The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Adolph Waldron was a baker and shop-keeper in New York. He removed to Eastchester, then returned to New York. He was a farmer and innkeeper at Brooklyn Ferry<sup>1</sup>. In 1775 he was made captain of the troop of light-horse and soon was called into active service to guard the coast. During the Revolution he lived at Preakness, N.J.<sup>2</sup>

Adolphus Waldron bought, on 4 Nov 1779, the forfeited lands of Loyalist Hendrick Doremus at Preakness (abt. 300 acres).<sup>3</sup>

Waldron, who died at the age of 81 years, 11 months, and 26 days, at the home of his sister-in-law, Miss Lucy E. Cross of South Ridgewood avenue, Thursday evening at 7 o'clock, will be held at the Congregational church at 3 p.m. Sunday. Rev. W. L. Lewis will conduct the services. Interment will be made in Greenwood cemetery on Second avenue by the side of Mr. Waldron's wife. Mr. Waldron was born near Newburg, Ulster County, N.Y., May 8, 1840. At the age of 10 years he moved with his parents to Haverstraw, where they lived on a farm and where he attended the public school, until he was 20, when he moved to Nyack on the Hudson. On April 23, 1851, he enlisted in the Union army and received a wound in the wrist in the battle of Bull Run. He was discharged in June 1863. Mr. Waldron came to Florida in January, 1872, and located at Daytona where he has since made his home, taking a great deal of interest in the progressiveness of the city, assisting in organizing the Daytona town council and was its first treasurer and a member of the council for a number of years. He was at one time proprietor of the "Waldron," which has since been changed to the Magnolia hotel. On January 15, 1879, Mr. Waldron was married to Miss Emma E. Cross of Richville, N.Y., and since her death a number of years ago, he has made his home with her sister, Miss Lucy Cross. Mr. Waldron was an active member of the Congregational church for many years, being the Sunday school superintendent for 23 years, as well as church deacon for some time."<sup>1</sup>

Mary Waldron, 40, was listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township. No husband was listed with her.

Living with her were Catherine Waldron, 17; Ann Waldron, 16; Margaret Waldron, 13; Matilda Waldron, 10; Luther Waldron, 8; Lucinda Waldron, 6; Edward Waldron, 4; and Isaac Waldron, 1.

Capt. John Waldron commanded his Majesty's ship "Greyhound." About 1721 he gave up his command and became a merchant; was vestryman of Trinity Church 1725 to 1732, and captain of the Blue Artillery company, and as such had charge of the military stores for some 20 years.<sup>1</sup>

In what was probably his will, he wrote: ...I, John Waldron, of New York, merchant, being infirm in body. I leave to my son-in-law, Daniel Styles, of New York, merchant, my house and lot, adjoining on the west side of my now dwelling house. I leave to my wife Cornelia the use of all the rest of my estate during her widowhood, and after her death or marriage then to my daughter Mary, wife of said Daniel Styles. I make my wife and my daughter Mary executors. Dated August 4, 1750. Witnesses, Thomas Armstrong, Nicholas Bidder, Richard Nichols. Proved, April 15, 1762. [NOTE.--Capt. John Waldron owned a lot 50 feet wide with two houses on the south side of Crown street (now Liberty street). The east line was 118 feet west of William street. The west line, which was 168 feet west of William street, was next to what was known in early times as "John Barbaries' Garden." It was 100 feet square, and in later days a sugar house stood on it and was used as a prison during the Revolution.--W. S. P.]

In 1654 he sailed, with his family, for America.

They lived in New Amsterdam until after 1664 when they moved to the village of Harlem in upper Manhattan, where he held several public offices. He was a magistrate there in 1673.

I checked all counties of England, but I could not find any, that even sounds like Hotlam (only Nottingham could be possible). I suppose that is the trouble, the clerk just wrote down, what he heard.--Cor Snabel<sup>1</sup>

William Waldron was made constable in 1734, and soon after sergeant in the company of Capt. Stuyvesant.

In his will dated 22 Aug 1761, probated 15 Jan 1770, he wrote: I, William Waldron, of New York, in Harlem Division. August 22, 1761. I leave to my son David £20, "as being my eldest son." I leave to my wife Antye as much of my household goods, furniture, and kitchen stuff as my executors may judge reasonable for my wife to keep house with; Also 3 cows and 2 horses, and for the support of her and my under aged children the use of my house and as much land as my executors may think proper; Also 2 negro wenches and a negro boy. I leave to my under aged children £50 each when they are of age, in lieu of an equivalent which I have given to my son David and my daughters, Tanake and Marya. If my wife Antye remains my widow till my youngest child is of age, then my executors are to sell all, and allow to my wife for her support a child's portion, and the rest to my ten children [not named]. I make my wife and son David and my friend, John Bogart, executors. Witnesses, Benjamin Waldron, Johannes Waldron, John Waldron, Jr. Proved, January 15, 1770.<sup>2</sup>
