The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Arie Corneliszen, en syn h. Rebecca Idens were members of the NYC Ref Ch in 1686. They lived Over 't Versch Water, ["Beyond the Fresh Water."] (The old pond at Kalck-hoek, or The Collect). They was listed after Wolfert Webber, en syn huysvr. Geertruyd Hassing; Neeltje Cornelis, h. v. Hendrick Corneliszen; and before Franciscus Bastiaensz en syn h. Barbara Emanuels; Salomon Pieters, en syn h. Marritie Anthony; Anthony Sarley, en syn huysv. Josyntie Thomas; Francois van der Koeck, en syn h. Wynthie de Vries; Cozyn Gerritszen, en syn huysv. Vrouwtje Gerrits; Jan Thomaszen, en syn huysv. Appolonia Cornelis; Pieter Janszen, en syn huysv. Marritje Jacobs; Jacob Kip, en syn huysvr. Maria de la Montagne; Maria Kip; Juffr. In his will (written in Dutch), dated 5 Aug 1694, probated 1 Jan 1700, Adrian Van Schayck, dwelling on the Island of Manhattan, mentioned wife Rebecca; children Beletie, married to Peter De Groot; Idye, married to Ibel Gootblod; Cornelia, married to Johannes Pluvier; Elizabeth, married to Garret Oncleboo; Dina, unmarried. Wits. were Paul Richards, William Bogardus, Ari Van Schayck.¹

In his will, he wrote: 29th day of January, 1736/7, I, Anthony Van Schaick, living in the County of Albany, being sick. I leave to my son Anthony £15 for his right of Primogeniture "and eldest son ship." I leave to my wife Maria all my estate, real and personal, "during her temporal life," but she shall give to my daughter, Anna Margareta Van Schaick, a suitable outfit when married, "and my wife may sell one of my negro slaves if she have necessity for it." I leave to my son Anthony, after the decease of my wife, that part of my farm, with house and orchard, barn and barracks, where I now live, "situate on the west side of Hudson river, on the Island commonly called Anthony's Island, about 9 or 10 English miles north of Albany," Beginning about 45 yards south of my house by the river, and extending north to the cross road, with 1/2 of the woodland on said Island, and the woodland on Hover Island, And all my farming implements and horses, And I value and prize this moderately at £360, which he is to pay to my children and grand children, viz., To my daughter Geritie, wife of Coenrad Ten Eyck, Catharine, wife of Samuel Coeymans, and Anna Margareta, each £72, And to the children of my son Goosen, deceased, Anthony, Catalina, and Goosen, each £24. The rest of the £360 my son Anthony is to keep. "My son Anthony shall set off in the orchard before mentioned a burying place, of about 15 feet square, and to keep the same from time to time in good fence, to keep out cattle, and which may never be sold, but always remain a burying place for mine and my wife's posterity." I leave to

my grand son, Anthony Goosen Van Schaick, the eldest son of my late son Goosen, after the death of my wife, all the rest of my farm on Anthony's Island aforesaid, beginning about 40 yards south of my house and stretching south along the river, Also a piece of land north of the cross road, Also all the land that is fit for tillage on a certain Island, called by the name of Hover Island, and 1/2 the wood land on Hover Island, and 1/2 the wood land on the great Island called Anthony's Island, "Also a certain Island lying in the Sprout, and known by the name of the Flat Plate." All these I prize moderately at £240, and he is to pay to my son Anthony £15 for his Primogeniture, and to my son Anthony and to my daughters £45 each, and to the children of my late son Goosen £15 each. "I leave to my son Goosen's youngest little son, named Goosen, a small Island lying in the Third Sprout, between Koster's Island and the Plate," Also a horse. I leave to my daughter Geritie, wife of Coenrad Ten Eyck, £150 on a bond of Sylvester Van Schaick and Anthony Van Schaick, of Albany, glaziers, And she is to pay to my son Anthony and to Catharine, wife of Samuel Coeymans, and to Anna Margareta Van Schaick, each £30, and to the children of my son Goosen £30. I leave to my daughters, Catharine and Anne Margareta, my house and lot in Albany, on the south side of Joncker street, between the house and lot of Robert Livingston on the east and the house and lot of Isaac Staats on the west, And they are to pay £310 to my daughter Catharine, my son Anthony, and the children of my son Goosen. I leave to all my children all my negro slaves, horses and cattle, sheep and hogs. I leave to my three daughters all household furniture and my wife's apparell after her decease, and to my son Anthony and to my daughters all wrought silver, and all the rest of my estate to my children and grand children. No part of my farm on Anthony's Island shall be sold to strangers. [His wife is mentioned as having an interest in a house in Holland, in company with her sisters, Elizabeth Van Corler, widow, and Johanah Van Stryghan, widow.] I make my wife and children executors. [The will is signed by Anthony and Maria Van Schaick.] Witnesses, Ryer Gerritse, Sybrant Van Schaick, Rutger Bleeker. The original was in the Dutch language, "and translated by Peter Goelet, sworn interpreter and translator of the Dutch language." Proved in Albany, before Myndert Schuyler, March 17, 1740/1.

Claes Bever was from or had lived near Houten in Utrecht. Nonetheless two of his sons, Laurens and Domenicus, lived as adults in Albany and associated with the Van Schaick family from time to time -- and further in Albany church records, their names are not infrequently spelled as Van Schaick or Van Schayk, etc The correct. [I use the word loosely] spelling for this family's name is Van Schaack and it appears to be pronounced differently.¹

According to a deposition dated 28 October 1660, Martin Cornelisz., alias "Swarte Martin," had lived in Houten as a youth and had there known Claes Bever who had lived in the same neighborhood. This person presents us with a great puzzle: apart from a Claes Gysbertsz. van Schayck, who died without children in the 16th Century, the given name Claes is absolutely not found among Van Schaycks in Houten. The given name Laurens does appear in Houten though, even in combination with Claes: in the Oudschildgeld register of 1600 for Goy and Houten, a minority appears concening Laurens Claesz. who occupied two morgen of land with a cottage on it, the premises belonging to the St. Bartolomeusgasthuis of Utrecht. Because this hospital preserved its records carefully, it appears that in 1545 the leaseholder was Claes Henricksz., who continued as such up to and through 1572. Thereafter, the leaseholder was Laurens Claesz. who was still recorded as in possession in 1600....Presuming from the foregoing that Laurens Claesz. can have had an oldest son Claes born ca.1580, then he could quite well be the grandfather of Claes Bever in New Netherland. A probable sister of Aert Lauwen was Gerrichgen Laurens Claesdr. who, as a native of Houten, married in 1611 before the civil authorities to Bernt Huybertsz. van Schayck. Further, in 1600 there was an Adriaen Laurensz., blacksmith in het Goy.²

"16 June 1640 - Cornelis Arissen van Houten, about 30 years of age, farmer, and Belitge Heynricx van Arnhem, about 30 years of age, his betrothed housewife, declare that they intend to go to New Netherland and join the colony of Kiliaen van Rensselaer, called Rensselaerswijck, under the aforesaid conditions, which they have accepted voluntarily and deliberately, committing themselves to the patron Killiaen van Rensselaer for four years, as from their arrival in that country, in accordance with the same conditions as have been accepted by Cornelis Crijnen van Houten. Signed by: Cornelys Aryaenssen, Belitge Henricx van Arnhem (mark), Gerrit Bril and J.van de Ven (notary).⁴

Record of the (1) marriage -- "16 June 1640 - Cornelis Arentss van Woerden, living in the Brouwerstraat, 30 years of age, and Belitge Heyndrix van Aernhem, living in the Jaelmerstraat?, having no parents, 28 years of age." Notation in margin of their ondertrouwakte (notice of intention to marry) mentioned they were married in the church at Sloterdijk on 1 July 1640. [Register of marriage banns Amsterdam. DTB Amsterdam 454, p.165 (from Ree Hopper)]

Beleitje Hendricks was sister to Geertje Hendrick, who m. Andries Willemsz Hopper, and also poss. sister of Annatje Hendricks (native of Bergen, Norway), who m. Jan Aertszen Vanderbilt.

10 November 1655. Cornelis Clasen Swits..perished in the last disaster..widow and children still with savage barbarians..some cattle was found and Cornelis Aertszen [Van Schaik]..authorized to dispose of said cattle for widow and children. [OM:5]⁴

Monday, 3 July 1656. Cornelis Aersen, Ide Van Vorst and their servants, defts. For that their servantmen raced on last Sunday evening after the Serman, within the City, with horses and wagons, and much noise and singing, from which great damage and disaster might have arisen. As masters of their servants, they are fined Three guilders. [RNA 2:132].⁷

19 February 1658. Cornelis Aarsen and Lambert Huybersen Mol, guardians of [Hopper] children to appear next Wednesday with inventory showing condition of estate. [OM:75].⁴

26 February 1658. Cornelis Aarsen and Lambert Huybersen Mol, guardians of [Hopper] children, agree with widow about a settlement of the paternal inheritance of her children. [OM:79].⁴

Tuesday, 17 Sept 1658. Cornelis Aarsen vs Christiaan Barentzen's widow, deft. Pltf demands payment in beavers for sale of horse. Deft has no beavers and offers to pay in seawant at beaver prices. [RNA 3:12].⁷

18 December 1658. Cornelis Aarsen and Lambert Huybersen Mol, appointed guardians of Geertje Hendricks [Hopper] children. [OM:58]. To take proper inventory of the property [OM:59].⁴

8 January 1659. Ryck Hendricksen's wife died..Cornelis Aarsen to take inventory of estate. [OM:60].⁴

7 July 1659. The Orphanmasters order their Secretary, to write to Cornelis Aarsen and Jan van der Bilt directing them not to take to themselves any goods of Jacob Coppe, dec'd., before they have proved to the Board their rights. [OM:101].⁴

2 August 1659. Cornelis Aarsen,....told that the testament made by Jacob Coppe, had been destroyed. He asked for copy of declarations. [OM:104].⁴

Tuesday, 2 Sept 1659. Raghel Van Tienhoven vs Cornelis Aarsen, pltf. Pltf demands two skepels of winter wheat, one skepel of white and one skepel of gray pease. Deft offers an ox - pltf answers, she does not know what to do with it. [RNA 3:33,146].⁷

27 September 1659. Whereas Jacob Coppe has died and there has been found among his papers and property here a testament, made 14 December 1653,...in favour of Lysbett Cornelis, daughter of Cornelis Aarsen, and Merritje Jans, daughter of Jan van der Bilt, naming both heiresses of his estate. Orphanmasters appoint administrators of estate, "so that the heiresses may come to their own". Timotheus de Gabry and Isaacq Kip, directed to make inventory. [OM:110].⁴

Thursday 13 November 1659. Cornelis Aarzen and Jan van der Bilt request permission to administer estate of Jacob Coppe dec'd. as their children are heirs to the property. Petition granted on condition of giving sufficient security. [OM:117].⁴

Thursday 29 April 1660. Cornelis Aarzen, who had requested settlement of estate, may go on....Jan van der Bilt to appear before board next Thursday and bring inventory stating what cattle, lands and other goods he has left. [OM:134].⁴

Friday 7 May 1660. Jan van der Bilt and Cornelis Aarzen, parents of the children, named as heirs of Jacob Coppe dec'd. Jan van der Bilt declares, that he undertakes to pay for his child, Merritje Jans, and for the child of Cornelis Aarsen, called Lysbet Cornelis, the sum of 700 fl. in wampum, or for each 350 fl., out of the property, left by Jacob Coppe in goods, lands and otherwise, including the charges on his farm, to-wit 30 fl., still due to Tousein Bryeel for the land; he binds as security for the payment of said 700 fl. to the Orphans Court here said farm and cattle and generally his person and property, real and personal, present and future, nothing excepted, subject to all courts and laws. [OM:136].⁴

Friday 23 May 1660. Geertje Hendricks [Hopper] and agreement made with guardians of her children, Cornelis Aarssen and Lambert Huybersen Mol on 6 March 1659. States amount she will give to her 5 children. As security, she gives mortgage on her house. [OM:138].⁴

Friday 6 August 1660. Geertje Hendricks [Hopper] again and now we add Jacob Coppe. [OM:142].⁴

Monday 9 August 1660. Same...Jan van der Bilt, and others, informed of statement made by Geertje Hendricks, are asked whether they will believe her on her word of whether she shall confirm her declaration under oath...leave it to the Orphanmasters to resolve. [OM:142-145].⁴

Wednesday 17 November 1660. Cornelis Aarzen is asked, what shall be done to collect from his wife's sister the money, due to the estate of Jacob Coppe and whether execution shall be ordered. He asks for delay until the next session, so that he may speak with Jan van der Bilt. [OM:157].⁴

Tuesday, 4 October 1661. Francois de Bruyn, vs Cornelis Aarzen, deft. Pltf demands five beavers for half and aam of French wine at the funeral of Jacob Coppe, deceased. [RNA 3:376].⁷

23 March 1662. The son of Cornelis Aarsen appearing says....after the death of his mother, father has turned the farm over to him. [OM:212].⁵

In the NYC Ref Ch record of the (2) marriage record (banns: 10 July 1662 NYC Ref Ch, they were: Cornelis Aertzen, Wedr. Van Beletje Hendricks, en Weyntje Elberts, Wede. Van Aert Willemszen.

Thursday 2 March 1662. "Weyntje Elberts, widow of Aart Willemsen, delivers an inventory of her property and requests that Burgomaster Paulus Leendersen van der Grift and Symon Jansen Romeyn be appointed guardians of her children, which is allowed and they are to make an agreement with her according to the following order: Whereas Weyntje Elberts, widow of Aart Willemsen, intends to marry again and take Cornelis Aarssen, widower of Beletje Hendrickx, as husband, and whereas said Weyntje has four minor children by said Aart Willemsen upon whom before the solemnization of her marriage she is willing to settle their paternal inheritance, so that when they come of age or marry they may have their own, therefore the Orphanmasters of this City herewith, after communication with and approbation of the widow, appoint the Hon. Paulus Leendersen van der Grift, at present Burgomaster of this City and Symon Jansen Romeyn, Burgher and inhabitant here, as guardians, who are authorized to make as guardians and administrators with the widow such an agreement on behalf of the children concerning what comes to them from their father's estate by a complete inventory and appraisal, statement of debts and credits, as justice may require, and to report the same to this Board for approval. Done etc." [OM:205,207].⁴ Also entered Holland Society Yearbook. [HSYB 1900:122].

Thursday 9 March 1662. Weyntje Elberts, widow of Aart Willemsen, "truly owes to her children Willem, Annetje, Elbert and Everts Arents the sum of 2200 fl. for their paternal inheritance, that is to say each child 550 fl., which sum she promises to pay to each child on coming of age or marrying in good, strung current wampum...." [OM:209].⁴

Thursday 23 March 1662. "The son of Cornelis Aarsen appearing says, that Willem, the orphaned son of Margriet Samuel has lived for some time at his parent' house and as his father, after the death of his mother, has turned the farm over to him, he requests the Orphanmasters to leave said Willem in his service. He is told, first to speak with Willem and then to come with him to the next session of the Board." Orphanmasters Records by Berthold Fernow [OM:212].⁴

They entered the employ of the Van Rensselaers, for service in Rensselaerwijk in New Netherlands, in June 1640. They declared intention in Amsterdam to marry, and were married 1 Jul 1640 at Sloterdijk, near Amsterdam. In the marriage intention [banns] they gave their birthplaces as Woerden (in South Holland) for Cornelis and as Arnhem (capital of Gelderland) for Beletje. In their employment papers they gave their places of residence as Houten (in Utrecht) for Cornelis and Arnhem again for Beletje. (GMNJ 41.:2-3) Cornelius and Belitje (Beeltitie) immigrated to New Amsterdam prior to 7 July 1641, when their dau. Hendrickje was baptized there (NYC Ref Ch). Since Geertje Hendricks was Beletje's sister she too probably came from Arnhem in Gelderland.

His house at Pavonia was destroyed in the Indian war of 1643. He is said to have been the ancestor of the Van Schaick and Bryant families in America.¹

Cornelis was the brother of Gerrit.²

Cornelis Aertszen [Van Schaick] had a market garden (farm) just above the NYC line. In 1658 he was appointed one of two guardians of the Hoppe children.

On November 7, 1660 - Cornelius Aarzen is asked, what shall be done to collect from his wife's sister the money, due the estate of Jacob Coppe and whether execution shall be ordered. He asks for delay until the next session, so he may speak with Jan Van der Bilt. (MO of NA Vol. I:pp.157-158) [Note: Cornelis Aarzen's wife, Belitje Hendricks, was therefore the sister of Geertje Hendricks, as prior records show it was Geertje who owed money to Jacob Coppe's estate.]

George Olin Zabriskie stated, "According to Dr. Simon Hart, Archivist of the City of Amsterdam, and an eminent authority on the records of NewNetherlands recently furnished the following information concerning Cornelis Arentsen and Beletje Hendricks. They entered the employ of the Van Rensselaers, for service in Rensselaerwijk in New Netherlands, in June 1640. They declared intention in Amsterdam to marry, and were married 1 Jul 1640 at Sloterdijk, near Amsterdam. In the marriage intention [banns] they gave their birthplaces as Woerden (in South Holland) for Cornelis and as Arnhem (capital of Gelderland) for Beletje. In their employment papers they gave their places of residence as Houten (in Utrecht) for Cornelis and Arnhem again for Beletje." (GMNJ 41.:2-3) Cornelius and Belitje (Beeltitie) immigrated to New Amsterdam prior to 7 Jul 1641, when their dau. Hendrickje was baptized there.(NY RD Ch Bap. I. p. 12)

This family took their surname from their home, the town of Scheyk, in Holland. Goosen Gerritse settled in Albany about 1637, where he was a brewer in 1649.

In 1664 he and Philip Pieterse Schuyler had permission to purchase the *Halve Maan* of the Indians to prevent "those of Connecticut" purchasing it. In 1664 he bought a lot 6 R. by 4 R. of his stepfather Reyer Elbertse.

In 1657 being about to marry his second wife, he made a contract in which he reserved from his estate 6000 guilders for his four eldest children by the first wife, that being her separate estate; and in 1668 he and his second wife made a joint will, he being about to depart for Holland.

6 Aug 1668; 12 Feb 1675/6 [In Dutch] van Schayck, Goosen Gerritsen, Commissary of Albany, and wife Annetje Lievens (married July 30, 1657). Children by first wife Geertje Brants, vizt. He owned land, in Esopus, in 1663. In 1664, bought lot from step-father, Columbia St and Broadway. 1668 - visited Holland. He bought Harmen Rutger's brewery and Exchange block, with Pieter Lansing, 1675. His widow moved to NYC, 1691, with dau Margareta. Owned Nachtenack, Indian name for later village of Waterford, Saratoga Co, NY.

In her will, she wrote: "...I, Anna Van Schayk, of New York, widow, being distempered in body, but of sound mind, on this 27 day of April, 1702, make this my last will." I leave to my son, Levinus Van Schayk, the Wey or Pasture, lying or being at Albany, next to Casper's orchard. All the rest of my estate I leave to my children and grand children hereinafter named, viz., Levinus, Geritye Droyer, Catharine, wife of Matthew Clarkson, and Margareta Van Schayk, and to my grand daughter Margaret, wife of Robert Livingston, Jr., and to the children of my daughter Anna Maria, wife of Johnes Van Cortlandt, my house and lands, to be divided equally, as my executors shall judge most effectual. I make my children, Levinus Van Schayk, Matthew Clarkson, Robert Livingston, Jr., Geritye Droyer and Margareta Van Schayk, executors. Witnesses, Peter De Reiner, Richard Stokes, Wm. Sharpe. Proved, June 30, 1702, before Lord Cornbury.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Goose Van Schaick, of Albany, "sloop master," being mindful of my mortality, I leave all my apperell to my sons Anthony and Goose Van Schaick. I leave to my wife Deborah all my share of the undivided dwelling-house and lot in Albany, and 1/3 of the saw-mill and utensils, and the land adjoining, lying in Conestigoyna; Also 1/3 of my sloop, and my share of the undivided house and lots in New York, and a negro man and woman. After my wife's decease I leave all my estate to my three children, Anthony, Catalyntie and Goose. I leave to my eldest son Anthony, £10, for his birthright. I leave to my three children all my share of the farm that my father now lives on, to the highest bidder of them, and whoever buys it shall pay to the others 1/3 of the price. "My wife shall cause my children to be well educated and put to trades, and shall give them such reasonable bedding and household goods as she thinks convenient." I make my wife Deborah and my trusty friend Henry Holland, executors. July 20, 1736. Witnesses, Cornelius Van Dyk, Richard Williams, Peter P. Schuyler. Proved, October 4, 1736.

In his will, probated 1 April, 1686, with wife Elizabeth confirmed as executor, he wrote, at Albany, 6 Aug 1683, Sybrant Van Schaick, indisposed in body but fully using his senses...He and his wife Elizabeth make the survivor of them the sole heir, to all the estate. "But the survivor is to divide among their children which they have at present, and during their wedlock by God's grace may have in the future," one half of the property. The survivor is to have the other half. The children are to be "exercised in the fear of the Lord and instructed in reading, writing and Arithmetic, and such art or trade that they in time may decently live in the world." Witnesses, Adrian Gerritsen Van Pendorp, Philip Schyler. "Done at the house of the testator at noon about 12 o'clock." Translated by P. Delanoy.

Elizabeth Van der Poel m. (2) **Bennoni Van Curlaer**.

In her will, she wrote: November 7, 1750. I, Elizabeth Van Corlaer, of Albany, widow, being aged and weak. "I leave to Sybrant Van Schaick, the eldest son of my eldest son, Goosen Van Schaick, deceased, a New Large Dutch Bible, as cost in Holland 20 or 22 Guilders, Holland money. This I allot to him for his birth right." I leave to my son, Gerrit Van Schaick, my two books, made by Wilhelmn a Brakel. I leave to my daughter Maria, widow of Johanes Glandorf, all my clothing and household stuff, and all I have, except my plate and money, and book debts, and bonds, And I also leave to my daughter, Maria Glandorf, for her faithful attendance on me, £50 extra. All the rest I leave to my children and grand children, viz., to Sybrant, Jacob, Abraham, and Deborah, wife of Johanes Beekman, being the children of my deceased son, Goosen Van Schaick, and to my sons Anthony and Gerritt, And to Sybrant, Adrian, Johanes, and Anthony Quackenboss, and their sisters,

Neghtltie and Catarina, the children of my daughter Catarina, deceased, And to my daughter Johana, wife of Nicholas Groesbeck, living at New Brunswick, And to Benjamin, Johanes, Catarina, wife of Hendrick Bulson, and Elizabeth, wife of Andries Scherp, being children of my daughter Alida, deceased, wife of Solomon Godway, And to my son Arenalt Van Corlaer, and my daughter, Maria Glandorf. £40 of my estate is in the hands of my son, Anthony Van Schaick. [Here follows a list or account between her and some of her children for money lent.] I make my sons, Sybrant and Gerrit Van Schaick, and my daughter, Maria Glandorf, executors. Witnesses, Richard Miller, James Wilson, Johanes Vanderheyden. "Translated from the Original Dutch by Jacob Goelet, sworn Translator of Dutch language." Proved, February 11, 1757.
