The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

25 April 1653 (Amsterdam notary public H. Schaef, Indenture of Ferdenande vam Sichel) -- Today, the 25 pf april 1653, so admitted Gijsbert Cornelisz Oudekerkm merchant in Nieuwnederlandt, to have engaged into his service as he does here-with, the personof Fernandus van Sichhelaer youngman who admitted, in the presence of his mother Susanna van Sichelaelaer, to have hired himself out and committed to serve the forementioned Gijsbert Cornelisz in Nieuwnedelandt and this for the time of four consecutive years, the forementioned hire to take effect when they will have arrived at the Fort Orange, during which time he shall serve his forementioned master in everything that he will commnd and order him, and this diligently and willingly and obediently and loyally, and (that he will) acquit himself alway (of his duties) as is proper and becomes an hon-

est servant. Against which he shall enjoy from his forementioned master free passage and board during the crossing, and there in the country free food and drink and lodging, washing and wringing at the house of his forementioned master and moreover he shall enjoy each year the sum of 50 Carolus guilders, to be payable at the end of each year. Committing hereto he Gijsbert Cornelisz his person and goods, of both sides without exception, in submission of all rights and judges. All this in good faith, in proof of which undersigned by both parties in Amsterdam at the day and year as written before. Gisbert Cornelisen. Ferdnande van Sichelwe. Susanna van Sichlaer as mother of the same. (Pim Nieuwenhuis wrote that Susanna, his mother, wrote the addition (Susanna van Sicklaer in her capacity of mother (and hence legal guardian) of the same (the same being Fernando himself), which was quite remarkable for the time, showing she was very literate.)<sup>3</sup>

Ferdinandus and Eva settled in Flatlands, Kings County, Long Island where their household is listed in the circa 1698 census consisting of the parents, five children and four slaves. Their children were all born on Long Island in what is now Kings Co., NY.

Ferdinandus Van Sicklen died intestate sometime before 20 April 1712 when letters of administration were granted for disposition of his estate to his son Johannes Van Sicklen (his widow Eva having refused the responsibility).

"The three sons [of Ferdinandus & Eva Van Sicklemn] played prominent parts in their time. They and their father were among the moving spirits in the establishment of a market and fair in Brooklyn. This was patterned after the jovial town-fairs of Holland, and proved a thorough success. On fair days the grounds about the market were covered with booths, tents, and Indian wigwams, the farmhouses held open hospitality, and in the afternoon and evening music and dancing gave pleasure to the young, and pipes, beer, and wine to the old. It was the first collective attempt on the part of the community to cater to the social side of life in this part of New Netherlands.... " "the rosy-cheeked girls, fresh from farms, attired in gaily-colored dresses, with heavy jewelry and voluminous linen petticoats, the stalwart young farmers in their traditional Dutch garb, soldiers, sailors..."<sup>2</sup>

Willem Van Borkulo, Eva van Siggelen, witnessed the baptism 18 Dec 1681 at Amersfoort (Flatbush Ref Ch Records) of Barend, son of Jan Barend van Driest & Jannetje Willems [Borkelo?].

I leave to my cousin (nephew) Ferdinandus, the eldest son of my eldest brother, 10 shillings for an acknowledgement. I make Ferdinandus Van Sickelen, Sr., and Ferdinandus Van Sickelen, Jr., executors. Witnesses, Lucal Voorhees, Abraham Duryee, Simon Gerritsen. (Not Proved.) Both executors resigned.
- **Antje Van Sickles**, m. (as his third wife) **Jan Willemse Bennet**. Richard McCool, in January 1998 wrote: most renditions of the family do not include this daughter and Ledley, in his long treatise on the Bennet family (NYG&B Record) develops a miscue for this marriage of Jan Willemse Bennet, stating that she probably was her sister Susanna.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Ferdinandus Van Sickelen, of the town of Gravesend, in Kings County, being very sick, knowing that it is appointed to all men once to die, do make this my last will and testament. After the pay-

ment of all debts and funeral charges, I leave to my wife, Gertruy, all my real and personal estate in Gravesend or elsewhere, during her life. After her decease I leave all my real estate in Gravesend to my sons Ferdinandus and Minnie Van Sickelen; And they are to pay to my six daughters, Eve, Renige, Elizabeth, Margaret, Annie, and Janette, £300 in annual payments. I leave to my eight children all my goods, chattels, and rights in Gravesend. My eldest son Ferdinandus is to have £5 before any division. I make my two sons executors. My son Minnie is to have "as good a setting-out of my estate as his brother has had." Dated June 25, 1737. Witnesses, James Hubbard, I. Gerritsen. Proved before Richard Stillwell, Esq., May 2, 1744.
