The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In 1861 Matthew D. White bought the same three tracts from Maybella White that his father had bought from Charles Craft in 1837 (Bergen Co. Deed V5:129). In 1889, Matthew sold 36 acres to his brother Charles S. White (Bergen Co. Deed X12:595).²

Charles White and his brother Matthew, were active in the lumber business, the silk industry, and in bridge construction in Bergen County.²

C. S. and Lucinda White (both aged 20-60) were listed in the 1885 New Jersey State Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed with them were Charles B., George, Roy, John, and Carry Thompson (black). Roy and John were under 5 years of age.

Charles White, 56, widower, paper manufacturer, was listed in the 1900 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed with him were children: Charles, 23, single, Lumber Dealer; George M., 21, Salesman paper mill; Roy E., 19, Machinist; John, 15; and [illegible].

Charles S. White, 62, widower, was listed in the 1905 New Jersey State Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ (western Waldwick area?). His father was b. Scotland; his mother b. England. Listed with him were: George M. White, 26, Lumber Salesman; Roy E. White, 24, Machinist; John White, 20, Inshur Clerk [Insurance Clerk?]; and Matilla [or Mabella? prob. Matilda] Waldron, 65 (b. Jan 1840 NY), widowed [or Single?], Housework.

Charles S. White, 66, widowed, retired, was listed in the 1910 Federal Census, living in Orville Township, Bergen County, NJ (Waldwick area), in a house he owned. Listed living with him were: George M. White, 32, son, foreman in lumber yard; John White, son, 25, insurance clerk; Lillian H. White, 19 (b. MA), daughter-in-law; and Matilda Waldron, 69, single, sister [in-law].

In his will, he wrote: ...9 day of November, 1706. I, Edward White, of the town of Oyster Bay in Queens County, being very sick and weak. I leave to my eldest son, Simon White, my house and home lot of land whereon it stands, bounded on the south to Jacob Wright's land, and on the east to the highway, and on the north to the meadows, Together with that parcel of land whereon my barn stands, bounded all round with highways; Also my share of salt meadow, and all the lands which I have laid out joining to John Townsend's land, nigh to Henry Weeks; Also one right and a half in the undivided lands in the Old Purchase of Oyster Bay. I leave to my second son, Joseph White, one lot of land which I have lying in the town, and joining to Nathaniel Coles home lot, together with one half of all my land at the Plains and Plains edge, and a share of salt meadow lying in the home meadow, on the west side of the meadow I leave to his brother Simon; Also one right and a quarter of land in the undivided lands in the Old Purchase of Oyster Bay. I leave to my youngest son, Robert White, my lot of land joining to his uncle Simon Cooper's lot, in the Town, and the other half of my land at the Plains and Plains edge; Also my other share of meadow lying in the home meadows, and a right and a quarter of the undivided lands in the old Purchase of Oyster Bay. I leave to my five daughters, Judith, Abigail, Martha, Mary and Anne, £20 each when of age. I leave to my wife Mary the rest of the movable estate and make her sole executor. I also give to my wife Mary all the meadow ground at the south, which I bought of Thomas Ireland, to sell and dispose of to pay debts and legacies. She is also to have the use of all houses and lands to bring up the children. Witnesses, Robert Cooper, Simon Cooper, John Townsend. Proved at Hempstead, November 25, 1706.

John White came to this country from Scotland in 1814. Before moving to New Prospect (now Waldwick), he had owned a paper mill in Millburn, NY. The White factory made wrapping paper and paper twine.⁴

John White started [or bought] a paper mill at New Prospect in 1837.¹

In 1835 a newspaper advertisement listed "a paper mill and farm of about 130 acres for sale in New Prospect." In 1837 John White bought about 36 of the 130 acres in three parcels from Charles Craft (Bergen Co. Deed V3:186). Included (according to the ad) were "four dwelling houses of different sizes, a barn, and other outbuildings, all nearly new and substantially built." After John White's death in 1848, the mill business was continued by his wife, Mabella, and son James. By this time, the White family owned at least two other mills situated on the Hohokus Brook (Van Valen 1900, p. 214).³

The White Paper Mill at New Prospect was destroyed by fire in 1857. James White then moved to Butler, NJ and opened a paper mill.⁴

Living with Mabella and her children at the time of the 1850 census were Jeremiah Collins, 25, paper maker, b. Ireland; and Cornelius Hart, 23, paper maker, b. England.

“Widow of John White” was listed as head of a household in the 1855 New Jersey State Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County. Her family group consisted of 6 males and 3 females (all b. U.S.) and 1 male of foreign birth (and included 2 males and 1 female between 5-16).

Mabella White, 60, was listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township (Godwinville P.O.), Bergen County, NJ (probably in or near what is today Waldwick). Listed with her were: Sarah White, 24; Mathew White, 21, Paper Maker; Elizabeth White, 19; Charles White, 16, Paper Maker; and Johnathan White, 13.

Matthew White and his brother Charles were active in the lumber business, the silk industry, and in bridge construction in Bergen County.⁴

In 1861 Matthew D. White bought the same three tracts from Maybella White that his father had bought from Charles Craft in 1837 (Bergen Co. Deed V5:129). In 1889, Matthew sold 36 acres to his brother Charles S. White (Bergen Co. Deed X12:595).³

At the time of the 1870 census, Matthew White was a paper twine manufacturer.

Matthew D. White, 40, merchant, and Ann White, 39, his wife, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ (probably in the area that became Waldwick Borough). Listed with them were their children: Lillian, 17; and Everet, 15.

Matthew D. White, 61, Saw Mill Owner, and his wife, Ann, 63, were listed in the 1900 Federal Census, living in Orvil Township (Waldwick), Bergen County, NJ in a house they owned. Listed with them was daughter Lillian, 37, single; and Lot-tie Myers, 20 (b. Feb 1880 PA), single, a servant.

Ann White, 73, widow, (mother of 6 children; 1 then living), and her daughter Lillian, 47, single, were listed in the 1910 Federal Census, living in Orvil Township, Bergen County, NJ in a house they owned.

Matthew White's will was recorded in Hackensack (Bergen County Will 36:258).³
