The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Teunis Cornelise Van Der Poel who was in Beverwyck 1660-1687.

In 1671 he was one of the magistrates of Albany. He lived in what is now Watervliet.

Teunis Van der Poel made his will 17 June 1687, in which he mentioned his wife, to whom he left a house in Amsterdam, Holland, which she devised to her three daughters: ...17 June, 1687, in the 3d year of our Gracious Sovereign, James the Second. I, Anthony Cornelis Van der Poel, dwelling at Watervliet in the manor of Rensselaer wyck, in the County of Albany, yeoman, being in health. I make void all former wills, and especially that will made by me and my wife, dated May 12, 1669. My will is that my wife, Catrina Janse Croon, shall remain in full possession of all my estate, for life. After her decease all estate, real and personal, to my three daughters Elizabeth, wife of Benony Van Corlaer; Mary, wife of Anthony Van Schaick; and Johana Anthonesse, wife of Barent Lewis. I appoint my son in law Anthony Van Schaick, Levinus Van Schaick, one of the Aldermen of Albany, and John Lansing, tutors of my children.¹

Catrina, widow of Teunis Van der Poel, made a will 11 Dec 1694, in which she refers to the will of her late husband Anthony Cornelis Van der Poel and to their three children. Teunis Van der Poel owned half of "Constapel's Island opposite Paerde Hoeck." -- ...11 December, 1694. I, Catrina Janse Croon, dwelling in Albany, being in health. I make my sole and universal heirs my three children, Elizabeth, wife of Benony Van Corlaer; Mary, wife of Anthony Van Schaick; and Johana Anthonesse Van der Poel, wife of James Van Stragden. In accordance with the will of my deceased husband Anthony Cornelisse Van der Poel. And after my decease, Johan Abeel and my three children are to be administrators. Witnesses, Dirck Wessells, Evert Bancker, Robert Livingston, Jr. Proved before Governor Robert Hunter, July 6, 1710.¹

Melchert Wynants Van der Poel lived in Albany. His house and that of his father fronted the Fort in 1675, probably on the south side of State Street.

In her will, she wrote: February 2, 1719/20. Elizabeth Van Der Poel, widow, of the city of Albany. Leaves legacy to daughter Ariantie, and to Margaret, wife of Volckert Dowe, "my great looking glass which was my mother's." Also legacies to daughters Maria, wife of Johanen Ninhagen [Vinhagen]; Magdalene, wife of Abraham Lansing. "My daughter Margaret is to have the house in Albany, between the house of William Haagens, and Philip De Forest." Legacy to daughter Helena, wife of Jan Barents Wemp [Jan Barentsen]. [Mentions Ariaantie.] I make Oliver Teller and Hermanus Wendall, executors. Witnesses, Stephen Groesbeck, Jacob Beekman, Rutger Bleecker. Proved, January 5, 172 5/6, and Letters of administration granted to Volckert Dowe, son in law. [in brackets are Fernow's, where they differ from Pelletreau's abstract]

He was in Albany as early as 1657. He lived in Albany until about 1694. In 1674 he purchased a half interest in a sawmill on the east bank of the Hudson River, on what is now called Wynant's Kill. This property he purchased of Gertruy Pieterse, widow of Abraham Vosburgh. He made two wills, the first in 1694, the second in 1695. The latter was endorsed "The Will of Wynant Gerritse Van der Poel, late of Albany, now of New York," and dated 29 Feb 1695, probated 17 April 1702. By his last will be bequeathed to his son Melgert only six shillings and gave the rest of his estate to his son-in-law William

Van den Burgh.
