The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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Van Orden

The Van Orden surname was often written as "Van Norden." When the names are spoken, they are virtually indistinguishable, and clerks hearing the name often recorded it as "Van Norden."

Adam Van Orden, 37, farmer, and Rosamond, 36, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, Franklin Twp., dwelling 133, family 142, living in the same dwelling with David (59) & Letty (56) Van Orden (prob. Adam's parents). Adam is listed as a farmer. Listed living with them were: Letty Jane, 16; David James, 15, farmer; Rachel Ann, 12; and Mary Sophia, 6. Also lived in the same dwelling, but a separate family, were: Rachel Blauvelt, 77; Maria Burns, 45; and Sarah Youre, 20.

Adam Van Orden and wife, Rosamond Stanfield, were listed as members of the Wyckoff Ref Ch.

Adam Van Orden, 47, farmer, and Roseamond Van Orden, 45, were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township (Godwinville P.O.), Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with them was: Mary, 14. Also listed living with them were:

George Edward, 18 farm laborer; John Arcus (or Arens?), 27, black, farm laborer; and David Van Orden, 67, gentleman. Listed as a separate family, but living in the same dwelling were David J. Van Orden, 25, farm laborer, and Sarah Van Orden, 23.

Adam Van Orden, 57, farmer, and Rosanna, 55, were listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ (probably in or near what became Midland Park Borough). Living with them was William Stark, 14, farm laborer. Living in the same dwelling were: William Wellstone, 28, b. Holland, farm laborer, Kate, 27, b. Holland, and Aaron, 3; Kate, 1; Peter, 4/12 (b. Feb); and Aaron, 66, b. Holland, farm laborer.

Adam Van Orden, 67, farmer, and Rosamond, 65, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ. Also living with them are Harriet Morrison, 30, servant; John Mittin, 12??, or 72, laborer; and John Ryan, 13??, servant. John Mittin is English with parents born in England. John Ryan is born New York, with parents born Ireland. Harriet Morrison is born New Jersey with parents born New Jersey.

Adam Van Orden left a will dated 17 January 1857; but not probated until 25 March 1891. In his will, he mentions that his father is to have a room as long as he lives in his home, plus place to plant his potatoes, etc. He gives to wife, Rosamond, the undivided half of house in the city and state of New York at 14 Commerce Street, along with the income and profits and also all his real estate situate in Bergen and Passaic Counties. He mentions his "four" children but only names David James and his son-in-law Albert Romaine (2 of the executors), along with his wife and Garret G. Ackerson of Hackensack. In case of any "squabbles" amongst his children, he appoints Garret G. Ackerson of Hackensack and David Ackerman of New York now residing at No. 5 Morton Street in the city, as people to appoint a third disinterested party to divide his estate. Witnesses are Isaac D. Van Blarcom (Syckamack), Isaac C? Snyder (Wyckoff) and George Goetschius (Cherry Lane).

Rosamond Stansfield died at an old ladies home on Totowa and Preakness Avenues, Paterson, NJ.
