

-- VINCENT --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

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Vincent

There appear to have been at least three Vincent families in early New York and environs: those of Adrien Vincent/Vincent, who were Dutch/Belgian; Levi Vincent, whose antecedents were French Huguenot; and Charles Vincent of Yonkers, who was apparently an immigrant from England.

He seems to have traveled back and forth between the new world and old world several times. There is an Adrian Vincent listed as a passenger on the Mary and John from London England to New England in 1634. There is an Adriaen Vincian who arrived in New Amsterdam on the ship "Draetvat" 2 June 1657³. Adriaen Vincian, a farmer from Tournai on the River Scheldt, Province of Hainault, Belgium with his wife and children age 16, 12 and 5 arrived on the ship "Hope" 8 April 1662. Adriaen Vincian, from Tournai, agriculturer, on *The Hope*, April 1662³.

On a map of Amsterdam in New Netherland 1653-1664 the name Adrian Vincent appears between Jacobus Becker and Thos. Davidson. They are on east side of Heer Graft and south of DePrince Straat and north of Slyck Steepe. This area is south of De Wal Straat. In 1674, he owned \$1500 worth of property on the east side of present Broad Street, New York City, near South William Street.

An Adrian Vincent took the Oath of Allegiance on 24 March 1633.¹

10 August 1654 -- Adriaen Vincent requests by petition permission to retail brandy and other strong liquors out of doors by the large and small measure. Whereupon is ordered: Petitioner's request is granted on condition that he pay the proper Tapper's Excise.⁴

7 June 1655 -- Madaleen Vincent, pltf, v.s Jacob Willemsen, deft., says, that deft. has drawn 15 gl. in brandy, of which he has paid fl.4, requesting that deft. be condemned to pay the balance of fl. 11. Deft. denies the debt, and says, he does not know that he has drawn any brandy except the fl. 4 which he paid. Pltf calls for the declaration of Pieter Stoutenborgh, who being heard thereupon by the Count, declares that he cannot give any evidence in the matter. Pltf. was, therefore, ordered to prove, that deft. has drawn the brandy, and for this purpose to summon those, who drew and drank the liquor, before the Court, to give an explanation of the matter.⁴

Adriaen Vincent found on the passenger list for 2 April 1657 *Draetvat*. (Wine-Cask) "The names of Haen, Vincent, Smetdes and Buyskes appear in the original after Gilles Mandeville and for all except Smetdes the name of the ship and the date are not given" [Immigrants to the New World 1600s to 1800s: New world Immigrants Vol. I Passengers to New Netherland (List of Passengers 1654 - 1664) The account book for 1654 - 1664 lists 6 names in order of their passage but no date or ship name given: Albert Pietersen, mason; Geertry Claesen; Gerrit Pietersen; Gilles Mandeville; Jacob Hendricksen Haen, painter; Adriaen Vincent. Footnote for Adriaen Vincent states: Vincent had built a house in New Amsterdam about 1646 (Innes 150) and is in the account book for another voyage in 1662.¹

An Adriaen Vincian farmer from Tournai was on board *De Hoop* (The Hope) sailing 8 April 1662, with wife and 3 children 16, 12 and 5 years old. We know that Adriaen had a daughter Hester bpt 1645 so she would be about 17, and a son Johannis bpt 1651 who would be about 11. These fit with the ages of the first two children given. This leaves an unnamed child born ca 1657.¹

In 1659 Adriaen Vincent sued (Marcus de Sousoy and his wife) for slander after being accused of having another wife with four children in Holland; the defendants had lost a default judgment to Adriaen in the month prior, the court directed them to document their charges, and no further action appears in Dutch records.²

According to Baird in *History of the Huguenot Emigration to America*, Madeleine was from St. Martin. He cites "Act of Naturalization, New York, 1687." St. Martin is a town on the Île de Ré, which is just west of La Rochelle.

Simon Fel, along with Adriaen Vienzan and Anna Vienzan, witnessed the baptism 1 March 1656 NYC Ref Ch, of Andries, son of Jean de Pre & Margariet Jans.

Adriaen Vincent and Hester Couwenhoven witnessed the baptism, 26 Oct 1659 NYC Ref Ch of Barteltje, dau. of Simon Druinen [de Ruine?] and Magdaleen V. der Straten.

Adriaen Vincent and Elisabeth de Potter witnessed the baptism 8 August 1668 of Johannes, son of Jan Gerdyn and Hester Vincent.

Charles Vincent was mentioned in 1675 as a creditor in an estate settlement. For many years, he was believed to be a son of Adriaen, but this has never been proven. The latest theory (of The Vincent Family Association) is that he may have been an indentured servant to Phillip Calvert in Maryland in 1663. If so, he moved to New York after completing his obligation. This theory is discussed in "The Vincent Family, Third Edition", edited by Sheridan Vincent.

1 Feb 1691 (Westchester Co. Land Records, Liber B, p. 119) -- William Smith, son of William Smith, late of Yonkers Plantation, dec'd, with the consent of his grandfather, John Hadden, Senr., of the town aforesd., to Charles Vincent, land in Yonkers.²

He was listed in the 1698 Census of Fordham and Adjacent Places: Chearles uinson and his wife Elesabeth and four children: Chearles, lenard, Susanna, bettie.

21 Oct 1701 -- Charles Vincent, Senr., of the Yonkers plantation, for love and affection, to son Charles Vincent, Junr., all moveable and personal estate and my lands and meadows which I am possessed of at the Yonkers plantation. (Liber C, Westchester Co. Land Recirds at White Plains, p. 270)¹

In a document from Liber E, p. 337, Land Records of Westchester Co., NY: Charles Vincent, Junr., of Yonkers Plantation, to Leonard Vincent of ye same place, "with the consent of Charles Vincent, Senr., my father, and Elizabeth Vincent, my mother," sold land in Yonkers, of which he was "the true and lawful owner" 19 Dec 1713.

In his will, Charles Vincent, of Yonkers, left to son Charles all right to the farm where I now live. Mentioned wife Rachel, son John. Dated 4 April 1740, probated 13 May 1740. In his will, he wrote: ...April 4, 1740, I, Charles Vincent, Sr., of Yonkers, in the County of Westchester, farmer, being sick. I leave to my son, Charles Vincent, my large Bible. To my son John, my gun. "What money I may have in the house, and due to me, I leave to my wife and my sons Charles and John." My 3 mares and 2 young oxen are to be sold to pay debts. I leave to my son Charles all the right I have in the farm I now live on, "but then he shall take care for a maintainance for his mother." I leave to my wife Rachael, all the rest of my movable estate; my 2 daughters, Rachael and Mary, have received their part, and their mother is to pay them 1 shilling each. I make my wife and my sons, Charles and John, executors. Witnesses, John Ryder, John Archer, John Cuer. Proved, May 13, 1740.

In her will, dated 3 March 1742, probated 13 May 1744, Rachel Vincent, of Yonkers, widow: Whereas my late husband made provision for my sons Charles and John, I do give each of them a Spanish Dollar, or piece of 8. Leaves legacies to daughters Rachel, wife of Stephen Williams; Sarah, wife of Benjamin Fowler; and Hannah; and to grand daughter Mary Bertine. Witnesses: Jacob Ryder, James Fabler, Joseph Vail.

Esther was mentioned in the will dated 23 Jan 1741, of her grandfather, Frederick Devoose, Sr. [DeVoe], of Westchester.

On 4 April 1749 Charles Vincent was chosen a Highway Master of Eastchester, Westchester Co., NY. On 5 April 1757, he was chosen caretaker of Public Edifices and Buildings. On 3 April 1759 he was chosen one of the Overseers of Roads. On 1 April 1760 he was chosen Viewer of Fences & Buildings. On 7 April 1761 he was chosen Viewer of Damage. He held other positions in Eastchester at least until 1767.¹

They lived at Milton, PA.¹

During the Revolutionary War the Indians became very hostile to the new settlers on the Susquehanna (River) making it necessary for them to associate for mutual protection. Stockade Forts were erected at central points. One of these Forts, known as Vreeland's Fort, was situated on Warrior Run about seven miles west of the (now) Town of Milton. Late in June, 1779, a party of Indians approached stealthily and fired upon six men hoeing corn in a field near the Fort. They killed Isaac Vincent and James Miles and took Benjamin Vincent, a boy eleven years old, prisoner. Early in July a body of 150 Indians returned, accompanied by a British Lieut. with a company of Infantry, attacked the Fort and compelled it to capitulate, the conditions being that all the men over seventeen should become prisoners of war, the women and children and the aged should be set at liberty. Under this capitulation, Cornelius Vincent and his sons Daniel and Bethuel, with their neighbors, were marched across the country to the Lakes and thence to Quebec, where they remained prisoners till the close of the war. The aged John Vincent and wife, with the wife and younger children of Cornelius, wended their way back on foot to New Jersey and were scattered among their friends till the return of their Father & Brothers.¹

Soon after their return from captivity Cornelius Vincent and wife with their sons Daniel and Bethuel returned to the West Branch (of the Susquehanna River) and resumed the settlement they had been obliged to abandon. Daniel built and owned the Warrior Run Mills. Bethuel built and kept a Hotel in Milton.¹

They fled to England in 1681. "Vincent, François, sail maker (voilier) from Soubize 20 Sept., with wife and three children. 1681 23 Sept., 18/- " [I suppose this means 18 shillings and no pence. There continues a list of payments and statements that he hasn't found work.] "Payments continued until 1681/2 21 March, when he 'sa famme, 3 enfans et une parente' were given £3 'pour passer à la Nouvelle Angleterre'. 20 grants in all. Total £13.1.0."³ Soubise is a small town on or near the coast of France about 10 miles south of La Rochelle.

14 Oct 1681: Denizations Francis Vincent, Anna, his wife, Anna and Francis Vincent, their children.⁴ Francois was naturalized in England, March 21, 1682, and a week later he sailed from London with his wife, Anne Guerry, and his children, Anne and Francois, for America.⁵

According to Baird, Vol 1, pg 232, Francis Basset was master and Francis Vincent was mate of a vessel sailing from the port of New York August 13, 1685, were taken prisoners by the Spaniards who carried them to the town of St. Domingo where they were very ill for 4 months, finally escaped in a canoe to the Little Goyaves. (NY Colonial MSS., Bol. XXXII), folio 86.)

Francis had siblings: Esther Vincent m. Jean David; Jan Vincent m Susanna Newkerk/Neukerque; Marie Madeline (Magdalena) Vincent m John Pelletreau.

The names of persons naturalized by letters-patent issued in London, March 21, 1682, in behalf of Stephen Bouchet and thirty-five or forty other French Protestants with their families, are entered in Liber IX., folio 326, for the sole benefit of Francois Vincent, his wife Anne, his children Anne and Francois, and John Hain. A note appended states that the parties sailed from London for New England, March 28, 1682.

The petition of Francis Basset, master, and Francis Vincent, mate, of a vessel sailing from the port of New York, August 13, 1685, shows that they were taken prisoners by the Spaniards, who carried them to the town of St. Domingo, where they were very ill used for the space of four months, and from whence, by a particular providence of God, they made their escape in a canoe to the little Goyaves. Arriving there with much difficulty, and destitute of all things necessary (the Spaniards having stripped them of their very clothes) the Sieur Boybelleau was moved with compassion towards them, for the extreme misery of such poor desolate captives that had lost all they had, and were like also in a short time to lose their lives, and brought them back in his vessel to New York. Upon this representation the ship was exempted from duties and charges.--(N. Y. Colonial MSS., Vol. XXXII. folio 86.)

Francis Vincent was listed in the Census of NYC taken about 1703, living in the South Ward. Listed living in his family group were 2 males 16-60; 1 female; 1 male child; 2 female children; 1 male negro; 1 female negro; 1 male negro child.¹

Francis Vincent, of New York, sail maker, was mentioned as a kinsman, in the will of Elias Nezereau "of the Island of Jamaica, but now of the city of New York, merchant" dated 28 March 1709, probated 6 April 1709. Nezereau left kinsman Francis Vincent "my large canoe and its appurtenances."²

In his will, he wrote: I, Francis Vincent, of New York, sailmaker. This 11 day of September in the 6 year of George II [1732?], "being ancient and sick. I leave to my son Samuel, 6 shillings, and debar him from any further claim as eldest son and heir-at-law. To my daughter, Ann Gilbert, all my bed, sheets, pillows, etc. "Also my picture which was drawne to represent my person for ever." I leave to my grand-son, Francis Manny, the son of James Manny, deceased, my gun, sword, and watch. To my grandson, Stephen Maynard, part of my wearing apparell. All the rest of my estate is to be sold and the proceeds divided among my son Samuel, my daughter Ann Gilbert, my daughter Elizabeth Maynard, my daughter Esther Salter, and my grand-daughter, Anne Madeline Manny. I make my daughter, Ann Gilbert, and Dr. John Dupuy, and Joseph Leddell, pewterer, executors. Witnesses, Abraham Jouneau, C. De Peyster, S. Johnson. Proved, April 10, 1733.

April 22 1701, John Vincent, merchant, and his wife, Susannah, convey to Madeleine Pelletreau, wife of John (Pelletreau), dec'd, merchant, for three hundred and fifty pounds all that house, land, etc., situated in the Broadway, West, etc. April 21 1705, John Vincent, Leather dresser, buys of Daniel Honan, land, etc., by Maiden Lane Slip. Dec. 12 [year?] his widow Susa. and Levi, eldest son and heir of said John, sell...for one hundred and twenty-five pounds, the lot on the s. w. side of the slip at the end of Maiden Lane on Queen St. bought of Daniel Honan.

New Amsterdam records lists Jean/John variously as a merchant and a leather dresser.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Vincent, of New York, merchant, being in good health. I make my wife Susannah sole executor, with full use of the estate, but in case she marries, then she is to have one half, and the rest to my children, only the eldest is to have £10 over and above his brothers and sister. (Names of the children not given.) Dated January 28, 1696/7.

Witnesses, (???) Bassett, A. Morrisett, Isaac Garnier, Giles Gaudineau. Proved before Lord Cornbury, December 4, 1705, and his widow Susannah having refused the executorship, Letters of administration are granted to his brother Francis Vincent.

John Vincent was named, along with Abram Brooks, as executor of the estate of Peter Egberts, whose will was dated 26 Aug 1749 Essex Co., NJ.

In 1772 the Vincent family, consisting of John Vincent and wife, their sons Cornelius and Peter, their sons-in law, Timothy Williams and Samuel Gould, removed from Essex County, New Jersey, and settled in Northumberland County, Pennsylvania, near the now Town of Milton. The sons-in-law afterwards removed to Cayuga County, near Lake Cayuga, New York.³

During the Revolutionary War the Indians became very hostile to the new settlers on the Susquehanna (River) making it necessary for them to associate for mutual protection. Stockade Forts were erected at central points, into which the women and children of the neighborhood were gathered for mutual protection; the men were organized into military companies known as "Minute Men," whose duty it was to rush together to these Forts at the approach of danger. One of these Forts, known as Vreeland's Fort, was situated on Warrior Run about seven miles west of the (now) Town of Milton. Into this Fort

were gathered the Vincents, the Himrods, the Miles, the Boyds, the Lytles, and others. [Note: Nearly all of these families, as we shall see later on, afterward lived together and frequently intermarried in the town of Waterford, Erie County, Pennsylvania. There was also a King family with whom our intimate personal friendships have continued through three generations. B. V.] Late in June, 1779, a party of Indians approached stealthily and fired upon six men hoeing corn in a field near the Fort. They killed Isaac Vincent and James Miles and took Benjamin Vincent, a boy eleven years old, prisoner. Early in July a body of 150 Indians returned, accompanied by a British Lieut. with a company of Infantry, attacked the Fort and compelled it to capitulate, the conditions being that all the men over seventeen should become prisoners of war, the women and children and the aged should be set at liberty. Under this capitulation, Cornelius Vincent and his sons Daniel and Bethuel, with their neighbors, were marched across the country to the Lakes and thence to Quebec, where they remained prisoners till the close of the war. The aged John Vincent and wife, with the wife and younger children of Cornelius, wended their way back on foot to New Jersey and was scattered among their friends till the return of their Father & Brothers.³
