Aertsen, Jan Anke, Pontus Anke, Abigail, wife of Lippit Peterse, Jacobus Anke, and Famettie wife of Jan Stevense. And to the children of his present wife Geetie, procured by her first husband Jan Jacobse, viz., Lysbett Janse, wife of Dirck Janse Van Sutphen, and Eva Janse, wife of Jan Anke. Dated May 15, 1694. Richard, Earl of Bellomont, Captain-General, &c. Whereas Anke Janse lately died leaving a will of which a copy is an-

nexed, Letters of administration are granted to his eldest son, John Anke, (???) 1698.
