The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

"Hendrick Verbreyck and Antje Johnson, his wife," with letters from Tappan, were admitted into membership of the Hackensack Ref Ch 3 July 1791.

On 3 January 1793 (recorded 17 April 1806, Bergen Co. X:316) Hendrick V. D. Varbryck and Antia, his wife, of New Barbadoes precinct, conveyed to Adam Boyd of the same place, for £84, 4 shillings, 21 acres English Measure of maple swamp on the SW corner of the lot where the parties of the first part now dwell, at neck of land called Kalkoenneck, on line of John Varick. Signed by Hendrick V.D. Varbryck, Antje Varbryck. Witnessed by Jacobus Brinkerhof, Roelof Verbryck.¹

Hendrick witnessed the following transaction: On 20 March 1804 (recorded 9 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:129) Joseph Springer of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to William Van Vorhaze of the same place, for \$20, 2 acres more or less, land and privileges int he Township of Franklin at Youpough, beginning W side of Ramapough River; mentioned W end of Bridge of William Van Voorhaze across Ramapough River; for privileges of cutting a Ditch to Erect Mills and Erecting Dam for purpose of said Mills; mentioned land of Samuel Bush. Signed by Joseph Springer. Witnessed by Henry Van Allen, Hendrick D. E. Verbryck.¹

On 8 March 1806 (recorded 8 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:198) Adam Boyd, Esquire of the Township of New Barbadoes, conveyed to John A. Boyd of the same place, for \$326, 21 acres English measure in the Township of New Barbadoes, maple swamp; which Hendrick V. D. Verbryck, deceased, conveyed to said Adam Boyd 3 January 1793; mentioned Kalkaneck; beginning line of John Varick. Bounded SE by Kalkaneck; E by maple swamp of Jacobus Brinkerhooft; NW by maple swamp now or late of said Hendrick V. D. Verbryck; SW by maple swamp of heirs of Benjamin Vanderlinda, deceased. Signed by Adam Boyd. Witnessed by Alexander James, Tully Robinson.¹

Signed by Roelif Verbruyck, Mary Verbruyck. No witnesses recorded.⁴

On 5 Apr 1806 Roelif Verbruyck and his wife Mary sold to Abraham Hopper a tract of land (in present-day Mahwah) that ran from the bank of the Ramapo River to lot #130 of the Ramapo Tract. At least part of this property became the Levi Hopper farm on Campgaw Road, Mahwah, NJ.

Samuel Verbruyck was pastor of the Tappan Reformed Church from 11 Sep 1750 to 31 Jan 1784.⁴ He was also pastor of the Clarkstown Reformed Church.

He was first called to service in 1750 and remained Dominie until his passing thirty-four years later. He was among the first of the Dutch Reformed ministers to be trained and ordained in this country under the tutelage of Dominie John H. Goetchius. A founding father and Trustee of what has become known as Rutgers University, he obtained its original charter from the Governor of New Jersey on 20 March 1770. Dominie Verbruyck was also a prominent Revolutionary, though his Church and Ministry were greatly disturbed by the War.²

The Last will and testament of Dominie Samuel Gerretsen Verbruyck is reprinted in Cole's *History of Rockland County* [New York], dated 30 January 1784. In it, Samuel names his wife and sons, but not his daughters (which suggests that both predeceased him and had had no children).²

On 30 June 1760, Hendrick vander Linde, of New Barbadoes Precinct, Bergen County, NJ [conveyed] to Roelif vander Linde, Dominie Benjamin vander Linde, of Bergen County, NJ and Samuel ver Bruyck (Dominie ver Bruyck in remainder of deed), of Tappan, Orange Co., NY, for £400, part of the Samuel Bayard Patent. Signed Hendrick vander Linde. Wit: Isack Huysman, Roelif Westervelt, and John Coe, of Orange Co., NY.¹

Rem Remsen was of Bedford, Kings County, Long Island, NY. Samuel met Heyltye when he was paroled by the British during the Revolutionary War. When released, some three years and three months after arrest, he left the Debevoise farm in Bedford, Long Island, where he had spent his parole time after rescue from jail, and enlisted in the American Army at Hackensack, NJ. Heyltye Remsen joined him at Polifly, the town of his Vanderlinda ancestors. They lived on his grandfather's farm until late 1783, when they removed to Tappan, Rockland County, NY.¹

In November 1783 they obtained a confiscated Loyalist farm in or near Tappan, and it is here that they remained and raised their nine children.¹

Samuel Gerritsen Verbryck was a New York State legislator, representing Rockland County for more than two decades. He was also very active in his father's church at Tappan.

Samuel G. Verbryck of Orangetown, in his will dated Nov. 26, 1845, probated Nov. 24, 1849. mentioned Sons, Samuel, Remsen, John, and James; Daus., Agness, Jane, Phebe, and Maria; Children of my daughter Susanna. Mentions my pew in Tappan Church. My silver mounted sword, silver table and tea spoons with the tongs, and my blanket or bed spre with the full name of Helen Verbryck interwoven in it, and the family bible containing the family record, to be divided among the heirs. Provides for the erection of gravestones "like those I have placed at my wifes grave." Executors: Sons, Samuel, John, and James.
