The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Albert Wilson of Franklin Twp., Bergen Co., NJ; Pvt., NJ Militia and Sgt., NY Continental Line; Revolutionary War Pension No. S3566. Bergen Co., NJ Common Pleas Court, 31 Oct 1832, Albert Wilson, age 77, b. 14 Feb 1755 at Woodbridge, NJ (*Union Co;NJ?). Enlisted at NYC in 1775. "I was the very man who shot and wounded John Berry, the Ruffugee Regular (*American Loyalist in the British Army?), who was advertized as an outlaw and murderer."

Others mentioned in pension, all as fellow soldiers in the Revolution and all of Bergen Co., NJ: Abraham Brower (*Brewer?), age 69, John Packer, age 71, both as of Oct 1832; Peter Tice, age 69, Abraham Garrison, age 71, Rynhart Hopper, age 79, all as of Jul 1833. Rockland Co., NY Common Pleas Court, 10 Aug 1830, Andries Onderdonk states he saw Albert Wilson enlist at Haverstraw, Orange Co., NY. Albert Wilson mentions while he was stationed at NYC on 25 Aug 1775 a man in his company, named Samuel Dean, was wounded from fire by a British Man of War.

He served in the Revolution with John Packer, and testified for him in his Revolutionary War pension application (John Packer, Revolutionary War Pension No. S3635. Bergen Co NJ Common Pleas Court, 31 Oct 1821 [or 1832?]). He was described as Albert Wilson, of Franklin Twp., 78 years old as of 20 Oct 1832.

On 10 June 1787 John and Elizabeth Ackerman of Franklin Township, conveyed to Albert Wilson of the same place, for £270, 3 acres...corner to Cornelius Bogart and David Ackerman. Signed by John G. Ackerman, Elizabeth Ackerman (her mark). Witnessed by John Garretson and John Van Houten.¹

He was possibly the Albert Wilson whose land formed a boundary in the following transactions: 4 Feb 1803 (recorded 14 Oct 1803, Bergen Co. R:45), William M. Bell and Rachel, his wife, of the County of Bergen, to John Van Blarcom of Bergen County for \$652.50 a parcel in the Township of Franklin, beginning at side of public road east of mills of Abraham Hopper, being in northeast corner of a lot of Albert Wilson. 43-1/2 acres. Signed W. M. Bell, Rachel Bell.²

On 1 February 1804 (recorded 2 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:309) Robert Fredericks of the City of New York, conveyed to Weart Valentine of the same place, cartman, Trustee of Elizabeth Fredericks, wife of said Robert, in consideration of Articles of Separation) 23-78/100 acres in New Jersey, beginning SW corner of Morris Sharp on E bounds of Peter Demarest; mentioned land of Conrad Knact; S side of Hohaukus Brook; land of Albert Van Dien. Bounded W by Peter Demarest; S by Conrad Knact and Albert Wilson; N by Morris Sharp. Signed by Robt. Fredericks, Weart Valentine (his mark). Witnessed by James Pike, Jno. B. Fish.²

Bell and Rachel, his wife, of the County of Bergen, to John Van Blarcom of Bergen County for \$652.50 a parcel in the Township of Franklin, beginning at side of public road east of mills of Abraham Hopper, being in northeast corner of a lot of Albert Wilson. 43-1/2 acres. Signed W. M. Bell, Rachel Bell.²

He was possibly the Albert Wilson of the following transaction:

On 22 February 1806 (recorded 25 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:247) Cornelius Smith and Mary, his wife, of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to Albert Wilson of the same place, for \$262.50, 11-20/100 acres in the Township of Franklin at a place called Paramus, beginning at clear land formerly the property of Samuel Bush, on the line of Hopper. Signed by Cornelius Smith, Mary Smith. Witnessed by Abraham Westervelt, Abraham A. Quackenbush.²

They moved to Shelby County, Ohio in March 1838. They lived in Ohio ten years. On February 6, 1848, they moved to Kendall County, Illinois, where they spent the remainder of their days on the old Home farm on the Ottawa Road, two and one half miles east of Plattville.

Peter Wilson was principal of the Hackensack Academy for several years before the Revolution. He was elected to the Legislature 1777-1781 and again in 1787 and revised the laws of New Jersey in 1783. He was Professor of Greek and Latin

at Columbia College 1789-1792 and again 1797-1820.

He was a staunch supporter of the rebel cause and was imprisoned in his house in Hackensack by the British forces for a time during the Revolution.

His tombstone reads "Peter Wilson L.L.D. borth Leith, Scotland, emigrated to America 1763."

On 3 November 1775, Hendericus Kuyper and James Board, Commissioners of Bergen County, conveyed to Peter Wilson of New Barbadoes Precinct, for £3367, 1000 acres of land seized from John Marselius, late of Hackensack Township. Signed by Henericus Kuyper, James Biard. Witnessed by D. Romine, Garret Lydecker.¹

On 9 October 1784, Hendrick and Annatye Brinkerhof, of Hackensack Precinct, conveyed to Peter Wilson of New Barbadoes Precinct, for £133, 19 acres adjoining Joris Brinkerhof; mentioned line of Richard Day, Nicose Brinkerhof and heirs of Jacob Brinkerhof. Signed by Hendrick Brinkerhof, Johannah Brinkerhof (her mark). Witnessed by Joris Brinkerhof, Henry Banta.¹

On 9 April 1785, Jacobus and Abby Brinkerhof, Hendrick and Johanna Brinkerhof, and Nicolie and Elizabeth Brinkerhof, all of Hackensack Precinct, and Joris and Lena Brinkerhof, of New Barbadoes Precinct, conveyed to Peter Wilson of New Barbadoes Precinct, for £52.5, 5 acres; mentioned line of Seba Brinkerhof and heirs of Jacob Brinkerhof. Signed by Joris Brinkerhof, Mardalena Brinkerhof, Nicose Brinkerhof, Elizabeth Brinkerhof (her mark), Jacobus Brinkerhof, Abby Brinkerhof (her mark), Henry Brinkerhof, Johannah Brinkerhof (her mark). Witnessed by Adam Boyd, Hendrick Van Giesen, Albert C. Zabriskie, John C. Zabriskie.¹

On 16 May 1805 (recorded 16 June 1805, Bergen Co. V:135) Peter Wilson, Professor of Languages in Columbia College in the City of New York, and Catherine, conveyed to Richard J. Cooper of the Township of New Barbadoes, for £42, 10 shillings, 100 acres more or less being an equal moiety or undivided half of a certain tenth part in Bergen County about two miles easterly or southeasterly from the Paramus Church and generally known by the name of the plantation or farm of Samuel Helm, deceased, forfeited to the State of New Jersey and sold by Cornelius Haring Esq., late agent of Forfeited Estates in Bergen County, by virtue of Inquisition found against the said Cornelius Helm for joining the Army of the King of Great Britain. Signed by Peter Wilson, Catherine Wilson. Witnessed by Benj. Blackledge, Hugh Johnston.²
