The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Andrew Ward, a native of Suffolk County, England, emigrated to New England in 1630. On 14 May 1634 he was a free-man of Watertown, MA and later accompanied the first settlers to CT, settling first in Wethersfield, later moving to Stamford in 1641. There, in Oct 1642 "Goodman Warde" was chosen Constable for Stamford. He moved with Rev. Denton to Hempstead, L.I. in 1643 and was back at Fairfield CT in 1649.

In the 1700 it was resolved by the inhabitants of Eastchester "that Edmund Ward shall have and hold 60 acres of land, in consideration that the said Edmund Ward do pay the Indians purely, and clear the said town of a from the said payment when need be." On 23 Sep 1705 he, along with Col. William Peartree and others, were granted a tract of land in Westchester Co., by Her Majesty, Anne, of Great Britain and Ireland, etc. This was known as the "New Patent" or "Long Reach Patent."

The births of their three children, Mary, Edmund, and Stephen, were recorded in Westchester County Deeds, Liber G, p. 190.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Edmund Ward, of East Chester, being sick and weak. It is my will and mind, that my lot of land lying in East Chester, adjoining to Mordecai Gomez lot, and 20 acres of meadow being opposite, and all my movable estate (except my silver hilted sword) be sold by my executors, and after payment of debts and funeral charges, the rest is to be divided into three parts, and given to my wife Phebe, and my daughters, Mary and Miriam, each 1/3. I leave to my son, Edmund Ward, my silver hilted sword. Also all my lot of salt meadow, lying near the burying place in East Chester. I leave to my son Stephen, all that my lot of salt meadow "lying near a place called by the name of Seikech's landing." All the rest of my lands I leave to my sons, Edmund and Stephen, when of age. I make my wife Phebe, and my uncle, John Ward, executors. Dated February 12, 1731. Witnesses, Thomas Underhill, Benjamin Bloomfield, John Carr. Proved, April 7, 1732.

instrumental in the completion of this project. He was a Captain in the Revolutionary War, member of the State Legislature (20yrs.) and rose to the rank of General in the Army after the war. He was also sheriff, served in the War of 1812, and became an Elder in the Presbyterian Church.¹

Originally of Saddle River, after his marriage he lived at Pompton. He was a Captain of Light Horse of Bergen County during the Revolution, and in 1781 he was appointed recruiting officer for Bergen County.

He purchased nearly 1000 acres in the Ramapo Tract after the Revolution, from 1784 to 1805, some of this land being confiscated estates. Part of the land was 100 acres sold to Ward on 2 July 1784 for £800 (L:198) which had been confiscated from Christian Pullisfelt, a Tory, in 1779. This land was bounded by land of Jacobus Bogert and Jacobus Pulisfelt.

Ward later lived on his Ramapo Tract property, having built a house on what is today the corner of Woodside and Pulis Avenues in the Campgaw section of Franklin Lakes. He also owned a saw mill, bark mill, grist mill, tannery and distillery on

Pulis Avenue.

He held many public offices after the war, including Chosen Freeholder from Franklin Township (1788, 1792, 1793, 1796, 1797); Judge of Common Pleas (1808); member of the Assembly from Bergen for a sporadic number of years between 1792 and 1811.

On 2 July 1784, Cornelius Haring, commissioner, of Bergen Co., conveyed to Peter Ward of Saddle River Precinct, for £800, 100 acres; mentioned corner to Jacobus Bogart and Jacobus Pulisfelt; seized from Christian Pulisfelt, late of Franklin Township, for joining the army of the King. Signed by Cornelius Haring. Witnessed by John Neafie, Petrus Haring.²

On 15 July 1784, Cornelius Haring, agent of forfeited estates in Bergen Co., conveyed to Peter Ward of Saddle River Precinct, for £765, 63 acres in Franklin Township; mentioned line of Simon Van Winkle and Peter Van Zile. Seized of Robert Drummond, late of Essex County, for joining the army of the King. Signed by Cornelius Haring. Witnessed by John Hopper, Petrus Haring.²

On 15 August 1793, William H. Bell, sheriff of Bergen County, conveyed to Peter Ward, of Bergen County, for £20, 179 acres and 147 acres and 116 acres in Franklin Township...Abraham Lott recovered in court, £82.95 of John Johnson. Signed William M. Bell. Witnessed by Ann Zabriskie, John DeHensck.²

On 20 March 1799 (recorded 24 May 1805, Bergen Co. U:216) Peter Ward and Nancy, his wife, of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to Aaron Garretson of the same place. for £75, 50 acres strict measure in the Township of Franklin, part of lot number 65 on map of Romopock tract. Signed by Peter Ward, Nancey Ward. Witnessed by Perynas Erwin, Peter Ward Junr.⁴

On 10 August 1800, Peter and Nancy Ward, of Bergen County, conveyed to James Thew of Franklin Township, for \$250, 23.85 acres purchased from William and Elizabeth Teusbury, 15 May 1798. Signed by Peter Ward, Nancy Ward. Witnessed by John Felter, Cornelius Carr.²

On 20 February 1805 (recorded 27 Feb 1805, Bergen Co. Y:345) Peter Ward of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to Ryer Demarest, shue maker, of New York County, New York State, two lots in the Township of Franklin: (1) 11-22/100 acres more or less being part of lot no. 53 of Ramapough Patten, beginning at land conveyed to John Van Voorhis, Esquire; Isaac Van Voorhis. (2) 6-12/100 acres strict measure beginning at corner of lot conveyed by said Peter Ward to Christian Carlough. Signed by Peter Ward. Witnessed by Henry V. Allen, Peryna Irwin.⁴

Peter Ward, Jr. was a brigade major under Gen. William Colfax in the War of 1812. He was a tanner, currier, farmer and distiller at Campgaw, Bergen Co., NJ. He began to speculate about 1812 and lost his property, afterwards removing to Boonville, Oneida Co., NY.

He evidently conveyed his interest in the grist mill, sawmill and tannery inherited from his father to his younger brother, William Ward; later the mill was the subject of a law suit between brothers John and William.

On 8 March 1806 (recorded 25 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:277) Honorable Richard Penn, Esquire, of Queen Ann St., West in Parish of St. Mary LeBone, in the County of Middlesex, Great Britain and Ireland, by John R. Coates of the City of Philadelphia, his attorney, conveyed to Peter Ward of the County Bergen, for \$500.63, 164-24/100 acres strict measure, Lot no. 53 in the Ramapock Tract. Signed by Richard Penn, by his Attorney John R. Coates. Witnessed by James A. Pase, Aseph Stowell.¹

On 1 May 1806 (recorded 3 June 1806, Bergen Co. Y:43) Jane Wade of the County of Bergen, conveyed to Peter Ward, Esquire, of the same place, for \$762.50, a lot in the Town of Hackensack, in Township of New Barbadoes, beginning at lot lately sold by Jane Wade to David Banta; W side of Bergen Turnpike road; Samuel Ludlam. Signed by Jane Wade. Witnessed by Wm. A Depeyster, Casparus Bogert.¹

Sarah Ann Bogert, wife of William Ward, was accepted into membership in the Wyckoff Ref Ch 25 Dec 1846; she was listed in the 1 April 1865 membership list of the Wyckoff Ref Ch.

They were listed in the 1865 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township (probably in what became the Campgaw-Fardale section of Mahwah, near Wyckoff): William Ward, Sarah Ann Ward, Catherine Ward, Rachel Ward, Peter Ward, Mary Ward, Emma Ward, Jemima Ward, Phoebe Jane Ward, Kate Ward, Emma Bogert, Ida Bogert, Ward Bogert, and Eliot Bogert.

William Ward, 81, Farmer, and Salleyan, 71, his wife, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living in [the Campgaw section of] Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ. Living with them were their unmarried children: Catherine Ward, 43, and Peter Ward, 37.

He lived at or near Saddle River, NJ. He was a tool manufacturer, running Ward's Tool Factory in or near Saddle River on the site formerly occupied by the Van Riper cotton factory.

William Ward, 59 tool manufacturer, and Emaline, 59, his wife, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census living in Washington Township. Living with them were their children: William J.C. Ward, 25, working in factory; and Mary E. C. Ward, 20.

Emeline C. Ward, 79 (b. Mar 1821) was listed in the 1900 Federal Census, living with the family of her daughter and son-in-law, John G. and Rosa J. C. Esler in the Borough of Saddle River, Bergen County, NJ.
