The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Isaac Van Vleck came to America with his parents prior to 1658 from Bremen, Province of Hanover.

In the (2) marriage record they were: Isaac Van Vleck, Wedr. Van Pieternellitje Couwenhoven, en Cornelia Beekman, j. d. Van N. Orangien, beyde wonende alhier.

In the (3) marriage record, they were: Isaac Van Vleck, Wedr. Van Cornelia Beekman, en Catalyntje de Lanoy, j.d. Van N. Yorck, beyde woonende alhier.

His 2nd and 3rd wives were baptized on the same day NYC Ref Ch.

Isaac Van Vleck signed, in Bergen, the Oath of Allegiance to England, 22 Nov 1665.<sup>2</sup>

In New York, Isaac Van Vleck owned and conducted a Brewery, which was located on the west side of Broad Street, on the site of the present No. 22; this he left to his son Abraham. He was a Captain in the King's Colonial Army for some time and was present at the time the Church at Fordham was seized.

He was an Alderman in New York, where he lived. He was a fur trader, and between the years 1674-76 he spent time in Albany dealing in beaver skins.<sup>2</sup>

In his will, he wrote: Isaac Van Vlecq. In the name of God, Amen. Know all men by these presents that I, ~~James~~ [corrected to Isaac in printed abstracts] Van Vlecq, of New York, brewer, make this my last will. "All of my wife's clothes of linnen, woolen, and the gold and silver belonging to her body shall not be inventoried, much less appraised, and shall be counted for her own goods without any contradictions." I leave to my daughter Hester "a gold chain five double," and a new Testament tipped with silver, and £25 in consideration of her mother Petronella's portion. I leave to my daughter Magdalena two pairs of gold pendants with crystals, and a gold bodkin, and a gold ring, and a New Testament tipped with silver, and all of the clothes of her mother Cornelia, now in being, and £17 10 shillings in money. Leaves to his son Abraham a large still kettle, and other things connected with brewery. My wife Cattaline is to remain in possession, and the children are forbidden to "say or do anything against their mother, all being left to her discretion, and she is to bring them up as a pious mother ought to do, and when they are married they shall be set out according to the condition of the estate." After the death of his wife the whole to go to his children, Hester, Magdalena, Cornelia, Maria, and Abraham. Makes Johanes Van Cowenhowen, Cornelius Pluvier, and Wm. Beekman, or his son Henry Beekman, and my brothers-in-law Abraham and Peter DeLanoy tutors and overseers. Dated January 18, 1688. Proved before Governor Benjamin Fletcher in New York, April 15, 1695.

Inventory of estate of Isaac Van Vlecq, brewer, appraised by Johanes Kip, Teunis DeKay, and Paul Richards, April 16, 1695: One dwelling house, kitchen and brewhouse with ground, I550; one small house and ground according to Patent, I105; 1,006 Scheppels of barley at 2s., I106 17 9; 327 pounds of Hops at 6d., I8, 3, 6; 14 barrels of double beer, I9. Total amount, I1,053. [NOTE.--The house and brewery of Isaac Van Vlecq was on the west side of Broad street, the present number 22.]

All the rest I leave to Lucas Kierstede, and Catharine, wife of Leonard Warner, the children of my sister, Mary Kierstede, late Mary Groenendyck, deceased, and to Isaac, Catalina, Samuel, and Albert Ryckman, children of my sister, Cornelia Ryckman, deceased, and to the other children of said Abraham and Mary Van Vleck, viz., The children of John Van Vleck, deceased, viz., John, Abraham, Catharine, Jacobus, Henry, Mary, and Cornelia Van Vleck, and to the children of Isaac Van Vleck and his wife Catharine, viz., Abraham, Isaac, and Lucretia. I make John Van Vleck, Lucas Kierstede, Isaac Ryckman, and Henry Van Vleck, executors. Dated February 6, 1762. Witnesses, William Pearson, James Arden, Jarvis Roebuck. Proved, February 9, 1768.

Isaac Van Vleck served as a provate in the 7th Regiment, Albany Co., Militia.

He moved about 1792 from Kinderhook, NY west to settle in Salt Point, which afterwards became Salina, and today is a part of Syracuse, NY. This land was probably bounty land granted him for his service in the Revolution.

His first wife and child stayed in Amsterdam when he came to America; later he was charged with bigamy after he married Annetje/Jannetje Van Dyck.

In 1702 he was at Kinderhook, NY but moved to New Jersey and Pennsylvania. In 1710 he organized 3 churches -- one at Bensalem and Sameny (Neshaminy), and another at Whitemarsh, both located in Bucks County, PA; and a third at Six Mile Run on the Raritan River in NJ.

Some time after his marriage to Annatje Van Dyck, rumors began to circulate that he had a wife in Holland. After some delay, this was confirmed and by 1715 he had disappeared from the scene and reportedly had left the country.

Tielman Van Vleck was a descendant of a noble family whose estate, called "Vlieck," was located near the city of Maas-tricht in the Province of Limburg. The Tielman Van Vleck of Bergen [NJ] fame, according to court records of the city of Amsterdam, dated February 23, 1635, is described as being twenty-one years old, and the only child of Tielman Van Vleck and Maria Moors. He married Magdalena Herlin of Bremen, in the church of St. Augustine. Eight children blessed their union. On June 3, 1656, he was enrolled as a shopkeeper of Bremen.<sup>1</sup>

The date of his arrival in this country is not obtainable, but it is supposed that he came over on the ship *De Vergulde Bever* (The Gilded Beater), which sailed from Amsterdam May 15, 1658, and arrived at New Amsterdam in July. On July 29, he was licensed as a Notary of New Netherland. On December 16, 1658, he purchased from Mighiel Paulissen, the ancestor of the Vandervoort family, a house and lot on the north side of the Hooge (High) Street, later Stone Street, near what is now Hanover Square. Two petitions drawn up by him and headed by his name were presented to Governor Stuyvesant in 1660, for the establishment of the Village of Bergen but were denied because of the fear of Indian attacks. The third paper, drawn up by Van Vleck and urged in person by Michael Jansen Vreeland, the New Jersey representative in the Council, was agreed to upon promise of having the village surrounded by a strong palisade. Van Vleck was named 4 Aug 1661 as sheriff<sup>2</sup> and as the first "Schout," or President, of the court of Bergen. On May 25, 1668, Van Vleck appeared before the Magistrates of the Village of Bergen and declared that he had deeded to Ide Cornelissen, a resident of Harsimus, a parcel of land lying between those of Hendrick Jansen van Ostrum and Adrian van Laer. Governor Philip Carteret in 1670 gave him a deed to a plot of upland and meadow between Jan Lubbertsen, Frederick Phillips, Harman Edwards and Thomas Fredericks, facing on the "Common," the present Van Vorst Square. This would locate Van Vleck as a resident of Paulus Hook.<sup>1</sup>

Tielman van Vleek was elected first Schout of Bergen 4 Aug 1661 and thereafter held other offices at Bergen. He was the first lawyer and the first judge in NJ.<sup>4</sup>
