The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

On 13 December 1724, Derick and Catharina Van Seil, yeoman, of Saddle River, Bergen County, conveyed to Abraham Varick, gentleman, of New Barbadoes, Bergen County, for £24, 8 acres, east side of Passaic River; formerly sold to Andrew and Thomas Fredericksen who sold in 1717 to David Lawrence Ackerman who sold to said Van Seil; line of Thomas Juriansen and Warner Burger. Signed Derick Van Seil (his mark), Catharina Van Seil (her mark). Witnessed by David Provoost, Herman Shinnsmann, Thomas Van Buskirk.¹

On 11 Jan 1726, John & Aertje Wright, of New Barbadoes, Bergen County, New Jersey, conveyed to Abraham Varick of the same, a tract of land for £80, joining Jacob Brinkerhoff...on north by Henry Brass...on southwest by Henry Major.¹

On 11 January 1734 (recorded 5 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:153) Jurian Westervelt of New Barbadoes, yeoman, and Corneliah, his wife, conveyed to Abraham Varick of the same place, for £165, 15-1/2 [or 1,500-1/2] acres English measure, part of a large tract formerly belonging to Major John Berry in the precinct of New Barbadoes Neck; NW of Court House; mentioned common road; Hendrick Van Gieser; land formerly of Abraham Ackerman but now of his son Lawrence Ackerman;

Van dien's, Conradus Bush; Col. Provoost. Signed by Jurian Westervelt (his mark), Cornelia Westervelt (her mark). Witnessed by David Demarest, Jacobus Blinkerhof.⁴

On 8 May 1751 (recorded 5 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:157) Guiliam Varick of the City of New York, gunsmith, conveyed to John Varick of Hackensack, boatman, for £230, 15-1/2 acres English measure, whereas our father, Abraham Varick, deceased, by his Last Will and Testament dated 21 February 1739, bequeathed to his son, the said Guiliam Varick, parcel at Hackensack on the W side of the Common Road adjoining Hendrick Van Giesen, parcel bounded N by Hendrick Van Giesen; W by Lawrence Ackerman; S part by Van dien and part by Conradus Buss; E by Col. Provoost and part by Common Road. Signed by Guiliam Varick. Witnessed by Hendrick Bongart, Stephen Terhune.⁴

On 23 May 1764 (recorded 5 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:159) Guiliam Varick of the City of New York, gunsmith; Jacob Zabriskie of New Barbadoes precinct, cordwainer, and Sarah, his wife; Peter Zabriskie of the same place, merchant, and Martina, his wife; Teunis Jerolamon of Second River in the County of Essex, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to John Varick of New Barbadoes Precinct, for £64, 16 shillings, a certain parcel in New Barbadoes Township, which the parties of the first part, by Last Will and Testament of Abraham Varick, deceased, dated 21 February 1739, were directed to dispose of premises, being part of the estate of said Abraham Varick, which fell to share of Jacobus Varick, who deceased before he arrived of age. Signed by Guiliam Varick, Jacob Zabriskie, Sarah Zabriskie, Peter Zabriskie, Martyntje Zabriskie, Teunis Joraleman, Mary Joralemon. Witnessed by James Van Buren, D. Isaac Browne.⁴

On 14 May 1766, Ryck Lydecker and his mother Neeltie Lydecker of Hackensack, conveyed to Abraham Varick, for £48, 2 acres near Hackensack River. Signed Ryck Lydecker, Neeltie Lydecker. Witnessed by Richard Edsall (his mark), Thomas Van Boskerk.²

Abraham Varick's Last Will & Testament was dated 21 February 1739. The will was cited in an Indenture from John Varick and Jane his wife, to John Varick, Jr., Physician, dated 1 March 1785 (recorded Bergen County Deeds, X:173): Indenture quotes will of Abraham Varick, dated 25 February 1739, in which he mentioned wife Anna Varick, and devised "to Eldest son John Varick a parcel near the Dutch Church in New Barbadoes, beginning at house lot of my son Jacobus Varick and his three daughters: Sarah Varick, Matyntie Varick, and Mary Varick, annual payments of £30 each...to son Jacobus Varick one house lot near the Church being part of that land where I do live upon at present...[more of will is cited].

On 18 April 1804 (recorded 22 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:200) Anthony Dey of the City of New York, Attorney and Counsellor at Law, and Catharine, his wife, conveyed to Abraham Varick of the same place, for \$1, land and meadow in the Township of Bergen at Powles' Hook, bounded E by Hudson River; N by said River or the Bay called Horsimus; S by Communipaw Bay; W in line of flagg staffe on Ellis Island. Mentioned were: chimney of house of Stephen Vreeland; Right of Ferry. As conveyed by Cornelius Van Voorst to said Anthony Dey 26 March 1803. Signed by Anth^y Dey, Catharine Dey. Witnessed by James Kent, Robert Benson.¹

On 19 April 1804 (recorded 22 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:204) Abraham Varick of the City of New York, Merchant, conveyed to Richard Varick, Jacob Radcliff and Anthony Dey of the City of New York, for \$1, parcels at Powles Hook, blocks or squares No. V and No. VI, each of which contains 32 lots. Signed Abraham Varick. Witnessed by James Kent, Robt. Benson.¹

On 20 April 1804 (recorded 22 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:208) Abraham Varick of the City of New York, Merchant, conveyed to Richard Varick, Jacob Radcliff and Anthony Dey of the City of New York, for \$1, land in the Township of Bergen at Powles Hook [excepting tract in previously cited deed, S:204]. Signed by Abraham Varick. Witnessed by James Kent, Robt. Benson.¹

In his will, he wrote: I, Andrew Van Varck, of New York, hatter, being sick. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to James Van Varck all my clothing and wearing apparell, "in bar of anything he may claim as being my eldest son and heir at law." I leave to my wife Effie the full possession of all my estate so long as she remains my widow, and all that I may be entitled to by my late father's will, for her support and for the maintainance and education of my children. My executors may sell estate if they deem best. If my wife marries, she is to have my kitchen furniture and 1/4 of household goods. "My new negro Pompey is to be sold." All the rest of my estate, after the death or marriage of my wife, to my children, James, Effie, and Dinah, "the one not more than the other." I make my wife Effie, and my son James, and my friends, Anthony Ten Eyck and Guillian Varick, executors. July 26, 1760. Witnesses, Peter Van Duersen, tallow chandler, Cornelius Clopper, Jr., baker, Thomas Hildreth. Proved, August 29, 1762.

In her will dated 23 Aug 1794, probated 9 March 1795, Anna Apple, of New York, widow of John Apple, baker, deceased, mentioned legacy from her father, Jacobus Varick, late of New York and Hackensack, NJ; mentioned cousin John Varick of Hackensack; mentioned legacy of land in New York and Bergen County which she had held by devise of her father, Jacobus Varick, or brother John Varick, which she had sold to kinsmen Abraham and Richard Varick; nieces Effe Stout, widow of John B. He was a merchant in NYC. They later lived at Hackensack, Bergen Co., NJ.

In his will, he wrote: ...July 1, 1736, in the 10 year of King George II. I, Jacobus Varick, of the city of New York and of Hackensack, New Jersey, merchant, being in good health. All my debts due in right and conscience, to be paid. I make my wife, Anna Mary, executor, and my sons, John, Andries, and Derrick, as assistants. If my wife die, or intend or complete a second marriage, then my sons are to be executors, and they are to make a complete inventory of my estate. My wife is to have the use of all estate during widowhood. If she marries she shall have one negro slave and 1/2 of the movable estate to dispose of. I leave to my eldest son John all that my land which I have bought of Joost De Groot, on Hackensack river, as by deed will appear, with all the appurtenances, "except the Great Kopper Kettle and all the goods, merchandizes, and wares in the house and houses upon the Wharf." My son John is to gather in all debts due to me, on my shop and warehouse, and the £20 which I have paid for my son John's land called the Point, we bought of Anthony Lizier, joining east to my land, and I give him the said £20 for his trouble in collecting debts. "If he shall be obliged to go to law with some of the debtors, my other sons are to help him." All the remainder of my estate I leave to all my children, John, Andries, Derrick, Anna, and Sarah, and all my estate in New York and New Jersey. Witnesses, David Demarest, Sr., Johannes Van Voorhees, Jacob Van Saen, Jr. Proved, May 14, 1751.

To my daughter Cornelia, wife of Thomas Jeffries, "a negro woman and her child, and my large Looking Glass, and large table, and chest of drawers, which are a part of the furniture of my house, situate upon the wharfe in New York;" To my daughter Mary, a negro woman and child, and the best of my feather beds, and my cupboard, and things therein. I leave to my son, Jacobus Varick, all my house and ground on the south side of a certain street, called Dock street, between the house and ground of the widow Frans Goderus, and the house and ground of Frans Gerbrantse, and he is to pay to my executors £150, to be divided among my children, Jacobus, Abraham, Cornelia, and Mary. I leave to my son, Abraham Varick, my house and ground on the wharf, between the house and ground of Wessell Wessells, and the house and ground of Frans Goderus; and he is to pay to my daughters £200. I leave to my daughter Margareta, wife of Peter Stoutenburgh, during her life, all the house and lot on the west side of Broad street, between the house of Thomas Noxon and the house in tenure of John Brestede. Out of the rents of said house there shall be paid to my sister Engeltie Visboome £ yearly. After the death of my daughter Margareta, the house is to go to my children. I also leave to my daughter Margareta £100, out of the monies "due me from sundry persons, living at Hackinsack, in East New Jersey." I leave to my daughter Mary, my house and land in the Precinct of New Barbadoes, in Bergen County, New Jersey; on the west side of Hackinsack river, "on the corner of a certain place called the Polle Vly," and all the shop goods and merchandise and live stock. I leave to my son Abraham all my right and title to a piece of land at Hackinsack, between the house of my son Abraham, and the house at present in possession of the Dutch minister. And he is to give to my grand-daughter, Catharine Magdalene, what in his liberality he may think fit. I leave all the rest of my estate to my children, and make them executors. Witnesses, Peter Van Durson, Helena Mecphedryx, Simon Johnson. Proved, May 12, 1736. Cornelia, wife of Thomas Jeffries, was then dead.

Signed by John Stevens, Rach' Stevens. Witnessed by Daniel Van Reipen, Geo. Duryee.¹

On 11 March 1805 (recorded 19 June 1805, Bergen Co. V:195) John Stevens of Hoboken, Esquire, and Rachel, his wife, conveyed to John Van Varick of the City of New York, Baker, for \$1,510, lots 18, 19, 20 at Hoboken, bounded S in front, by Front Street between Washington Street and Bloomfield Street; E by Washington Street; in rear by lot no.24; W by lot no. 21. 150 feet on each side; 75 feet front and rear (25 feet each lot). Signed by John Stevens, Rach' Stevens. Witnessed by Daniel Van Reipen, Geo. Duryee.¹

On 14 March 1805 (recorded 19 June 1805, Bergen Co. V:182) John Van Varick of the City of New York, Baker, and Catharine, his wife, conveyed to Thomas Parcell of the City of New York, coach maker, for \$4,000, four contiguous lots known as nos. 18, 19, 20, 21, with a house and stables thereon, in the Town of Hoboken, bounded S in front, on Front Street; E by Washington Street; N by lot no. 24; W by lot no. 22. Richard Varick was a Colonel in the Revolution, and was confidential secretary to George Washington, 1781-1799. He served as Mayor of New York City, and was a founder and president of the American Bible Society at the time of his death. He was a lawyer. A portrait of him is in the Museum of the City of New York. Varick Street in New York City was named for hi, (runs through his former property). They had no known or surviving issue.

[Richard Varick was a] Revolutionary War Continental Army Officer, New York City Mayor. Served in the Revolutionary War as private secretary and Aide-de-Camp to George Washington from 1781 to 1783. Prior to that, he was an aide to Benedict Arnold at the time when Arnold tried to turn over West Point to the British. Colonel Varick was falsely rumored to be involved in the scheme, and was for a time an ostracized member of the Army until Washington exonerated him and made him his aide. S:208) Abraham Varick of the City of New York, Merchant, conveyed to Richard Varick, Jacob Radcliff and Anthony Dey of the City of New York, for \$1, land in the Township of Bergen at Powles Hook [excepting tract in previously cited deed, S:204]. Signed by Abraham Varick. Witnessed by James Kent, Robt. Benson.¹

He was probably the brother of Jan Varick. He came from Holland about 1685, in which year he succeeded the Rev. Casparus Van Zuren as minister of the Long Island churches. He lived in Flatbush. He occasionally ministered to the churches at Bergen and Hackensack.

His will was dated 20 Oct 1686, probated 9 Nov 1694. In it he calls himself Rev. Domine Rudolphus Van Varick, Minister of the Reformed Dutch Congregation on Long Island. He alludes to his children, but mentions by name only his wife, Margarita Visboom.

Her will was dated 20 Oct 1695, with codicil 15 Nov 1695, was probated 2 Jan 1696. In it, she names her daughters Joanna and Cornelia, and a deceased dau. Cornelia Hesther (?); sons Marinus and Rudolphus; her sister Engeltje; her niece Maritie (Maria), wife of Nicholas Tienhoven. In the event of the deaths of all of her children, she bequeaths to her sister Sarah, the wife of John Varick; and her niece Maritie, all her property equally. In the codicil she adds the name of her *eldest* sister, Engeltje Visboom, to whom, with her sister Sarah and *cousin* Maria, she gives in case of death of all her children, to each one third of her estate. Appoints Col. Nicholas Bayard, Lieut. Col. Charles Lodwyck, and Mr. Jan Harbendinck, executors.

V., "17 pieces silver playthings and toys," Gold ring with 3 small diamonds (and many other small articles of silver and gold), "A large picture of images Sheep and Goats that hung over the Chimney," Large Picture of Dr. Rudolphus Van Varicks, Cash £120.18, "one Great Dutch Casse, which could not be removed from Flatbush and so not appraised. Sold for £25." 1/6 of the Sloop "Flying Fish," sold to Nicholas Renhaven for £60. "A parcel of Printed books, most of them in High German and forrain Languages, and so of little value here, wherefore they are packed up to be kept for the use of the children when of age." Long list of debts due from people in all parts of Kings County. The Inventory includes a very long list of articles of luxury as well as of use, and indicate very extensive means for those days.
