The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Cornelius Vanderveer sailed in the ship *Otter*, leaving in February, 1659. His name and occupation on the West India Company's Passenger List appeared as Cornelis Jansz Van der Veer, Farmer. He settled in Flatbush, where, on the 24th of February, 1677-8, he purchased of Jan Jansz a farm.

Cornelius Janse Vande Veer (as he signed his name) came from Alkmaar, Holland, in Feb., 1659, in the ship "Otter," and settled at Flatbush, L. I., where he became a magistrate; m. Tryntje de Mandeville. Sons were Cornelis, Jan, Dominicus, and perhaps Jacobus and Michael. The Somerset line descends from Dominicus, and chiefly from his son, Jacobus.²

On 13 Jun 1661 Cornelius was one of six persons who petitioned Gov Stuyvesant for a patent of land, who authorized a survey. In Feb 1678 he purchased a farm in Flatbush for about 2600 guilders or \$1274 current US dollars. In 1683 The Assesment Roll of Midwout lists him as having 100 acres. This land became known as the 26th and 32nd ward of Brooklyn and was owned by his descendants until 1906. He and his son-in-law Daniel Polhemus, erected a grist mill on Fresh Kill in Flatbush, later known as Vanderveer Mills, which came into the hands of his son Dominicus, and later his grandson Cornelius.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Cornelius Van Der Veer, of Flatbush, Kings County, yeoman, being in perfect health of body and of sound mind. All my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid. I leave to the children of my son John, deceased, viz: Garret, John, Peter, Hendrick, Jannitie, and Beletie, the bonds and money lent, I have of their father. My son Cornelius shall have my silver Tanker. Unto my grandchildren above named, one fourth of my estate; my son Cornelius, one fourth; my son Peter, one fourth; and my daughter Catrina, deceased, her children, Ejda, Jannetie, and Abigail, one fourth

part. I make my loving brother, John Vander Veer, Engelbort Lott, Jacob Leffertze, and my son, Cornelius Van Der Veer, all of Flat Bush, executors. Dated June 7, 1775. Witnesses, Jacob Suydam, yeoman, Petrus Heegeman, weaver, Hendrick H. Suydam. Proved, April 8, 1782.

Also a bedstead and feather bed, with all pillows and cur-tains, now standing in my Great Chamber. Also my great cupboard as now standing in my new Chambers. I leave to my two sons, John and Abraham, all my wearing apparell. I leave to my wife and to my children, John, Abraham, and Helena, all my estate, real and personal, each 1/4. My executors are to sell all estate as soon as they think profitable. I make Jeromus Van der Veer, of New Lots, and Peter Lott, of Flatbush, executors. Dated, February 14, 1765. Witnesses, Adrian Hegeman, Barent An-driese, weaver, Peter Van Steenbergh, school master. Proved, April 18, 1771.

Jacob van der Veer came from Manhattan to the Delaware before 1661 with his Swedish wife, Catharina Johansdotter. He

was first stationed at Fort Altena (former Fort Christina). After his discharge he moved to New Amstel before going to the Brandywine. By 1671 he had 4 sons, William, Cornelius, Johan, and Jacob van der Veer. The father died in the winter of 1698-1699, survived by his four sons and several daughters.¹

In 1660, he was a Sergeant stationed at Ft Altena, previously known as the Swedish fort Ft Christina, located in what is now known as the Wilmington, Delaware area. During that year he requested that he be discharged so that he might return to The Netherlands. However, on 8 April 1661, Gov Stuyvesant granted him a lot located near Ft Altena. In 1684, Jacob was awarded another land grant near the Brandywine Village settlement (Wilmington, Del). Later he acquired a land patent to an island and the family ran a ferry from this area for some years. In 1683, Cornelius and Jacob, assuming this to be the brothers and Jacob's sons, took the Oath of Allegiance to the English Crown.

19 March 1685 -- "Grant to Jacob Vandever of right to use the water of Brandywine Creek, before his own land, for the service of the grist mill he is about to build." (New Castle Co., DE Deeds, Book B, Vol. 1, p. 51)²

15 April 1698 -- Will of Jacop Van der Veer...mentioned "...Fourthly. John V'D'Veer shall have nothing to doe with the Orchard upon the Island, so long as my wife shall live, but after her decease shall it be his." (New Castle Co., DE Wills, Book B, p. 51-2)²

About 1759 Jacobus Van Derveer donated land for the "Old" Cemetery in Bedminster, Somerset Co., NJ, where the Ref Dutch Church formerly stood. The first burial there was that of his wife, Phebe.

Jacob Vanderveer of Bedminster, Somerset County, New Jersey left a (13-page) will dated 2 October 1772 and a codicil dated 9 February 1774; proved 17 February 1777. To the Elders and Deacons of the Low Dutch churches at Raritan, Readington, Sourland and New Shaneck (Neshanic), he left £25 "for the use of the poor of their several societies." He also left to one congregation £200 "to be passed out on interest" [loaned out to members of the congregation with interest due]. To the Dutch congregation at "Cannowago" [Conewago] he left £20. To the Low Dutch congregation in New Virgine [Berkeley County, Virginia] "if there should be one erected near Mecklenburg," he left one acre to build a church on. To his grandson Jacob, son of his deceased son Joseph, he left a house and lot "which I bought of Thomas Thornburg [Thornborough, Thornbrough, Thornburgh]; also 100 acres near Severengus Ferry [Swearingen's Ferry] on the Potomac River in Maryland "which I bought of David Shepherd in Frederick Co." To his granddaughter Femetye, daughter of his deceased son Joseph, he left a lot in Mecklenburg, Virginia [later Shepherdstown, Berkeley County, Virginia] which he purchased from Chaplin; also 60 acres in Frederick County, Maryland, on the Potomac River, part of the lot purchased from David Shepherd [the tract known as "Pell Mell"]. To his son Lourens [Lawrence] he left the 430-acre plantation "where he now lives." To his son Jacobus he left 560 acres of land "over the river" [probably across the Potomac in Maryland]. To his son Elias he left 435 acres being "the plantation I now live on, bounded on the north by Peter Perne, on the south by Jacob Offs." To his daughter Femetye he left "all the lands on the north side of the road," being about 70 acres; also £300 which I lent to her husband, Jacob VanDoren "for which I have his bonds which I order to be given up to the said VanDoren immediately after my decease absolutely discharged of both pricipal and interest." To his grandson Jacob, son of his daughter Femetye, he left land on the north side of the road that he purchased from James Parker and others, when he is age 21, "and he shall pay to his sisters, Femetye, £75; Aeltye, £75; and Elizabeth, £75. To his sons Jacobus and Elias he left woodland that he bought from a man named Sterling. To Jacob, son of his deceased son Joseph, he left £800. To Femetye, daughter of his deceased son Joseph, he left £400. To his son Lawrens he left 300 acres in Virginia, part of the tract he bought from Alexander Lemen [Lemon, see 20 September 1771 deed]. To his daughter Femetye he left 97 acres in Virginia, originally purchased from Jacob VanMeter, adjoining the Lemen land; also 66 acres of the Lemen lot. To his son Jacob, 319 acres in Virginia which he originally purchased from Prudence "Harbour" [Thornborough, Thornbrough, Thornburgh]. To his son Elias he let "the 2 tracts of Edward and Robert Lucas, where I have lived some time and one of William Morgan, all 3 joining; also a lot I bought of Woefer, of 330 acres." To Catherina, widow of his son Joseph, he left a negro wench. Executors were his friends Gisbert Sutven, John Voorhees, and his sons, Lourens [Lawrence] and Jacobus. Witnesses were Isaac VanAursdauln [VanArsdalen], Matthew Lane and Marcus King. The codicil dated 9 February 1774 was witnessed by Matthew Lane, Derick Lane and Johannes Pouelson. On 17 February 1777 Derrick Sutphen and Johannes Pouelson made an inventory of the estate of Jacob Vanderveer and valued it at £3,890-8-8.¹

Maryn Adriaenz van der Veere contracted with Patroon Kiliaen Van Rensselaer on 12 Jan 1631 to conduct a tobacco plantation at Rensselaerswyck, for a period of three years. He had been in America previously, and mention is made of a son "bpon before in that country." He sailed for America in *de Eendracht* shortly after 7 July 1731, with his wife Lysbet Thyssen, a child, and 4 or 5 assistants. He located on the north side of Fort Orange (Albany), and in July 1632 was appointed one of the schepens and councilors of Rensselaerswyck. By 19 Feb 1639, Maryn moved his family to New Amsterdam, acquiring from Claes Cornelissen Swits a house and plantation on the North River. He was one of the "12 Men" selected by Kieft on 29 Aug 1641 to aid in the direction of the affairs of the colony.

Under direction of Director Kieft, he and Abraham Planck led a party to retaliate for the murder by Indians of Claes Cornelissen Swits, and attacked a party of Indians, killing many and taking a number of prisoners. Later Kieft attempted to foist blame for this action on Maryn Adriaense, and he was returned to Holland to stand trial, despite the protests of many of the burghers who wanted him pardoned. His sentence was apparently not severe, for he returned to New Amsterdam and on 9 May 1647 received a patent of land called Awickaken on the west side of the North River, bounded on the north by Hoboken Kill.

His widow, Lysbet Tyssen, m. (2) 3 May 1654 (banns 16 April 1654 NYC Ref Ch) **Geerlief Michielsen** (Gerlach Michielszen Van Collumer Zyll). In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage banns, they were: Gerlack Michielszen Van Collumer Zyll, em Lysbeth Thyssens, Wede. Van Maryn Ariaenszen.
