The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Van Wagenen/Van Wagoner

According to Winfield, the family derives its name from *Wageningen*, an ancient town near the Rhine, about ten miles west of Arnheim, in Gelderland. From this town came Gerrit Gerritsen, with his wife, Annetje Hermansse, and child Gerrit, then two years old. They arrived at New Amsterdam 23 Dec 1660 in the ship *Faith*. Soon after his arrival he settled in Communipaw, Hudson County, N.J.

Some of the descendants took the surname **Van Wagenen**, while others retained the patronymic Gerritse/Gerretsen/ Garrison.

Another Van Wagenen family in this country is descended from **Aert Jacobsen**, who arrived about 1648 and settled in Bethlehem, NY and later in Esopus.

VAN WAGENEN

Wageningen is one of the prominent towns of Holland, located on the banks of the River Rhine, in the Province of Gelderland, and is noted as a summer resort. The family in this country has descended from two distinct pioneers, so far as we know in no way related. The first was Aert Jacobsen, who came over about 1648 and settled in Bethlehem, New York, and later in Esopus. The Van Wagenens of that section are his descendants. Gerrit Gerritsen, of Bergen fame, arrived in New Amsterdam with his wife Annetje Hermans, December 23, 1660, and settled in Communipaw. He soon took a leading part in public affairs. He brought with him a certificate which reads as follows: "We, Burgomasters, schepens, and counsellors of the city of

Wageningen, declare by these presents that there appeared before us Hendrick Elissen and Jordiz Speer, citizens of this city, at the request of Gerrit Gerritsen and AnnetJe Hermans, his wife. "They have testified and certified as they do by these presents that they have good knowledge of the above-named Gerritsen and Annetje Hermans, his wife, as to their life and conversation, and that they have always been considered and esteemed as pious and honest people, and that no complaint of any evil or disorderly conduct has ever reached their ears; on the contrary, they have always led quiet, pious and honest lives as it becomes pious and honest persons. They especially testify, that they govern their family well, and bring up their children in the fear of God and in all modesty and respectability. AS the above-named persons have resolved to remove and proceed to New Netherland, in order to find greater convenience, they give this attestation, grounded on their knowledge of them, having known them intimately and having been in continual intercourse with them for many years, living in the same neighborhood. "In testimony of the truth, we, the burgomasters, of the city, have caused the private seal of the city to be hereto affixed. "Done at Wageningen, 27th of November, 1660. "By the ordinance of the same, J. AQUELIN.

Aert Jacobsen [Van Wagenen] came to America about 1650, with his wife Annetje Gerrits and at least three children, and first settled in New Albany. The family came from Wageningen, which is situated on the Rhine River, in the Province of Gilderland, 10 miles west of Arnheim and only a short distance from the Province of Utrecht, Holland.¹

Aert Jacobsen was in Albany by May 21, 1653 when Aert Jacobsen, Rutgar Jacobsen, Teunis Jacobsen and Evert Pels took the oath of allegiance to the Patroon at Albany.¹

On Sept. 17, 1660 Aert Jacobsen purchased land from Johanna De Laet, wife of Jeronimus Ebbinck, lying in the Esopus in New Netherlands, adjoining on the N. E. side of the land of Jan Schoon and Aert Pieteroe Tack, on the N. W. side, Tjerck Claessen (De Witt) S. W. the hill containing 47 morgens and 215 rods. It is known as New Lot No. 29 where he lived. On Nov. 12th, 1661, Aert Jacob's (Jacobsen) land of 47 morgens was assessed for 117.10 guilders, (about \$47.00) which was to help pay the cost of erecting the first parsonage at Wildwyck. He was classed among those having a "double" farm Oct. 23, 1663. On March 31, 1664, he was one of the fifteen signers of the first election returns ever held in the Dutch colony at Esopus and one of the five who actually signed his name.¹

He was nominated for schepens 1662 and again in 1664. In 1665, he was Corporal of the local Militia, also Examiner of Fences in 1665 and died in 1666, leaving a widow Annetje Gerrits and at least two sons Gerrit and Jacob, as the following instrument proves.¹

Aert Jacobsen left his property to his five children, by a will which was never recorded, as there are on record at Kingston five quit-claims deeds executed by his children to each other, all dated Nov. 6, 1710, as follows: "Whereas, Aert Jacobsen, late of Kingston, aforesaid, by his last will and testament, give and bequeath his whole estate to his five children, the above named Jacob Aertsen, Grietje Elmendorf, Elizabeth Masten, Neeltje Aertsen and Gerrit Aertsen of Kingston aforesaid, and whereas they have divided their said Father's farm, or Bowery situate in the limits and bounds of the Corporation of Kingston, on the north side of the Esopus Creek or Kill, in the great piece, and Lot No. 1 is by said division fallen to said Gerrit Aertsen. Now know ye that the said Jacob Aertsen, Grietje Elmendorf, Cornelius Masten and Elizabeth his wife, and Aert Tynhout for divers good and valid considerations, them thereunto moving, but more especially for avoiding and putting aside all strife and differences that might arise about said farm have given, granted, etc. and signed by all five.¹

Evert Jacobsz Van Wagenen removed to Dutchess County about 1712. In 1714 the population of Dutchess County was 447, and Evert Van Wagenen was among the few Freeholders and appears on the first tax list of this same year, at which time he was dwelling in Poughkeepsie Precinct, where he owned a large tract of land, situate on the southerly side of the now (1920) City of Poughkeepsie and some distance beyond; about 60 acres was in the city limits.

In 1729 he sold to Jan (John) Conklin and Jan Boeckhout 770 acres in this very section including the now city portion of sixty odd acres.

Evert was elected Collector of the Middle Ward in 1717/18 and 1718/19. Assessor 1720/21, and 1721/22. He was Collector and Constable 1723/24 and Surveyor of the King's Highways 1724/25.

Gerrit Gerritsen was a native of Wageningen, an ancient town near the Rhine River, and about ten miles west of Arnheim in Gelderland, Holland. Wagenen stood on marshy ground, was walled, and was a place of considerable strength during the Thirty Years War.

Gerrit Gerritsen, with his wife, Annetje Hermansse, and child Gerrit, then two years old. They arrived at New Amsterdam 23 Dec 1660 in the ship *Faith*, Jan Bestevaer (Bestwaer), captain (the fare for the three was 90 florins — the equivalent of about \$36 at that time). Their daughter, Catrintje must have also been with them, but it appears she was omitted from the passenger list.

Soon after Their arrival they settled in Communipaw, in what is now Hudson County, N.J. On 16 Oct 1662 Director General Petrus Stuyvesant appointed him one of three schepens (Magistrate or alderman with magisteral and judicial powers) for Bergen. That same year Gerritse was one of the petitioners for the settlement of a clergyman at Bergen, and pledged to contribute 6 florins yearly toward his support.

On 12 May 1668 he bought of Philip Carteret, eight parcels of land (totaling over 60 acres) in the town of Bergen He lived in what is now the Communipaw section of Jersey City, NJ (then Bergen County, now Hudson County) at the time of his death in October 1696.

Some of the children of Gerrit Gerritse took the name of *Van Wagenen* and others kept the patronymic name *Gerritsen*, which became *Garretson*.

Jacob Aertse removed to Esopus, Ulster Co., with his parents about and married Sara Pels, whose parents formerly lived at New Amsterdam where she was born. After his marriage, they lived at Wagendale, now named Creek Locks, Ulster Co., N. Y.

I leave to my wife Hester the use of my Old Farm, being 208 acres, during her being my widow. And if she should happen to marry again, then the whole estate to be divided among children, and my wife is to have a child's portion. I leave to my eldest son, Evert Van Wagenen, the piece of land, with the appurtenances, which I had of the heirs of Jan De Graft, February 13, 1767, being 606 acres, lying in Charlotte Precinct, and which I value at £200. I leave to my son John 100 acres of land in Charlotte Precinct, which I bought of my brother, Gerritt Van Wagenen, and which I value at £200. I have already paid to my brother £100, and my son John is to pay the rest. I leave to my son Nicholas 1/2 of the farm I now live on. The whole being 208 acres, which I value at £225. In the (1) m. record, they are "Pieter Gerritse, y.m., b. Hoboke, l. Pemmerpoch, Bergen Co., East N.J., and Vroutie Hesselse, y.d., b. Bergen, E. N.J., l. Acquiggenonck." In the (2) marriage record he was a widower of Acquackanonk and she was a j.d. of Acquackanonk.

He bought, about 1719 or 1720, from Daniel Danielson, land and a house at what is now Fair Lawn (then Slooterdam). The house is thought to have been built by 1708 (old wing). The house exists today, standing on Garretson Farm on River Road in Fair Lawn; it is owned (in 1998) by the County of Bergen and operated as an historic site.

Peter bought a large tract of land on the Passaic River at Slooterdam, where he probably built a house, mentioned in a deed of 1708.

Some of the Garretsen family adopted the surname Van Wagoner, to denote their place of origin, but Peter's descendants on this property retained the patronymic Garretsen.

In the New Paltz tax list of 1765 Petrus is assessed £8 10s. Petrus lived to the extraordinary age of 92 years. He was by trade a stone mason. His name appears as one of the enlisted men in the Third Ulster County Regiment in the Revolutionary war.
