

-- WILLIAMS --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Military Service -- Entered Revolutionary War -- Aaron Williams enlisted as a private in Captain Nathan Strong's Co., 4th Batt'n New York Forces, commanded by Col. Henry B. Livingston December 10, 1776. During part of 1777 he was at a camp near Loudons ferry. September 1777 to January 1778 he was sick in the hospital. January 1778 to July 1778 he was left sick

at Fishkill. On August 6th 1778 Aaron was in (under) Provost Guard at Camp White Plains N.Y. The Camp White Plains Muster Roll dated September 4th, 1778, states Aaron Williams deserted on August 12th, 1778.

In the m. record, they are "Abraham Williams, j.m., and Hester Sie, j.d." (Probably her name, given as Hester, is a recording error.)

Abraham Williams served as a soldier in the Colonial service; his name appears on a muster roll of men raised and passed muster in Westchester Co., NY, for Joshua Bloomer, 30 April 1759, for service in the French War -- "Abraham Williams enlisted March 23; age 21; born in Phillipsburg; volunteer; out of Capt. Buckhout's Co. of Militia; Capt. Bloomer enlisting officer; 5 ft/ 7 in. high; light blue eyes."¹

Abraham Williams also served in the Revolutionary War, entering service as early as 1777.

After his death, his widow and family moved to South Salem, NY. Some time later she moved to Sandgate, VT.

6 Dec 1785 -- Sold to Mary Williams of the County of Westchester, widow, for £319 12s., All that certain farm of land situate, lying and being in the Manor of Phillipsburg and County of Westchester, bounded northerly and easterly by the highway, southerly by land now or late in the possession of Moses Miller, westerly by lands now in the possession of David See [Mary's father], Sarah Buckhout, the widow Van Wart, and Nicholas Storms, containing 142 acres more or less, as the same is now possessed by the said Mary Williams, forfeited to the people of the said State by the attainder of Frederick Philipse of the said County Esquire.

Aert Willemszen was said to have been from Barneveld, Gelderland; Weyntje Elberts was from Nieukercken, Zeeland.

Aert Willemszen may have been a brother of Bruyn Willemszen.

9 May 1639 (not. H. Schaef, 1332/45) Aert Willemsz from Garderbroek is engaged by Wouter van Twiller to manage his bouwerij on Manhattan called the "Commandeurs bouwerij" at 200 guilders per year.⁴

He was by 1640 living in the colony of Rennsylaerswyck, and by 1641 was foreman of the farm at Rensselaerswyck.²

He and his wife were members of the Dutch Church at New Amsterdam when the first roll of members was made in 1649. He was a small burgher in New Amsterdam, 18 April 1657.

Aert Willems and Wyntje Elberts, along with Aert Theunis and Tryntje Everts, witnessed the baptism, 20 May 1640 NYC Ref Ch, of Gerrit, son of Cosyn Gerrits (Van Putten) & Maeijken/Vrouwtie Everts.

17 Jan 1656 -- Govert Loockermans, pltf. v/s Aert Williamsen, deft. Pltf. says he hired to deft. his scow with grapnel line and appurtenances, and that in returning the scow he did not deliver the grapnel and rope that were attached. Requests that deft. be condemned to restore him grapnel and rope. Deft. answering orally and in writing acknowledges to have hired from the pltf. the scow and furniture, but says, the scow lying at anchor at the Beaver Path was taken one Sunday, during the sermon from the shore, by the crew of *The Shark* and when he, on the following Monday brought it back, he found the grapnel and rope missing. Maintains, therefore, that pltf. ought to ask the grapnel and rope from tje skipper of *The Shark* or her crew, and he is not bound to restore or make good for the same. Parties being heard, the Court order the deft. Aert Willemszen shall prove, on the next Court day his answer by witnesses.³

"Monday, Feb. 27, 1662. Weyntje Elbertsz, widow of Aert Willemsz, has settled two thousand guilders, afterward increased to two thousand two hundred guilders, on her children who are: Willem Aartzen, Annetje Aartzen, Elbert Aartzen and Evert Aartzen. Security: dwelling, mill and lot." "Thursday, March 2, 1662. ...Weyntje Elberts, widow of Aert Willemsz, gives notice of her intended marriage with Cornelis Aarsz, widower of Beletje Hendricx."¹

Anne, widow of John Richbell, in her will dated 1 April 1700, mentioned her granddaughter, Mary [Mott] Williams. Aert Williams was a member of a company of militia in Kings County in 1715 (Doc. Hist of NY, III, 115).²

On 29 March 1725 "Aert Williams and Mary, my wife" of Phillipsburgh sold a piece of land in the township of Rye, called Budd's Neck, to Godfrey Haines, for £18. They both signed by mark.²

In 1738, Aert Williams and Francis Van Dyck bought jointly, 1000 acres of land in Great Nine Partners (in the northeast corner of today's Dutchess Co.). In 1750 Aert Williams and Francis Van Dyck came to a division of these 1000 acres, by which agreement lot No. 3, containing 200 acres, called one of the "water" lots, as well as several other lots, fell to Aert Williams. In the year 1754 he conveyed part of this land to his son, Richbell Williams: I, Aert Williams of Phillipsburgh, Westchester county, for and in consideration for the natural love and affection which I have for the said Ridgebell Williams, and also for a consideration of £25, so give, grant, assign, etc. the southernmost part of lott three consinting 150 acors, and adjoining the land of Peter van Dyck, together with the house and barns building, improvements, etc. (signed) Aert Williams (his mark). (rec. Poughkeepsie, Lib. II: 439, 447)²

"Capt. Williams farm" taxed Feb 1753-June 1754 in Crum Elbow, Charlotte Precinct, Dutchess Co., NY.

When Colonel William Cosby arrived in August, 1732, to take office as Royal Governor of the Province of New York, he brought with him from England as his private secretary a young man of fine education, Charles Williams. Charles Williams was appointed by Governor Cosby, soon after their arrival, to the position of Naval Officer of the Port of New York. This important office he filled over forty years, until his death in 1773.

At the time of the Stamp Act excitement, 1765 and 1766, the discharge of his sworn duties made him very unpopular with the "Sons of Liberty." When it was learned from the "Sons of Liberty" in Philadelphia that clearance papers had been issued by the New York port officials on stamped paper, the New York members of the patriotic organization made a demonstration against Charles Williams and another official. They were about to wreck the Williams residence when they learned that it was owned by another party. Otherwise, Charles Williams was held in high esteem as an efficient officer, a respected citizen and a vestryman of Trinity Church.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Charles Williams, of New York, considering the uncertainty of life. My executors may sell the whole of my estate, and I leave the use of the proceeds to my wife, Sarah Elizabeth. From the rest, after the death of my wife, I leave to my son William the use of 1/8, and if he dies before his wife, she is to have £10 a year. I leave to my children, Elizabeth, Ann, Grace, Sarah, and David, each 1/8, and 1/8 to the children of my son Charles. I make my wife, Sarah Elizabeth, Frederick Philips, Esq., Gabriel W. Ludlow, and Abraham Walton, executors. Dated May 31, 1773. Witnesses, Roger Morris, Luke Babcock, Mary Morris. Proved, July 7, 1773.

David Williams recalled: "I was born in Tarrytown, then called Philips Manor, Westchester county, N.Y., October 21, 1754. I entered the army in 1775, at the age of 21, and was under General Montgomery at the siege of Fort St. John, and afterwards on board the flat-bottomed boats to carry provision. Served out my time which was six months, and enlisted again in the spring of 1776, and continued in the service by different enlistment's, as a New York militiaman until 1779, etc."

"In 1778, when in Captain Acker's company of New York militia, at Tarrytown, I asked his permission to take a walk in company with William Van Wart, a boy sixteen or seventeen years old and proceeded with him, to the cross-roads on Tompkins' ridge. We stood looking a few moments and saw five men coming, who had firearms; we jumped over a stone fence and concealed ourselves in a corner of it, and observed that they were armed with two muskets and three pistols. They came so near that we recognized two of them, viz.: Wm. Underhill and Wm. Mosher, who were Tories, and known to be of DeLancey's corps. When they came within proper distance, I said to my companion, 'Billy, neck or no joint!' I then said aloud, as if speaking to a number, with a view of intimidating them, 'Men make ready?' They stopped immediately. I then told them to ground their arms, which they did. I then said, 'March away,' and they did so. I then jumped over the fence, secured their arms, and made them march before us to our quarters. I continued in the service until a week or ten days before the year 1780. In December, 1779, Captain Daniel Williams, who was commander of our company, mounted us on horses, and he went to Morrisania, Westchester county. We swept all Morrisania clear, took probably \$5,000 worth of property, and returned to Tarrytown and quartered at Young's house. My feet being frozen, my uncle Martinus Van Wart, took me to his house. I told Captain Williams that the enemy would soon be at Young's, and that if he remained there he would be on his way to Morrisania before morning, but he paid no attention to my remarks--he did not believe me. In the course of the night a woman came to my uncle's crying, 'Uncle Martinus! Uncle Martinus!' The truth was, the British had surrounded Young's house, made prisoners of all the company except two, and burnt the barn."

"Having got well of my frozen feet, on the 3d of June, 1780, we were all driven from Tarrytown to the upper part of Westchester county, in the town of Salem. We belonged to no organized company at all, were under no command, and worked for our board or johnny-cake. Isaac Van Wart, who was a cousin of mine [the father of Williams and mother of Van Wart were brother and sister.] Nicholas Storms and myself went to on a visit. We carried our muskets with us, and on our way took a Quaker, who said he was going to New York after salt and other things. The Quaker was taken before the Ameri-

can authority and acquitted. In July or August a number of persons, of whom I was one, went on a visit to our friends in Tarrytown, and while on the way took ten head of cattle, which some refugees were driving to New York, and, on examination before the authority, the cattle were restored to their right owners, as they pleaded innocence, saying they were stolen from them. I then returned to Salem, and worked with a Mr. Benedict for my board, until the 22d of September. It was about one o' clock P M., as I was standing in the door with Mr. Benedict's daughter (who was afterward my wife,) when I saw six men coming. She remarked, ' They have got guns.' I jumped over a board fence and met them. ' Boys," said I, where are you going?' ' They answered ' we are going to Tarrytown.' I then said ' if you will wait until I get my gun I will go with you.' The names of the six persons were, Isaac Van Wart, John Paulding, William Williams, John Yerks and James Romer, the name of the sixth I have forgotten. We proceeded about fifteen miles that night, and slept in a hay barrack. In the morning we crossed Buttermilk hill, when John Paulding proposed to go to Isaac Reed's and get a pack of cards to divert ourselves with. After procuring them we went out to Davis' hill, where we separated, leaving four on the hill and three, viz.: Van Wart, Paulding and myself, proceeded on the Tarrytown road about one mile and concealed ourselves in the bushes on the west side of the road, and commenced playing cards three handed, that is, each one for himself. We had not been playing more than an hour, when we heard a horse galloping across a bridge but a few yards from us. Which of us spoke I do not remember, but one of us said, ' there comes a trader going to New York.' We stepped out from our concealment and stopped him. ' My lads, ' said he, ' I hope you belong to our party.' We asked him what party?' ' he replied, ' the lower party.' We told him we did. He then said ' I am a British officer, have been up the country on particular business, and would not wish to be detained a minute,' and as a token to convince us he was a gentleman, he pulled out and showed us his gold watch; we then told him we were Americans. ' God bless my soul,' said he, ' a man must do any thing these times to get along,' and then showed us Arnold's pass. We told him it would not satisfy us without searching him. ' My lads,' said he, ' you will bring yourselves into trouble.' We answered, ' we did not fear it,' and conducted him about seventy rods into the woods. My comrades appointed me to search him; commencing with his hat, I searched his person effectually, but found nothing until I pulled off his boot, when we discovered that something was concealed in his stocking. Paulding caught hold of his foot and exclaimed, ' by G--d, here it is! ' I pulled off his stocking, and inside of it, next to the sole of his foot, found three half sheets of paper enclosed in another half sheet which was endorsed ' West Point' ; and pulling off the other boot and stocking, I found three like papers, enclosed and endorsed as the others. On reading them, one of my companions said, ' by G--d, he is a spy! ' We then asked him where he got those papers? he told us, of a man at Pine's bridge,' but he said he ' did not know his name.' He offered us his gold watch, his horse, saddle, bridle and 100 guineas, if we would let him go; we told him ' no, unless he would inform us where he got the papers.' He answered us as before, but increased his offer to 1,000 guineas, his horse, etc.: we told him again we would not let him go; he then said, ' gentlemen, I will give you 10,000 guineas' [nearly \$50,000] ' and as many dry goods as you will ask; conceal me in any place of safety while you can send to New York with an order to Sir Henry Clinton from me, and the goods and money will be procured so that you can get them unmolested.' [Paulding then told him, as he stated on the trial of Joshua H. Smith, a few days after the arrest] : ' No, by G--d, if you would give us 10,000 guineas you should not stir a step; we are Americans, and above corruption, and go with us you must.' We then took him, about twelve miles, to Col. Jamieson's quarters at North Castle."¹

He had a farm and homestead at Livingstonville, Schoharie Co., NY.

Of the monies so arising after my debts are paid, two thirds thereof to my son states Morris Williams and to such other child or children as I may hereafter have, divided between them as they come of age in such proportion, that each girl's (if any there be) share be a third less than a boy's, all boys to share equally. My executors to place at interest the money so given to my children, to be careful in collecting it yearly and thereout to maintain and educate them, and if they chuse to put them to trades, and if the interest be more than sufficient to add the overplus to the principal; my executors to place the remaining third of the money on landed security, to collect it annually and pay it to my wife till her death or marriage and no longer, after this the money I give to my son states Morris Williams and such child or children as I may hereafter have divided as I have herein before directed; if my son and such other children as I may have all die in the lifetime of my mother and wife then the interest of the said money I leave to them and the survivor of them for life, and after their deaths £200 of the said money to Isreal Hunt, the son of Elven Hunt, deceased, or if he be dead to his children if any then be alive; Also £50 thereof to Daniel Williams, son of my uncle, Daniel Williams, if alive and to his children if he shall leave any then alive; Also £100 of said money to Gilbert Vincent, son of Lewis Vincent, if alive and to his children if he leave any then alive; Also £50 thereof to John Williams, son of my said uncle Daniel, if alive and to his children if then alive; Also £50 thereof to Elizabeth Williams, daughter of my neighbor and cousin, John Williams; Also £50 thereof to Isreal Honeywell, Jr., and his executors; Also £25 thereof to John Oakley; Also £25 to Stephen Oakley; all the residue of the said money and of my estate I give, on the contingency aforesaid, in manner following, viz.: one sixth to William Honeywell, one sixth to Philip Honeywell, one sixth to Thadeus Avery, one sixth to Alpheus Avery, one sixth to all such children of my uncle, John Vincent, deceased, as shall then be alive, and the remaining sixth to Vincent Fowler. I nominate Israel Honeywell, Jr., John Oakley and Lewis Vincent, executors. Dated 1774 (month and day blank). Witnesses, Morgan Lewis, of New York City, attorney at law; William S. Smith, Alsop Hunt. Proved, New York, September 27, 1784. Administration granted to Isreal Honeywell, Jr., September 28, 1784.

Hendrick Willemse, who signed the petition of the Lutherans in New Amsterdam. 1657, requesting that Rev Goetwater might remain in the city as Lutheran preacher, probably was a German. He is mentioned as early as 1648. He owned a house at the N.W. corner of the present Bridge and Broad Street. He was a baker, and was appointed overseer of streets. About 1670 we find him in Albany. In 1671 he and other Lutherans signed a petition complaining of their minister.

In his will, he wrote: Henrick Williamsen, baker, living at Boswyck, in Kings County, upon Long Island, Considering the Certainty of Death, and not willing to depart out of this World before he shall have disposed of his temporal estate. He appoints for his lawful heirs his 3 daughters, procured by Sametie Joostern, his wife, deceased, viz.: Geesie, Lemertie, and Grietie. And by death of one of them, their third to succeed to the others. He gives to his daughter Geesie, widow of Dirck Van Clyf, the third part of all his ground lying and being at New York, next to the house of Otto Gerritse, the corner side to hooke (corner) of the Heere Graft, with all the buildings. He leaves to his daughter Lemertie, last widow of Claas Kock, 1/3 of said land next to the ground above, with the buildings. To his daughter Grietie, wife of John Robberson, 1/3 of said ground next the ground of Peter Janse Messier, with buildings. To each a like breadth and length. And his daughter Geesie shall pay to his daughter Grietie £20. All the rest of estate to his 3 daughters. Dated April 5, 1692. Witnesses, S. Vanderwater. (Names of other witnesses illegible.) [NOTE.--The daughter Geesie inherited from her husband, Dirk Van der Cliff, the farm so well known as the Van Cliff farm, which ran from Maiden Lane to John Street, and Cliff Street, named from him, was laid out through it. The lot on Broad Street was 66 feet wide on Broad Street, and was bounded south by Beaver Street.--W. S. P.]

Jabez Williams owned a shipyard in Williamsburg, Brooklyn, NY.

"Dirck Volkertse [the Norman], whose business was that of a ship carpenter, lived on the northerly side of Bushwick creek, near the East river, in an old stone house, which was demolished some years since, and on the site, Messrs. Samuel Sneed and Jabez William built large and fine dwellings."¹

Jabez Williams, Shipcarp., was listed in the 1820 Mercein's City Directory, New York Register and Almanac (p. 439).

Jabez Williams, Shipwright, was listed in the 1835 Longworth's American Almanac, New York Register, and City Directory (p. 739).

Jabez Williams, Shipbuilding, was listed in Doggett's New York City Directory for 1849-1850(p. 455).

They were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, New York, Kings Co., 2nd District, 17th War, Green Point P.O., p. 17, stamped p. 925, Ancestry image 125, Dwelling 39, Family 152 -- Gabiz Williams, 70, Shipbuilder, value real estate 20,000., value personal estr estate 20,000, b. CT; Ann ----, 60, b. NY; Saml. ----, 30, Carpenter, value personal estate 2,000., b. NY; Cornelia ----, 29, b. NY; Sidney ----, 25, Lawyer, b. NY.

"Larger clippers slid down the ways in the New York yards. The 1300-ton Eclipse was launched at Jabez Williams' yard in Williamsburg for T. Wardle & Co., of New York."⁷

"On January 19th, the Simoon, an extreme clipper of 1436 tons, launched from the shipyard of Jabez Williams on December 4, 1852, sailed on her maiden voyage around the Horn. She was followed three days later by the Typhoon and it was a very close race between these two all the way to the Golden Gate. The Simoon had a 132-day passage, and the Typhoon, 133 days."⁸

"The "South Carolina" was a 1301 ton wooden screw steamer built in 1851 by Jabez Williams of New York for the Atlantic Steam Navigation Co. Her dimensions were 202.5ft x 38ft. and she had a clipper stem, one funnel and three masts, service speed 9 knots. She sailed from Charleston SC for Liverpool but went aground on the Charlestown Bar and had to put in to New York for repairs to her propeller. She eventually sailed for Liverpool and returned to NY on 23.11.1852 with 72 passengers. Her engines were removed in 1853 and she spent the rest of her life as a sailing vessel. Very little seems to be known of her after this date but in 1874 she was owned by J. Alexander of Liverpool."⁹

Among the shipyards in Greenpoint, Brooklyn, NY, was that of "honest old Jabez Williams," who transferred his yard about 1866 from the foot of Montgomery street, New York, to Green Point. He was later succeeded by his son Edward F. Williams, who after the organization of the Green Point Savings Bank, became its second president.¹

In 1795 he and his wife Margaret, sold land in Clinton town to John Clapp, and just previous to that, in 1793, they were living in Clinton, but sold land in Poughkeepsie to Francis Pell, of Poughkeepsie (Richbell Williams signed by mark, but Margaret signed her name "Marget William". On 17 April 1805, Richbell Williams and his wife sold another tract of land in Poughkeepsie, but by this time his wife's name in Mary.¹

In his will, written in 1802, probated 18 Feb 1814 Dutchess Co., NY (Liber D:461), he wrote: I, Richbell Williams of the Town of Clinton in Dutchess County & State of New York being of sound mind & memory, do make, ordain, publish & declare this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following, viz. First: I do nominate, constitute & appoint my and and my friend Executors to this my Last Will & Testament. Secondly: I do will & order that all my estate both real and personal be sold by my executors at public or private sale as they shall judge most advantageous, for which purpose I do give & devise all my estate both real & personal to my executors aforesaid & authorize & empower them to sell the same & to execute a good & lawful deed or deeds of conveyance to a purchaser or purchasers as I myself have a right to do. Thirdly: I do will & order that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid by my executors aforesaid & that the residue of the monies arising from my aforesaid estate be disposed of & paid in the proportion & to my heirs as I herein shall direct, that is to say, First the one tenth part thereof to my grandchildren, the children of my daughter Margaret, deceased, who was the wife of Samuel Mott, & if any of them shall die who are now living, then such share to be paid to their child or children, if they have lawful issue, & if they have no lawful issue then such share to be paid to my surviving grandchildren aforesaid share & share alike & to their heirs respectively. Secondly I do will & order that my executors aforesaid pay of the aforesaid residue, the one tenth part thereof, to each of my children or their heirs respectively, namely; to my sons and (who I have appointed executors) and Jacob Williams (who now resides in Nova Scotia) and to my daughters Saley the wife of Daniel Smith, Annatji the wife of Jacob Mott, Helena Williams, & Catalyntji the wife of William Lyon. And whereas I have paid the sum of seventy five dollars for Moses Williams the husband of my daughter Mary, & the sum of One hundred & twenty five dollars for James Scheiver who was the husband of my daughter Elizabeth, & in order justice may be done in the premises Therefore I do will & order that my executors aforesaid pay unto my daughter Mary who is the wife of Moses Williams, the one tenth part of residue of the monies aforesaid after deducting therefrom the sum of seventy five dollars or to her heirs respectively, & also the one tenth part of the aforesaid residue to my daughter Elizabeth who is the widow of James Scheiver (& now residing in Upper Canada) or to her heirs respectively after deducting therefrom the sum of one hundred & twenty five dollars. And whereas my son James Williams, & my daughter Helena Williams have rendered me more services than my other children have done, for which it is just they should be compensated. Therefore I do will & order my executors aforesaid to pay the two last mentioned sums to be deducted as aforesaid amounting together to two hundred dollars to my son James Williams aforesaid one hundred dollars or to his heirs respectively & the remaining one hundred dollars to my daughter Helena Williams aforesaid or to her heirs respectively. In Witness Whereof I the aforesaid Richbell Williams have to this my last Will & Testament set my hand & seal this 8th day of February on the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two, Richbell Williams (his mark), Witnesses: Jesse Tracy, Nelly DeWitt, Andrew DeWitt.¹

On 13 Feb 1666 a patent for land on the northeast of Hempstead, had been granted to Robert Williams of Oyster Bay to confirm his Indian purchase many years before (1653) under the Dutch. (Oyster Bay Rec. I;626)¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I Robert Williams of Long Island near Oyster Bay, now being sick." Leaves to his wife Sarah, "all my Plantation, with orchards, pastures and what wood land she may make use of, during her life, if she keepe herself a widow." Leaves to son John Williams 100 acres of land, more than I have given him already. To my grand son, Robert Williams, 40 acres of land in some convenient place. "If my daughters marry and they want land, if their husbands will come and dwell upon mine, they shall goe to my overseers, and they shall give them land to live on, for them and their heirs." "If any of my sons or daughters doth walk disorderly, according to the truth; they shall have no part or parcel in this my will." Makes his wife Sarah, and Samuel Spicer and John Bowne overseers. Leaves to his son Hope Williams, 100 acres of land, which he hath already. Dated December 2, 1680. Witnesses, John Winter, Richard Kempton, R. Hawes. Letters of administration on estate of Robert Williams of Oyster Bay, granted to Samuel Spicer and John Bowne, August 5, 1682. Charles, Absolute Lord and Proprietor of the Province of Maryland and Avalom, Lord Baron of Baltimore, etc. To all to whom these presents shall come, Know yee, that searching the records of Our Court of Probate, kept at St. Mary's before our dear Uncle Philip Calvert, Esq., our Judge, etc., for the Probate of wills; the last will and testament of Robert Williams of Long Island was Proved, April 23, 1682.

In her will, dated 14 12th mo, 1692/3, probated 19 May 1693 (Liber A, p. 82 Jamaica, Queens Co., NY), Sarah Williams, relict of Robert Williams, of "Lusam, alias Jerico", mentioned youngest dau. Hester, widow of -?- Cork (Cock?); oldest son John Williams; 4 daus. Sara, wife of --- Champian, Patience, wife of Samuel Barnes; Mary, wife of ---- Dole; Phebe, wife of John Townsend; youngest son Hope Williams; grandau. Hannah Simons (Seamans?); some debts due to Robert Williams in the province of Maryland; overseers, son-in-law John Townsend and "my friends" Thomas Pwell and John Dusenbury. Wit: Martha Titus, Mary Miller and Richard Willetts.²

Some time between 1711 and 1714 his step-son Francie Beselie settled on a leasehold just north of his.¹

After all debts are paid, I leave to my daughter Luckresea [Lucretia], wife of John Linnington, my negro girl "Dejaan," which she has in possession; Also a bed and furniture, "and a Pewter Tankard, and six pewter plates, to be bought and paid for out of my estate." I leave to my wife Heyltie the use of my dwelling house and barn and lands, and the use of all personal estate for her support and bringing up of my children during her widowhood. If she marries again, she is to have £51. I leave to my sons, Jeremias and William, £150 each and a horse when they are of age. After the death or marriage of my wife, I leave to my sons, Nicholas and John, all my dwelling house and lands and the rest of my personal estate. But my son Nicholas is to have £5 for his birthright, and they are to have charge of the legacies left to the rest. I also charge my sons, Nicholas and John, to bring up and educate my other children until my sons are of age and my daughters are thirty years old or married, And they are to pay the legacies and £101 to my daughters when of age. If either of the sons die, his share is to go to the survivor. If my slaves prove stubborn or disobedient to my wife, my executors are to sell them and buy others in their room. I make my sons, Nicholas and John, and my brother, Rem Willemse, and Johanes Lott, Jr., executors. Dated January 10, 1766. Witnesses, Derrick Remsen, Jacob Snedeker, Cornelius Van Cleaf. Thomas Williams (1631-17?) was born in England in 1631. He settled first in Harlem, then moved to Westchester County, where he served as a magistrate and militia captain. At age 58 he was elected in June 1689 along with Richard Panton as Westchester's representative to the provincial Committee of Safety. He served on the committee until December 1689. He received a commission from Leisler on Dec. 14, 1689. After the fall of Leisler, Williams was engaged in several suits in Westchester County over his participation in the rebellion. These can be followed in Dixon Ryan Fox, ed., *The Minutes of the Court of Sessions (1657-1696) Westchester Co. (White Plains, N.Y. 1924)*, 75, 76, 78, 79, 85. Williams married Martha Richardson, widow of John Richardson.²

17 Oct 1687 (Westchester C. Land Records, Liber A, p. 204) -- Joseph Hadley of Yonkers Patent, and Hittabel his wife, to Capt. Thomas Williams of West Farms, a parcel of land which was formerly given by will of John Richardson, dec'd., to Mary, the late wife of Joseph Hadley, who is deceased.³
