The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In his will, he wrote: 16 November, 1710. I, Evert Vandewater, of New York, merchant. I leave to my eldest daughter Katharine, a gold chain, value £18. Also my large House Bible and a New Testament with silver clasps. To my daughter Aneke, a gold chain of the same value, and a New Testament with silver clasps. It is my will that my two daughters shall be carefully educated, and brought up with good learning, and when married to have a handsome outfitting of household goods. I leave to Benjamin, son of Jacobus Vandewater, 5 shillings, in full of all pretence of being heir at law. Mentions "my sister Hendrica, wife of Anthony Rutgers." I make my wife Katharine, and my brothers in law, Anthony Rutgers, Mr. Provoost and Abraham Van Horne, executors, and they have power to sell real estate. Witnesses, John Tiebout, Martin Cregier. Proved, August 31, 1714.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage banns, they were: "Hendrick Van de Water, young man from Amsterdam, and Margariet Van der Meulen, young woman from Rotterdam."

This Van de Water family is separate and distinct from the one established in this country by Benjamin Van de Water & Elizabeth Meerman. (De Boer confused the two families.)

Hendrick's father, Jan Hendricks van de Water, skipper of Minuit's ship founding the New Sweden Colony, perished off the West Indies in the hurricane of June 1638. His widow, Ariaentje Jans, m. (2) 1641 Amsterdam, **Govert Loockermans**. Soon after, Loockermans, his wife Ariaentje and her son Hendrick Van de Water, set sail for New Amsterdams, and en route (near the West Indies), she gave birth to a daughter, Maria Loockermans (Marritje), b. 3 Nov 1641 at sea. They arrived in New Amsterdam 29 Nov 1641. Hendrick grew up with step-siblings, Maria Loockermans (m. Oct 1664 Balthazar Bayard); Jannetje Loockermans, bp. 27 Sep 1643 (m. Feb 1667 Hans Kierstede Jr.); and Jacob Loockermans, bp. 17 Mar 1652, and later settled in Maryland.

As a teenager, he lived in New Amsterdam with his aunt and her husband, Jacob Wolfertsen Van Couwenhoven, their son and four daughters.

Hendrick was a brewer, a mariner and skipper, and an agent for shippers.

3 Oct 1662 -- Fiscal Nicasius de Sille appears in Court with Jan van Cleef and Titus Cyre stating, that they bought Jacob van Couwenhoven's horse mill and that Titus Cyre sold his share to Jan van Cleef, who sold it to Albert Albertsen Lintwever [Terhune]; on which aforesaid horse mill he paid and disbursed above his just third part the sum of two hundred and ten guilders, and that he and Albert Albersen again sold the mill, as they bought it, according to agreement therefor, to Jacobus Backer, Govert Loockermans, Jacques Cosseau, and Hendrick van de Water, and that the aforesaid Albert Albertsen has given an assignment of four hundred guilders on the abovenamed van de Water, which remarking a fearing, that he should not get his own, he directed the Court Messenger to attach the money, which being done requests the attachment to be declared valid, until it shall be found to whom the most is belonging. The Worsh. Court declares the attachment valid.²

17, October, 1675. This day did Allexander Glynn for a valuable consideration &c Bargaine, sell, alienate, transport and make over unto Hendrick Vandewater a Certaine house and land thereunto belonging and appertaining lyeing & being in the Smiths Valey, betweene the house of Cornelius Clopper, Smith and Abraham Lambertson Moll, as it now lyeth in and between the fence of the before mentioned neighbours. To have and to hold to the said Hendrik Vandewater his heyres and assignes to the only propper use and behoofe of him the said Hendrick Vandewater his heyres and assignes. IN WITNESS and confirmation whereof the said Allexander Glynn hath sett his hand and seale to ye Principle instrument or conveyance and delivered the same to ye said Hendrick Vandewater in Presents of us Was signed and sealed by Allexander Glynn. Wit: Jacob Lokerman, Ludovicus Cobes, John Sharpe.³ On the same day, "Allexander Glinn of Schonectide conveyed to Hendrick Vandewater of New York, marriner, a Certaine Lott of ground or parcell of Land, lyeing and being in the Towne of Gravesend, on the West End of Long Island, Commonly called or known by the name of the Nine and Thirtieth Lott."¹

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Margaret Vandewater, of New York, widow, being in good health. I leave to my two daughters all my wearing apparel of linen and woollen, belonging to my body. I leave to my son Johanes a mourning suit. I give, devise, and bequeath all my lands and tenements and real estate to my sons, Johanes, William, and my son-in-law, Teunis Tiebout, and my daughter Aryantie, the widow of William Bennett, who are to divide the estate into six parts. One part to Hendrick Cornelius and Petronella, the children of my deceased son, Albertus Vandewater; one part to my son William; one part to my daughter, Aryantie Bennett; one part to my daughter Maria, wife of Teunis Tiebout; one part to the children of my daughter Elizabeth, late wife of Johanes Poinsellse, viz., Hendrick, Johanes, Margaret, and Wyntie, Whereas, I have a mortgage given to me by my son-in-law, Johanes Poinsellse, for £55, on a house and lot in New York, bounded west by William street, south by Teunis De Kay, north by Hellike Clapper, and east by Geesie Vandercliff, I give the same to his children. I appoint my sons and my son-in-law, Teunis Tiebout, and my daughter, Aryantie Bennett, executors. Dated April 9, 1724. Witnesses, Gerrit De Grove, Peter Brested, Abraham Gouverneur. Proved, March 5, 172 4/5. [NOTE.--A large part of the estate of Margaret Vandewater was a tract through which Vandewater street in New York now runs. This was one third of a large tract extending west to Ferry street and owned by her and Theophilus Ellsworth and Cornelius Clopper.--W. S. P.]

ORDINANCE Of the Governor-General and Council of New Netherland directing the demolishing and removal of certain Buildings in New Orange, and providing payment for the same. Passed 16 October, 1673. [N. Y. Col. MSS.XXIII. 119.] Preamble WHEREAS Fort Willem Hendrick and the city of New Orange, situate on Manhatans Island, is seriously incumbered and weakened by the houses, gardens and orchards which lie so close under its walls and bulwarks, that it is impossible to defend it properly when occasion requires, against its enemies, unless at least some of those houses, lots and orchards be demolished and removed. It is therefore considered necessary by the Governor General, by and with the previous advice of his Council, to demolish, pull down, and remove the undernamed houses, gardens and orchards, and the owners thereof are hereby most strictly ordered and commanded instantly to commence demolishing and pulling down their houses, gardens and orchards, and to remove them to such lots as are laid out within this City by the Governor's order to that end, and shall be shown to each of them by the Burgomasters, on pain of depriving those who shall be found contumacious or negligent, of the indemnity, which, according to the terms of this publication, are granted and allowed to the following persons or those among them who shall come to remove their undernamed houses, gardens and orchards, and, over and above, on the first arrival of some ships, of having their houses demolished or burned, to wit: The houses, gardens and orchards of Peter de Riemer, Lodewyck Post, George Cobbet, Jan Dircksen Meyer, Jacobus van de Water, Symon Blanck, Andries Meyer, Gerrit Hendricx, Peter Jansen Slott, situate under the walls and bulwarks of Fort Willem Hendrick. Gerrit Jansen Boos, Peter Stoutenburgh, Henry Taylor, The Lutheran congregation, Willem van Vredenburgh, Peter Jansen Miesier, Martin Meyer Smith, Augustine Hermans, Lysbet Tyssen, Peter Harnsen, situate under the fortification and bulwarks of the city of New Orange. Johannis van Brugh, Sara van Borsim. But whereas said houses cannot be removed except at great and heavy expense to the proprietors, to whom, in return, indemnification and satisfaction ought, in equity, be allowed, because said removal is done for the public benefit and better defense; it is therefore resolved, that the grounds and lots belonging to said persons, with the necessary expense which they shall happen to incur in the removal of their houses, shall be valued by impartial persons, and to the proprietors instead of these lots shall be shown and conveyed, subject to like valuation, any other lots within this city, to which they will be at liberty to remove, and whatever their canceled lots and the expenses of removing their houses, will be found to exceed in value what shall be shown them instead, shall be promptly made good, fulfilled and paid to them from the extra Duty which, for that purpose, it is resolved and ordered to collect from now henceforth, until said indemnity and damage shall be promptly paid to said persons, and no longer, to wit: From all Beavers and peltries which will be exported from this government to Patria or elsewhere after the publication hereof, two and one-half per cent."
