The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Vanderhoff

An immigrant ancestor was probably Johannes Vanderhoff (or Vander Horen; he came to America from Horen, a village in Gelderland, Holland, and first settled at Bedford, L.I.; later Albany).

Other immigrants include Gysbert Cornelise [Vanderhoff]. Possibly they were sons of Cornelis Vanderhoff and Geertje Van Fulpen; Cornelis died in Holland, and his widow came with her six children from Beest, Gelderland, Netherlands, on the ship "Beaver" arriving in New Amsterdam, New Netherland, on 9 May 1661. The children's ages were listed on the ship's roster as 21, 19, 17, 15, 13, and 10 years.

"The miller Vanderhoff" lived in a cave at the entrance to Youghpaugh Valley and operated the first grist mill in the area.

The Central Bureau of Genealogy in The Hague has a register of church members of Beesd [in Gelderland] 1644-1687. This register showed that on 23 May 1656 Geurtgen Cornelis, widow of Cornelis Gijsbertsen, became a member of the Dutch Reformed Church in Beesd (see attachment). And on 6 Oct 1659 Jantgen Cornelis, daughter of Cornelis Gijsbertsen, also became a church member.²

The Regional Archive of West-Betuwe in Geldermalsen, has the registers of deeds of the court of aldermen of Beesd and Rhenoy 1634-1661. These registers mentioned Cornelis Gijsbertsen as an alderman of Beesd in the years 1637, 1639-1640, 1642-1648 and 1650-1651. They also contain several deeds showing that Cornelis Gijsbertsen bought and sold property in Beesd during the 1643-1651 period. His full name was mentioned in two deeds of 1651 as Cornelis Gijsbertsen van der Hoeven and that his wife was called Guertgen Cornelis van Velpen.²

Evidence from the Court of Gelderland Archives shows that Cornelius Gijsbertsen [Van Der Hoeven] and Huych Berntsen, both schepenen of Beesd, together witnessed and sealed civil documents in 1641 and 1643. The same two men sat together in the aldermen's court of Beesd and Aquoij on several occasions in the 1640's and 50's.⁴

In 1644 a man called Cornelis Gijsbersen van Hagenstyen bought a house and yard in Beesd on the north side of the Steenstraat. Later on, in 1651 Cornelis Gijsbertsen van der Hoeven sold a house and yard in Beesd at the Oosteind. Evidently the Oosteind was situated on the north side of the Steenstraat, and so the events of 1644 and 1651 could very well concern the same house. [Terry's note: If this were true, Cornelis Gijsbersen van Hagenstyen and Cornelis Gijsbertsen van der Hoeven could be the same person and it is possible that Cornelis Gijsbertsen van der Hoeven was called "van Hagestyen" because he (or his ancestors) came from the nearby village of Hagestein.]²

See deeds concerning Cornelis Gijsbertsen van der Hoeven at Beesd, listed below.

Geertje came to America with 6 children in 1661 after the death of her husband Cornelis. She came to New Amsterdam, New Netherland, New York, arriving on the ship "Beaver" on May 9, 1661. Her children were ages 10, 13, 15, 17, 19, and 21 at that time. They settled in Breukelen (Brooklyn), New Netherland, in the Bedford section, where her son Cornelis is listed as magistrate in 1673. By 1673, the family used the surname Van Der Hoeven.¹

Geertje moved to Albany, where she remarried to a Mr. **Steven Janszen Conyn** in 1675, but they became estranged shortly thereafter and parted amicably. She resumed using Van Der Hoeven as her name.¹

In her will, as Geertje Van Fulpen, dated 5 Dec 1684, she named four children, Guysbert and Cornelis having preceeded her in death. She stated in the will that her two daughters were living with her in her house "situate opposite the island occupied by Mr. Marte Gertzen."¹

22 August 1643 -- Metgen Hanricks, widow of Willem Dircksen, her daughter Sygjen Willems; Dirck and Anthonis Willemsen, brothers; and Jan ter Berch, husband of Hanricksken Willems, transfer to Cornelis Gijsbertsen 4 morgen of land, situated in Beesd, in the Boscaly. (Judicial archive of Beesd and Rhenoy, no. 200, fol. 36vso, Court of aldermen, register of deeds)²

9 May 1644 -- Jacob Jacobsen and Gerrit Jacobsen, wheelmakers in Beesd, transfer to Cornelis Gijsbersen van Hagenstyen a house and yard, situated in Beesd, on the north side of the Steenstraat (adjacent above Cornelis Wielmsen and below Sijgen Wielms). (Judicial archive of Beesd and Rhenoy, no. 200, fol. 49, Court of aldermen, register of deeds)²

30 June 1647 -- Gijsbert Jansen Vos transfers to Cornelis Gijsbertsen 1 morgen of land, situated in Beesd, at the Frederiksakker. (Judicial archive of Beesd and Rhenoy, no. 200, fol. 94vso, Court of aldermen, register of deeds)²

10 April 1651 -- Cornelis Gijsbertsen van der Hoeven, husband of Guertgen Cornelis van Velpen, and Gerrit Cornelissen van Velpen, together transfer to Jan Aertsen Spaen their share in 4 morgen of meadow-land, situated in Beesd, in the Nijland. (Judicial archive of Beesd and Rhenoy, no. 201, fol. 49, Court of aldermen, register of deeds)²

25 September 1651 -- Cornelis Gijsbertsen van der Hoeven transfers to Dirck Anthonissen Castelijn a house and yard, situated in Beesd, at the Oosteind (adjacent above Cornelis Willemsen Schipper and below Evert Ceelis). (Judicial archive of Beesd and Rhenoy, no. 201, fol. 68, Court of aldermen, register of deeds) [Terry's note: It is very possible that the Cornelius was the same Cornelius Wilemsen mentioned in the earlier deed]²

Cornelius was perhaps son of Cornelius Vanderhoff (or Vander Horen who came to America from Horen, a village in Gelderland, Holland, and first settled at Bedford, L.I.; later Albany).

In the m. record they are "Cornelis Van der Hoef, y.m. b. Albany, and Elisabeth Ackermans, y.m., b. Hackensack, both living here."

Cornelius was listed as a debtor in the estate of John McDowell, physician, Hackensack. He made his own will on Jan 16, 1742, but was it was not probated until May 28 1765.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...9th day of August, 1773. I, Cornelius Vanderhoof, of the outward of the City of New York, farmer, being weak in body. My executors are empowered to sell my estate and the monies arising are to be put at interest for the use of the legatees hereafter named. I leave to my loving wife Elizabeth, all the profits of my estate during her widowhood in bar of her right of dower To my eight children, to wit: John, Abraham, Matthew, Leah, Cornelius, Henry, Catharine and Isaac all the remainder of my estate equally divided, except the sum of ten shillings which I do give to my eldest son, John, to be paid him before the division. If any die before twenty-one without lawful issue the share of such shall go to the survivors. I order that my estate be divided within six months of the death or marriage of my wife, and if any of my children then are in their nonage, the share of such to be put out at interest. All my children shall be maintained out of the mean profits of my estate during their minority or till they marry, but if the mean profits are insufficient my executors may take so much from the principal as will support them in a common ordinary way. I make Elizabeth, my wife, and my brother-in-law, Henry Brevoort, executors. Witnesses, Henry Brevoort, John Brevoort, both of New York City, wheelrights; G. Furman. Proved, New York, September 28, 1784. The same day administration granted to Lewis Andrew Gautier, innholder, and Henry Brevoort, wheel-right, both of the City of New York, executors of the will of Elizabeth Vanderhoof, the widow and surviving executrix of the will of Cornelius Vanderhoof, deceased. Whereas the said Elizabeth Vanderhoof deceased before the Probate of the said will.

I, Elizabeth Van Der Hoof, of the Out Ward of the City of New York, widow, on the sixth day of August, 1782, make this will. Whereas I and Henry Brevoort, deceased, were appointed executors of the will of Cornelius Van der Hoof, my lawful husband, deceased, made the ninth day of August, 1773; and now as the sole trust in me lies to act for my children in non-age; and for preventing waste and wrong to be done; and I being weak in body; order that whatever power I had in said will, Messrs. Henry Brevoort, Matthew Buyce, and Louis Andrew Gautier (all of the Out Ward of the City of New York), to act in my stead as executors after my decease, and proceed as my will directs. This present writing to be annexed to the will and testament of my husband. Witnesses, John Ryckman, of the City of New York, brick-maker, and Elizabeth, his wife; James

Lounsberry. Proved, November 18, 1782.

Cornelius was possibly born on Staten Island where his parents then lived. He is probably the Cornelius Vanderhoff who served as a Private in Capt. Fleming's Company, 2nd Regiment, Essex County (N.J.) State Troops, and also as a Private in the 2nd Bn., 2nd Establishment, J.J. Continental Line in the Revolution. Various D.A. R. Lineages (87:24, 104,287) trace to him, but erroneously give his birth as 1745, which was that of his elder brother who obviously died young. In the Census of 1790, West Ward, New York City, there are listed two families of this name, each with one son under 16, wife, and one daughter in the first and two daughters in the second. One Holland Society lineage states that, according to tradition, Cornelius, who is said to have drowned in New York harbor, was buried in Trinity Church, New York, where baptismal records of his two youngest children are to be found, but the New York Dutch Church lists his burial as being there on 22 Apr 1793.¹

A note in the typescript of the Ponds Ref Chyd Gravestones says "He was the miller at Van Aulen's."

It is this Cornelius Vanderhoof who is said to have purchased, on 1 Aug 1783 (Bergen Deed D:221) from the heirs of Hendrick Van Alen, land "lying and being in the County of Bergen, beginning at the Southermost corner of Garret Van Alen's land, thence south fifty two, west twenty eight chains, five links to the corner of John Van Alens land thence south, twenty nine, west sixteen chains to the corner of John Van Houtens land, thence south forty five west four chains twenty five links to south west side of the Pond Brook till it comes to the Van Houten line, all along on the south west side of said Brook as it runs being reduced to a straight line, forty seven chains fifty links thence eleven, forty five chains west two chains forty seven chains [links] to the west side of the River then up the same on the same side as it Runs till it comes to Garret Van Alens line. etc., being Reduced to a straight line forty nine chains, thence south fifty three east forty nine chains to the place of beginning, containing 221 acres and 3/4th. Including four acres of great meadow which the said Hendrick Van Alen deceased hath heretofore to wit in his life time conveyed to his son John Van Alen etc."¹

Another deed (D:224) dated 2 Aug 1783 given by the heirs of Hendrick Van Alen quit claims and releases the land to Cornelius Vanderhoof: "Indenture between John H. Van Alen, Garret Van Alen, Hessel Van Alen, heirs of their brother, Dr. Andrew Van Alen of the first part to Cornelius Vanderhoof of the second part. Whereas Hendrick Van Alen late (etc.) did by his last will and Testament order that Six weeks after his decease his Real Estate to wit his Plantation with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging and houses, etc. be disposed of at a Publick Sale by the Ececutors of his last Will and the Purchase money to be divided among John H. Van Alen, Garret Van Alen, Hessel Van Alen, Elizabeth Maria the wife of the said

Cornelius VanDerhoff and the heirs of the said Doctor Andrew Van Alen, etc.”¹

During the Revolution, Vanderhoof the miller, while watching his dam during a freshet, discovered that the log jail in what is today Oakland was on fire and gave the alarm.

In his will (recorded Trenton, Liber 31:248) dated 19 January 1788, probated 21 April 1788, Cornelius Vanderhoof of Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ mentioned wife Elizabeth, uncle Hessel Vanallen, daughters Ann, Rachel, Elizabeth, and Jaine. Executors were Giles Mead, James S. Bogert and Peter Ward. Witnesses were Abraham Manning, Uzel Meeker, Harmanus Van Huysen.¹

Johannes Vanderhoff came to America from Horen, a village in Gelderland, Holland, and first settled at Bedford, L.I. He

then moved to Albany. They lived at Kinderhook, NY, and later near Bergen, NJ.

Jan (John) founded the most numerous branch of the family. He left Albany for New York City, but finally settled in Bergen County, in northern New Jersey. From there, the family spread into both Morris and Essex Counties, while one line returned at the time of the Revolution to upper New York State. He is first listed as a member of the Dutch church in Albany in 1683. On Oct 14, 1693, he was appointed Constable of Albany for 1 year. In 1694, he was listed as in arrears in his taxes, and the same year he sued for payment for shoes delivered, which indicates he was probably a shoemaker. Between the time he was Constable, and before the baptism of his son Hendrick, he had moved to Bergen County, New Jersey.¹

Lawrence moved from Hackensack to New York City, where he and his wife are listed as members of the Dutch Church on 17 Feb 1766. He made his will on Sept 6 1775, and probably died shortly after. His wife probably preceded him in death, since she is not mentioned in the will.¹

Louwrens Van der Hoeff and Ahnietje Ellen, z. huis v., witnessed the baptism 18 Jan 1758 NYC Ref Ch, of Lodewyk, son of Lodewyk Williams and Rebecca de La meeter.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Larence Vanderhof, of the City and County of New York Car, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life. My debts to be discharged out of my personal estate. I leave to my son Larrence £5, to be paid out of my personal estate. To my said son Lawrence £10, to be paid out of my estate before any division be made. To my son John £10 paid before any division be made. All my real and personal estate in New York and elsewhere shall be equally divided among all my children, namely: Mary, wife of Stephen Allen; Caterin, wife of Thomas Outwater, deceased; Elizabeth, wife of John West; Lawrence, John, Jain Vanderhof, Angenitia Vanderhof and Sarah Vanderhof, "shair and shair alyck." It is my will that my dear and loving wife Angenietia shall remain in full possession of my real and personal estate for life or while my "wedue," and I give her full power, lawful "atoraty" to sell any of my estate as she shall "tink" fit for the maintenance of the family during her unmarried life. I make my wife Executrix and my trusty friends, Abraham P. Lott and Peter Cortenius, my Executors. (Signed) Lawrence Vanderhoff, his mark. Dated September 6, 1775. Witnesses, Cornelius Vanderoef, John Vanderhoef, John Outwater (of Bergen County, N. J., yeoman). Proved, December 15, 1785. Administration granted to Angenitia Vanderhoff.

Martin and Margaret made their home near Rochester NY around 1810 and their family moved progressively through Michigan to Wisconsin by the early 1900's. A Martin Vanderhoof was recorded in the 1810 Federal Census in Phelps, Ontario Co., NY (along with many other families from Northern NJ; probably there was a general migration to that area after 1800 when the land was sold in parcels by the Holland Land Co.). Martin Vanderhoof was listed in Penfield, Monroe Co., NY in 1820 Federal Census. In the period 1840-45, all five Vanderhoof children and their partners/children set off for Michigan and settled in Branch and Kent counties. (Terry wrote: My great-grandfather, David N. Vanderhoof was born in Rockford, near Grand Rapids in 1849.)
