

-- WENDOVER --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

The house and lot of Hercules Wendover was on the north side of Wall street, very near the corner of Pearl street.

In his will, he wrote: I, Hercules Wendover, of New York, blacksmith, being in good health, on this 3d day of March, 1737, make this my last will and testament. I leave to my brother Thomas Wendover, £10, to buy him a suit of mourning and to my sister Anne, £10 for the same. All my wearing apparell I leave to my brother Thomas and to Johanes, son of my sister Anne. I leave all the rest to my dear wife Mary to do as she thinks best. I leave the house lot and premises where I now dwell in Wall Street, in New York, to my wife Mary, for life, with power to rebuild and repair. After her death my executors are to sell the same, as soon as they conveniently can, 1/2 of the money is to be paid to my brother Thomas for life, and 1/2 to my sister Anne for life, and then to their children. I make my wife Mary, Thomas Lynsen, merchant, and Johanes Delamontagne, block maker, executors. Witnesses, George Lurting, Samuel Bourdett. Proved, April 11, 1743.

Hercules Wendover was admitted Freeman of City of New York in 1760, when he is listed as a Grocer.

He may have moved his family to the vicinity of what is today Allendale in Bergen Co., N.J. during or after the Revolution (a brother and a brother's widow, are known to have removed to the area of Nine Partners, in Dutchess Co., N.Y. during the war). On the 1779 Erskine-DeWitt Map #26 (survey made by Capt. John W. Watkins, August 1778) "Windifords" is labelled just south of "Fells." This would likely be in the general area of Franklin Turnpike about opposite the Chestnut Street intersection, on the east side of the road, in what became Allendale.

Hercules Windaford is listed in the 1780 Franklin Township Rateables as a householder, listed just after Cornelius Meyer and just before Hohan H. Rapp (this may, however, be Hercules Windover the son, who would be about age 20-21).

Hercules Wendover, of New York City, cordwainer, died intestate and on 29 Sep 1790, administration on his estate was granted to his widow, Jane, of the same place.¹

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage and banns, they were: Jan Evertsen, j.m. Uyt oudt Engelandt, en Engeltje Hercks, Wede. Van Pieter Breestede, beyde woonende alhier.

"Jan Windeford, Engeltje Harx, s.h.vrouw" wit. bp. NYC Ref Ch 14 Jan 1700 of Jan, son of Jan Brestede & Marretje Pieters. Engeltie Harx [Cranckhey] had previously married 13 June 1677 Peter Breestede.

John Windeford was listed in New York City census for 1692-93. In 1697-99, John Windover was given as assistant alderman of the West Ward of New York City. He appeared in a list of New York City inhabitants of 1703 when his household consisted of one male, one female, and three children. No record of the baptisms of Thomas or Anne have been found. John was a silversmith who lived in New Amsterdam after 1690.

14 Oct 1692, at a meeting of the NYC Common Council -- It was noted that John Windiford was returned to serve as Common Council man for the West Ward in June last, but due to several misdemeanors was judged not fit or qualified the serve in that office.³

In his will dated 21 July 1716, probated 23 Feb 1726/27, John Windover, of New York, silversmith, mentioned eldest son

Thomas; wife Engeltie. Made wife executor. Wit: Abraham Van Gelder, Antonas Kaac, Johannes Jansen. When the will was probated 23 Feb 1726/27 Hercules Wendover was appointed administrator, the executrix being dead, and the son Thomas having renounced his right.²

In her will dated 15 Aug 1726, probated 23 Feb 1726/27, Engeltie Wendover, of New York, widow, mentioned sons Samuel Evins [prob. Samuel Everts] (one shilling "wherewith I cut him off from any pretensions as heir at law." She also mentioned, as heirs, her four children, Samuel Evins, Thomas and Hercules Wendover, and Nancy Mackinney. Made sons Thomas and Hercules Wendover executors. Wit: Griffin White, Harmanus Stymets, Samuel Johnson.¹
