The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Verveelen, Van Valen, Vervelen

The first of the family in America was Johannes Verveelen, who came in 1657. He was b. in 1616 at Amsterdam, but of German stock, with an infusion of French, being a son of Daniel Verveelen, who, with his parents, Hans Vervellen and Catharina, dau. of John Oliviers, had some five years prior to the birth of Johannes removed to that city from Cologne, on the Rhine. Daniel, born 1594 Cologne, m. 1615 Amsterdam and became a shopkeeper. His son Johannes, eldest of 6 children was reared and educated in Amsterdam and in 1637 m. Anna Jaarsvelt. They had three children, all b. at Amsterdam: Daniel, Anna, and Maria. Their son Daniel, when a mere boy, preceded his father to New Netherland under the care of Dominie Gideon Schaets, one of whose daughters he married. After several years his father followed, bringing his wife and daughters, and widowed mother, Anna Elkhout, aged about sixty-six years.—Riker, James, History of Harlem, p. 95

Bernardus Verveelen lived at New Rochelle, then Hackensack. He moved to Rockland Co, ca. 1709. With his brother Gideon, he obtained grant from Gov. Cornbury, in 1708, for a tract of 2220 acres, in the SE corner of Rockland Co, and NE New Jersey, Overpeck Creek to Hudson River. He sold to his bro Gideon, who then sold 1000 acres to Capt Lancaster Symes/Sims, Jun 8, 1709. Land was S of George Lockhart Patent to NJ border.

The first of the family in America was Johannes Verveelen, who came in 1657. He was b. in 1616 at Amsterdam, but of German stock, with an infusion of French, being a son of Daniel Verveelen, who, with his parents, Hans Verveelen and Catharina, dau. of John Oliviers, had some five years prior to the birth of Johannes removed to that city from Cologne, on the Rhine. Daniel, born 1594 Cologne, m. 1615 Amsterdam and became a shopkeeper. His son Johannes, eldest of 6 children was reared and educated in Amsterdam and in 1637 m. Anna Jaarsvelt. They had three children, all b. at Amsterdam: Daniel, Anna, and Maria. Their son Daniel, when a mere boy, preceded his father to New Netherland under the care of Dominie Gideon Schaets, one of whose daughters he married. After several years his father followed, bringing his wife and daughters, and widowed mother, Anna Elkhout, aged about sixty-six years.¹

Daniel Verveelen came to America with Domine Gideon Schaets and his family, on Dec 20, 1652, on the ship, *John the Baptist*, before his parents came over (1657). He was a trader at Beverwyck in 1655. He was in New Amsterdam in 1661, with parents. He had a house and lot, in Albany, which was sold Aug 25, 1661. On Nov 7, 1661, he and his father secured a lot on Prince (now Beaver) St, next to his father, and bought Isaac De Forest's interest in a brewery on Prince St. Feb 14, 1662. He went to New Utrecht, ca. 1667. He was an Elder of the New Utrecht Dutch Reformed Church in 1678. He then went to Spuyten Duyvel. He was Ferry-master, after his father. He moved to Hackensack before 1712 (probably ca. 1704).²

In the 1698 census of New Rochelle, Westchester Co., NY are listed: "daneall verveall, age 63; halleday verveall is wiff, age 55; hannas verveall, age 22; gedon verveall, age 14; reanear veerveall, age 12; barnard veerveall, age 10.

They probably lived in the sandstone house at what is now 639 Piermont Road, Closter, Bergen County, NJ. In 1789 the land (34-1/2 acres) "together with all houses, outbuildings, orchards, gardens, meadows, waterways..." was sold by Captain Aaron Gilbert to Daniel A. Verveelen. During the early years of the 19th century, the dwelling was known as the Lone Star Inn and its owners were Walter Parcels and his wife, Annetje Westervelt Parcels.²

On 1 January 1789 Capt. Aaron & Ann Gilbert, of Closter, conveyed to Daniel A. Vervalen, of same place, for £190.75, 34.5 acres...corner to Cornelius Talman, deceased...bounded by Jacob Parcel and Martin Paulison. Signed by Aaron Gilbert, Ann Gilbert. Witnessed by Isaac Morris, David Haring.³

In the Tappan Ref Ch record of the first marriage, they were “Gidion Vervelen j.m. born at New Uytrecht and Marytie Kock born in the City of New York, betrothed. Married Mar. 23 at Tappan by the Voorleser [Clerk] Jan Van Dalssen.”

With his brother Bernardus, Gideon Verveelen obtained a grant from Gov. Cornbury, in 1708, for a tract of 2220 acres, in the SE corner Rockland Co, NY and NE New Jersey, Overpeck Creek to Hudson River. Sold to Capt Lancaster Symes, 8 June 1709. Gideon moved from Rockland to Dutchess Co, NY, and bought 3115 acres of land in Rombout Precinct, May 20, 1740 (at age 60), from Stephen Van Rensselaer. He sold off 12 parcels, gave 4 of his children 252 acres ea, others not mentioned in his will. his home farm was on Wappingers Creek.¹

In his will, he wrote: I Gideon Ver Valen, I, Gideon Ver Valen, of Rombout Precinct, Duchess County. I direct all debts to be paid. Whereas, I did purchase from Stephen Van Rensselaer on May 20, 1740, by lease and release, a certain tract of land called No. 10 in Rombout Precinct, containing 3,115 acres and recorded in Liber B, Page 169. And since then I have sold sundry farms out of said lot to various persons, to wit: Simon Pells, Ezekiel Masten, Johannes Roeger, Arie Van Vliet, Jan Ostrom, Jr., Jacob Westervelt, Jan Le Roy, Thomas Varte, Aert Middah, Hans Joost Snyder, Elias Von Bunschoten, and Migell Hoffman. All the rest of said tract I leave to my children, Moses, Mary, wife of William Rodgers; Hester, wife of Johannes Roeger, and Allida, wife of Isaac Cole. I leave to my son, Moses Ver Valen, £20 "for his birthright, being my only son." I also leave to him all that farm and lot of land whereon he now lives, being part of said Lot No. 10. Beginning at the west corner of said Lot No. 10, at the Wappinger creek, by a butternut tree, and thence running South, 37 degrees East, along the division line between Lots 9 and 10, 120 chains, then E. 53 N., 21 chains, to the south corner of land sold to Johannes Roeger; then along his land N. 37 W. to Wappinger's creek; then down the creek to the place of beginning, and containing 252 acres. I leave to my daughter Mary, wife of William Rodgers, the like quantity of 250 acres, being the farm on which I now live. Beginning at Wappinger's creek at the north corner of Johannes Roeger's land, and thence running up the creek, 7 chains to a white oak tree, marked for Isaac Cole's farm, thence S. 36 E. 8, 5c., to a maple tree, then S. 85 East 7 chains, then S. 48 E. 31, to a black oak tree standing on the northwest bounds of land sold to Arie Van Vliet, then along his line southwest to his west corner, then southeast along his line to land sold to Jan Ostrom, Jr., and Jacob Westervelt, then south as the line runs, to land I sold to Hans Joost Snyder, and then west along his line to his west corner. Beginning again at the first place of beginning at Wappinger's creek, and thence running South 37 East, 120 chains to a heap of stones, by the northeast corner of said Johannes Roeger's land, and then along his line S. 53 W. so far that a straight line be drawn to said Hans Joost Snyder's west corner shall contain 252 acres. This I give to my daughter Mary and her husband, William Rodgers, for life, and then to their children. I also leave to my daughter Hester, wife of Johannes Roeger, 252 acres of said Lot No. 10. Beginning at the southwest corner of Aert Middah's land, and thence South 20 degrees East to land of Elias Von Bunschoten, Jr., then N. 71 E. 2, 50 to his northeast corner, and then by various courses to beginning. I leave to my daughter Allida, wife of Isaac Cole, 252 acres, bounded north by Wappinger's creek and west by the land given to my daughter Mary, wife of William Rodgers, and south by land sold to Arie Van Vliet, and east by lands of Jan Ostrom, Jr., Jacob Westervelt, Ezekiel Masten, and Simon Pells. All the rest of lands unsold in said tract I leave to my son Moses and my daughters, Mary, Hester, and Allida. I leave all the rest of my movable estate to my children. I make my neighbors, Ezekiel Masten, Aert Middah, and Thomas Vorse (Voorhees), executors. Dated January 25, 1755. Witnesses, Richard Vanderbergh, Henry Vanderbergh, Henry Livingston. Proved, June 26, 1762.

He is probably the Henry Vervalen who bought, in 1819, the house at 200 Tappan Road, in what is today Norwood, Bergen County, NJ, along with the surrounding 144 acres.²

On 10 April 1804 (recorded 12 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:160) Henry J. Vervalen of Harington and Cornelia, his wife, conveyed to Henry Delemontanye of the same place, for \$450, 2 acres, 6 rods in Harington, formerly the Dwelling House and property of Johannes Vervalen, Deceased, beginning at Public Road by SW corner of Abraham D. Vervalen's land. Bounded N by land of said Abraham D. Vervalen; S by land of said Henry Delemontanye; E by land of John J. Vervalen; W by Public Road. Signed by Henry Ver Valen, Cornelia Vervalen (her mark). Witnessed by Benj. Blackledge, Peter Blackledge.⁴

They were probably the Henry and Cornelia Van Valen listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Harrington Township: Henry Van Valen, 67, farmer; Cornelia Van Valen, 66; Peter A. Blauvelt, 21, farmer; Eliza Blauvelt, 19; and Leah Blauvelt, 6/12.

The first of the family in America was Johannes Verveelen, who came in 1657. He was b. in 1616 at Amsterdam, but of German stock, with an infusion of French, being a son of Daniel Verveelen, who, with his parents, Hans Verveelen and Catharina, dau. of John Oliviers, had some five years prior to the birth of Johannes removed to that city from Cologne, on the Rhine. Daniel, born 1594 Cologne, m. 1615 Amsterdam and became a shopkeeper. His son Johannes, eldest of 6 children was reared and educated in Amsterdam and in 1637 m. Anna Jaarsvelt. They had three children, all b. at Amsterdam: Daniel, Anna, and Maria. Their son Daniel, when a mere boy, preceded his father to New Netherland under the care of Dominie Gideon Schaets, one of whose daughters he married. After several years his father followed, bringing his wife and daughters, and widowed mother, Anna Elkhout, aged about sixty-six years.¹

On Apr 24, 1657, he was enrolled as a Burgher, New Amsterdam, and joined the Dutch Reformed Church at New Amsterdam. He acquired a house and lot on the Marckvelt-Steeg, from John La Montagne, Jr., Jun 17, 1659. Nominated Schepen, 1660, lost. He moved to Haarlem, 1661. He was a Magistrate, 1663; Delegate, General Assembly, 1664. He acquired considerable property from Jan Pietersen Slot and Juriaan Hansel in 1664. He was a brewer, with Isaac de Forest. Constable, May 5, 1666 at Harlem. One of Gov Nicholls' 5 Patentees of (New) Harlem, Oct 19, 1667. He ran the Ferry at New Harlem (at 125th Street and Harlem River), in the 1660's, (right renewed 1669-1680), along with Harlem Inn (the first inn in Harlem). Second ferry at Spuyten Duyvil at Kingsbridge Road, Feb 27, 1669. He was often in trouble for ignoring excise laws, was granted a 1 year exemption.²

2 Oct 1663 -- Joannes Vervelen, pltf. v/s Arent Janzen Moesman, deft. Pltf. says deft's dog bit his negro and demands a man in his place and payment of surgeon fees and should the negro die or become unserviceable, payment for the same with the costs thereon. Van der Cleef appears in place of the deft., says, the demand is unreasonable, since the negro was warned by Barent, the farmhand of the deft., according to declaration made by the said Barent now exhibited; and that pltf's. demand shall be dismissed and he condemned in the costs hereof. Pltf. agrees to prove, that the deft. was admised his dog was malicious. Burgomaster and Schepen order parties on both sides to prove their assertions.³
