The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

He bought part of Pauw's tract of land at or in the vicinity of Jersey City, where he established a flourishing farm and, by sales of land to others, a thriving agricultural settlement. In 1641 he was selected one of the Council of 'Twelve Men,' the first attempt at anything like representative government in the Colony. Schuyler, in his History of New York (Vol. I, p. 292), says that Abraham Isaacs Verplanck had a farm at Paulus Hook (Jersey City) and another on the Delaware of 200 acres, and a lot in Smith's Valley, in New York City, on which he lived.<sup>2</sup>

David Ver Planck lived on Beeren Island.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, David Ver Planck, of Beeren Island, in the Manor of Rensselaerwyck, being of perfect health this March 13, 1762. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my eldest son, David, "one of my best negroes, to be his own choice, in right of his being my eldest son, thereby excluding him from any further claim." I leave to my daughter Ariantie all that my lot of ground, being in the First Ward in Albany, on the Plain, Bounded north by the street, south by a Lane, east by Johannes Oostrand, west by heirs of Jan Lansing, being 30 feet wide. I leave to my four children, David, Johannes, Ariantie, and Isaac, all the rest of my estate, real and personal, except my farm at Pightwey. My will is that my old possession by, and near, the river, where I now live, with the mills and creek, shall never be alienated or disposed of, but shall always remain to my children, or such of them as it shall be allotted to. My farm at Pightwey to be sold by my executors, and the money used to pay debts, and the rest to my children. I make my cousin, Philip Ver Planck, of the Manor of Cortlandt, John R. Bleecker, John Beekman, and Isaac Ver Planck, of Albany, executors. Witnesses, William Fryer, baker, Peter Jones, cooper, Isaac Fryer, weaver. Proved, April 27, 1763.

In the NYC Ref Ch marriage banns record, they were: Galeyn Ver Plancken, j.m. Van N. Yorke, en Hendrickje Wessels, j.d. Van Arnhem in Geldert.

He was a merchant in New Amsterdam. He was a Schepen 1673-4.

Gulian first apprenticed with stepfather Allard Anthony, merchant, second husband of Henrica Wessels. He treated Gulian poorly. He then worked for Peter Cornelise vander Veen, also a merchant at New Amsterdam, who was to become prosperous. Gulian commenced business for himself about 1661, and became a prominent trader, trading with Holland, the West Indies and England. His warehouse and residence were on the Strand, now Pearl St, between Whitehall and Broad Sts. He was a Schepen and Alderman, North Ward, 1677-79, 83. He was an Ensign in the Garrison when the Dutch briefly re-captured NYC, later 1st Lt, Capt. He also lived at Albany. He was taxed at 5000 Guilders, in Feb 1674, for repair of the fort. In 1664, he was sued by Geertruyt Wyngaart, for breach of promise, saying that he had seduced her and carnal conversation with her and that she was pregnant with child by him, that he should marry her or pay for the "defloration" 600 guilders in beavers as well as child support.

16 Sep 1664 -- Gelein Verplanck entering states, that he satisfied and paid for the house and lot of Francois de Bruyn sold by execution and bought by hum, requesting deed thereof. Burgomasters and Schepens promise to have a deed made out.<sup>1</sup>

17 Jan 1671 -- Samuel Edsall in right of Janneken his Wife, Warnar Wessel Junior, Gelyn Verplanck in right of Hendrickje his Wife, and the aforementioned on the behalf of Harmen Wessells now residing in Holland, all Brothers and Sisters of Harmen Wessells lately deceased, plths. contra Gerrit Huygen and Geertie Rutgers late Widdow of the forenamed Harmen Wessells, defts. The Court having viewed and examined the Testament of the sd. Harmen Wessells and Geertie Rutgers, and heard the debates btwixt both parties, do decree and order that the Defts. according to the Tennour of the sd. Will, shall pay to the plths. fl. 505. Hollands Monney & to deliver to the plths. Copsy of ye Inventory produced in Court, as alsoo a Copsy of the debt booke mentioned in the sd. Inventory, and to pay the Charges of Court Equally betwixt them.<sup>2</sup>

The will of Gulian Ver Planck: the 10th of March, 1684, before Gabriel Minvielle, mayor, the last will of Gulian Ver Planck was proved, and Henrica Wessels his wife was made executrix, the same is confirmed, March 29, 1685. Gulian Ver Planck, New York. In the Name of God, Amen. Know all men who shall see this present Public Instrument, that on the 22d day of April, 1684, before me, Wm. Bogardus, Notary Public, admitted by the Rt. Hon. Thomas Dongan, appeared Mr. Gulian Ver Planck, alderman, and Mrs. Hendrica Wessels conjoined in matrimony, known to me and to the witnesses. The Testator being sick abed. The survivor of the two is to have full possession of the estate without being obliged to give any account, but the survivor is not to wrong the children but rather to be their support. If the survivor should remarry, then one half of the estate is to go to the children, viz. Samuel, Abraham, and Anna. After the death of both, the whole is to go to the children, but the property is to be managed till the youngest is of age. Witnesses, Stephen Van Cortlandt, Francis Rumbout and Peter Delany. At a Court of Record held on Tuesday the 10 of March, 1684, before Mr. Gabriel Minvielle, Mayor, the original will of Gulian Ver Planck was produced, with a translation and proved . . . and the widow, Hendrica Wessels, was confirmed as executor.

In his will, dated 5 July 1750, New York City, Gulian Verplanck, merchant, mentioned To mother, Aryaentie Warmstal, widow, £60 yearly. Sister, Anne Verplanck, £30 yearly. Wife, Mary, furniture, slaves, etc., and an annuity of £200, and the rent of my house in Wall Street, where I live, till my son is 23, and, if he die, then till my eldest daughter is 21. Son, Samuel, farm in Dutches County called Mount Gulian, but if he die before 21, then to my daughter Aryaentie Verplanck. I am entitled to part of a large tract of land in the Counties of Albany and Ulster, which was granted by Patent to Johannes Hardenbergh and Company, and by a division there was released to me my portion; part of which I give to my son Samuel, part to my daughter Anne Verplank, part to daughter Mary Verplanck, and part to daughter Aryaentie Verplanck. Should there be another child born, it is provided for. Executors--Wife, Mary, Gabriel Ludlow, Robert Crommeline and Charles Crommeline. Wittenesses--Thomas Duncan, David Vanhorne, Samuel Van Horne. Proved April 9, 1752. Lib. F, p. 35.

Philip Ver Planck was Sheriff of Albany Co. in 1722. He was a member of the Provincial Assembly as the representative of the Cortlandt Manor 1734-68. Through his wife he came into possession of that part of the Cortlandt Manor afterward known as Ver Planck's Point.

Ensign, Feb 27, 1722. Sheriff of Albany, in 1722, 1725. He was a surveyor, and deputy for Albany, of Cadwallader Colden, Surveyor General. Freeman and citizen of Albany, 1724. Partner with his half-brother, Edward Collins, in Albany, as traders and merchants. 1734-1768, Provincial Assembly, for VanCortlandt Manor. Philip and his wife became owners of the whole point on Cortlandt Manor, by the will of her grandfather, through her father. Philip moved his family from Albany and settled here and built his Manor House on the Point, near the river (now known as Verplanck's Point, incl Village of Verplanck). During the American Revolution, there was a fort (Lafayette, 1780) there. The house was burned by hot shot from the HMS "Vulture", during the Revolution. A ferry ran between the point and Stony Point, known as King's Ferry. It was in British hands for 5 months before being re-taken by the Patriots. He was Commissioner of Highways and Justice of the Peace. As a surveyor, he helped partition the Van Cortlandt Manor, into 10 shares, after the death of Gertrude, wid of Stephanus. He also owned about 1/2 of 1/3 of the Rombout patent, as well as NYC property. Provincial Assembly 1734-1768, from Cortland Manor. He furnished nearly all the provisions and transportation facilities in the Indian Wars of 1763.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, Philip Ver Planck, Manor of Cortlandt, "Gentleman." Leaves to eldest son Jacobus Ver Planck, all that neck of land and meadow, on the east side of Hudson's river at the entering of the Highlands, just over against a certain place called Haverstraw, and is known by the Indian name of Menagh, with the tenements now possessed by John Holmes and Albertus Van Tassel, containing about 900 acres. [The tract of land known as Ver Planck's Point was a part of the Manor of Cortlandt, and was left by Stephanus Van Cortlandt to his oldest son Johanes. He left it to his daughter Gertrude, who married Philip Ver Planck, who was the son of Gulian Ver Planck and grandson of Abraham Jacobsen Ver Planck, the founder of the family.] To him for life, then to his heirs. Also 5 farms in the Manor of Cortlandt, one being the northeast part of South Lot No. 2, now possessed by Joseph Fowler, 160 acres. And 2 farms leased to Daniel Horton, each 125 acres, and one leased to Lawrence Hoff, 300 acres, and one possessed by Emmett Clemens, 300 acres. Also 106 acres in possession of Walter Dobbs, with grist mill, stream and mill dam. Also all right to the undivided lands in Manor of Cortlandt. Also my 1/2 of Lot 1, in Dutchess Co. on north side of Great Wappinger Creek. Also 1/10 of 3 Lots in Rumbout's Patent, on the north side of the north line of the Patent of Adolph Phillipse. Leaves to son Johanes, Front Lot No. 2 in the Manor of Cortlandt, joining Hudsons river, 932 acres, with a small slip of land on the west side of said lot by Hudsons river, bought of Mr. Husun. These to him for life, then to his heirs. Also a certain farm No. 6, being a part of Lot No. 4, and now leased to Josiah Ingersoll. Leaves to son Philip Lot 3 in Dutchess Co. on south side of Wappingers creek, with Dock, storehouse and buildings, 540 acres. Also the farm in Dutchess Co. where he lives, with several parcels of land which did belong to my father Gulian, with mills and stream. Also farm No. 9 in the northwest corner of South Lot No. 2 in the Manor of Cortlandt, now leased by Benjamin Fields. Leaves to son Philip and 3 daughters Anne Mary, Gerty and Catharine, 1/3 of 3 Lots in Rumbout Patent, which 3 Lots fell to the share of our grandfather Gulian Ver Planck. Leaves to his 3 daughters 5 farms in South Lot No. 2 in Manor of Cortlandt, one lying next to Croton river, 200 acres, now possessed by widow Sherwood, No. 2, 178 acres possessed by Henry Kears, No. 3 adjoining Croton river, 235 acres, leased by Michael Vredenbergh, No. 4, 300 acres possessed by Jacob Ryder, and No. 11, 130 acres in possession of Walter Dobbs Jr. Also Lot No. 5 on south side of Croton river, 850 acres. Makes very liberal provision for his 3 daughters. Among the personal property are mentioned 19 slaves. Witnesses: Frans Lent, Arent Lent, Jacob Lent, Johanes Lent, Hendrick Lent, Yan Montross. Oct. 23, 1767. Proved Nov. 29, 1771. Liber 28. P. 140.

I leave to my eldest son Gulian Ver Planck, in preference to all other gifts, the sum of £5 when he comes of age or happens to marry. I leave to my wife Aryantie, during her widowhood, the full use of all my estate, real and personal, or that shall come to me by inheritance from my honorable father, Mr. Gulian Ver Planck, deceased, or from my honorable mother, Henrica Ver Planck, now the wife of Jacob Kip. After the decease of my wife the whole estate is left to my children, Maria, Hannah, and Gulian Ver Planck, "and to the rest of my children which I shall happen by the blessing of God still to procure." Makes his wife sole executor. (Names of witnesses not given.) Richard, Earl of Bellomont, Governor, etc. To all to whom these may come. Know ye, that at New York, on the 8th of April, 1699, the last will of Samuel Ver Planck, of New York, was proved, and his wife Ariante confirmed as executrix.
